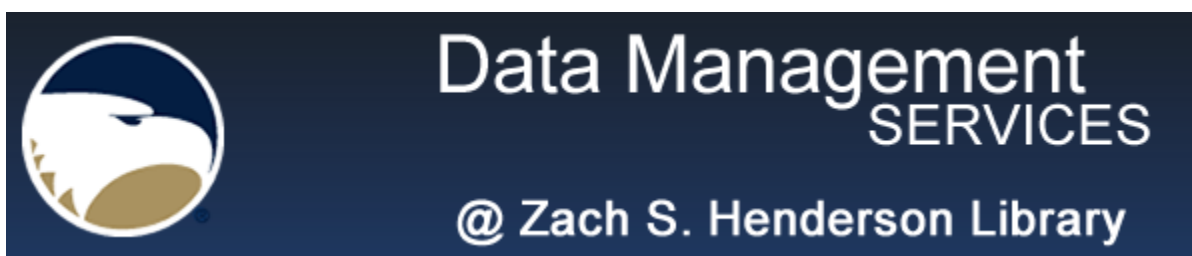

Our world has experienced rapid shifts in the industrial structure within recent decades, including industrial composition and spatial distribution. Those changes will have significant impacts on global development and reshape the future global landscape, in terms of population, economy, politics, culture, and environment.
