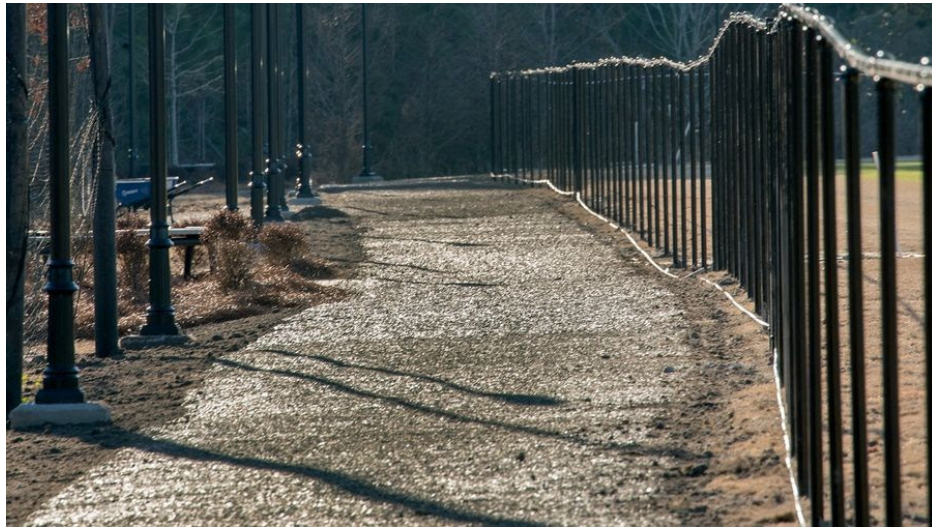

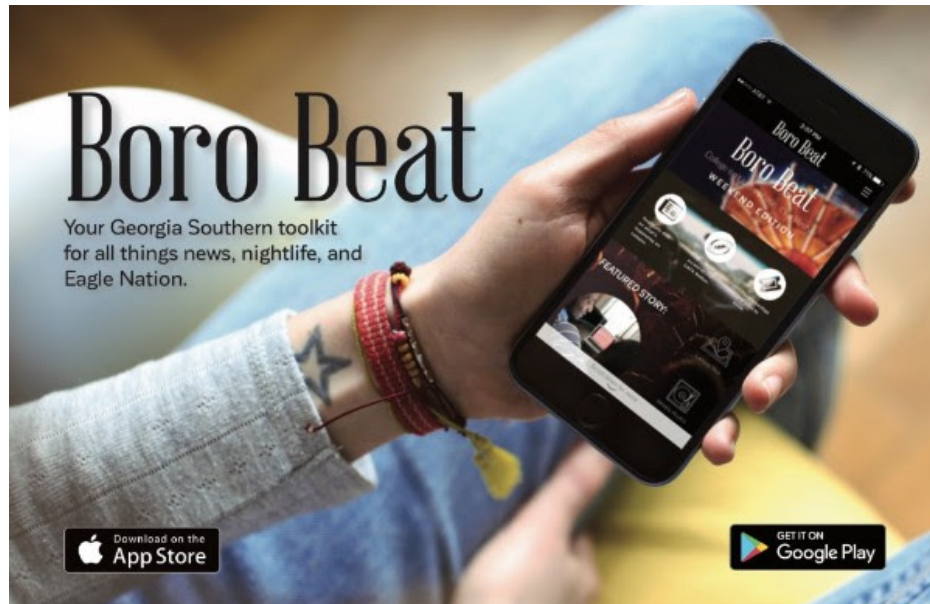
GS to honor Basketball Hall of Famer and Alumnus Fran Florian
