Alumni Spotlight – Lee Huggins

Lee Huggins is a 1986 Georgia Southern business graduate. He earned a BBA in management information systems (MIS). Today, Lee serves as the senior vice president for Total Software Solutions (TSS), a leading global provider of operational and business support systems (OSS/BSS) in wireless communications. With more than 300 implementations in 2G, 3G, and 4G wireless communications, TSS has been recognized as a distinguished services provider offering both licensed and managed services solutions. Previously, Lee held a number of key leadership positions at VeriSign including vice president engineering, vice president products, and, ultimately, as senior vice president and general manager. Lee played a key role in VeriSign's expansion to becoming a global leading provider of internet services, content, communications, and commerce (IC3). Prior to joining VeriSign, Lee served in leadership roles at HO Systems. HO Systems, acquired by VeriSign in 2001, was a pioneer in the wireless industry developing the first UNIX-based OSS/BSS systems for wireless operators. Lee holds several patents in the wireless industry and is also the founder of SAVHTECH. Lee and his wife, Liz, are both



Georgia Southern graduates and share a passion for the University's continued success. Their two children, Garrison and Elizabeth, currently attend Georgia Southern.
