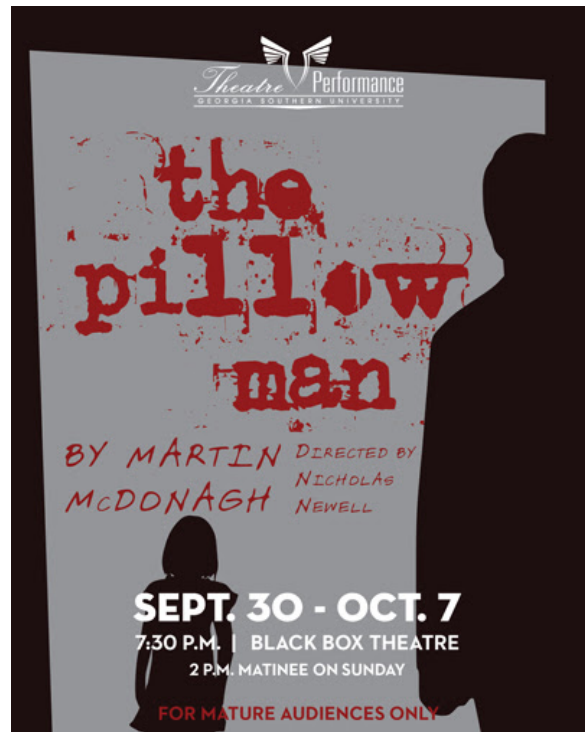
## Theatre & Performance opens season with award-winning drama, 'The Pillowman'

gruesome content of his short stories and their similarities to a series of child murders. The result is an urgent work of theatrical bravura and an unflinching examination of the very nature and purpose of art.
