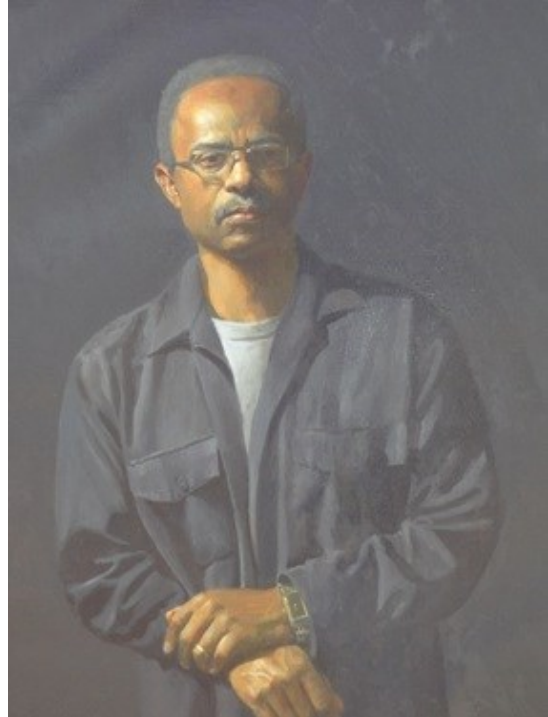

Jody Langdon wins Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Award

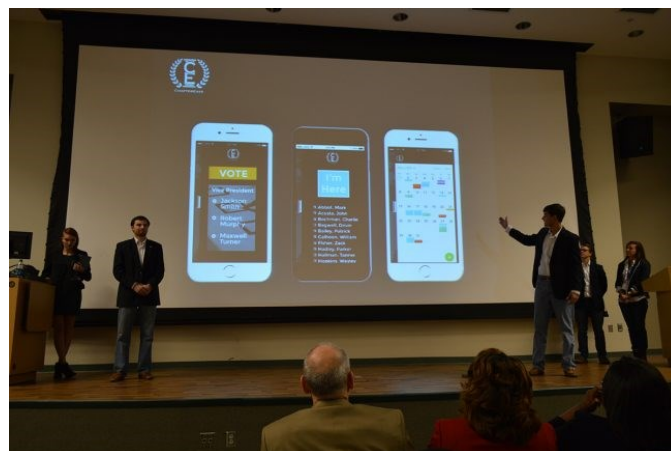
