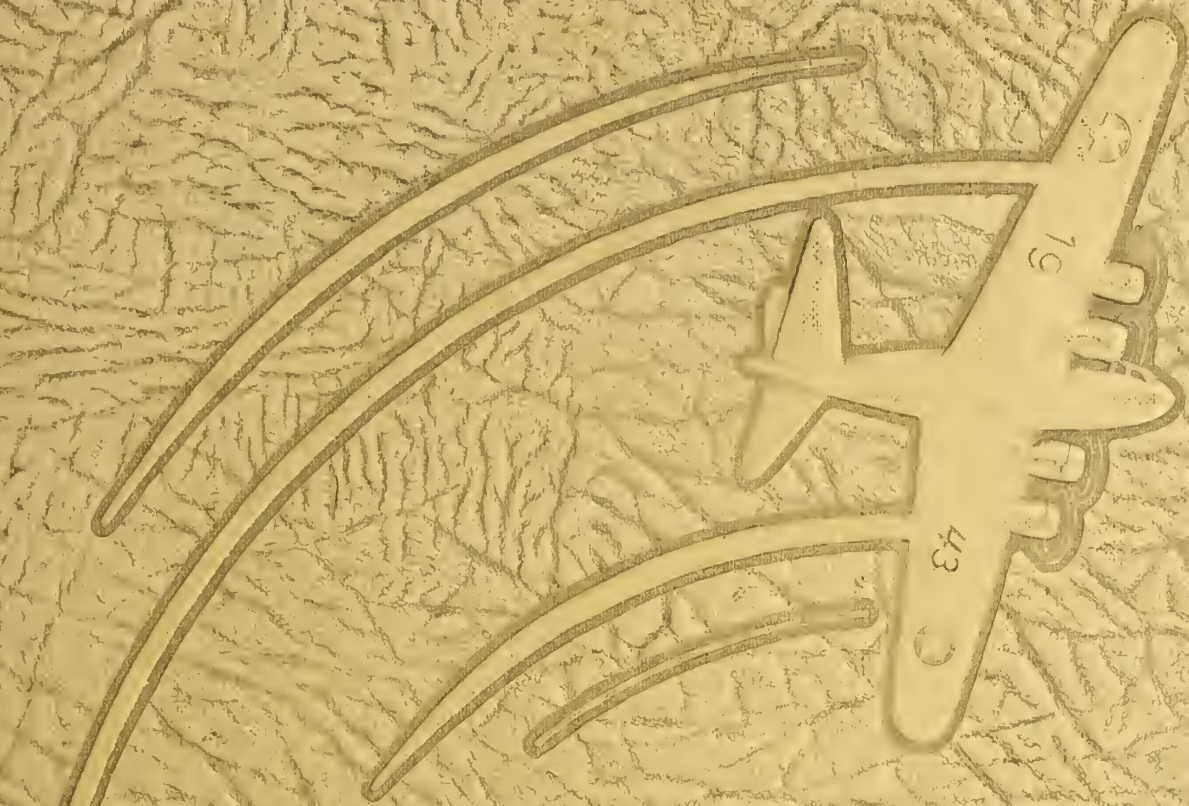

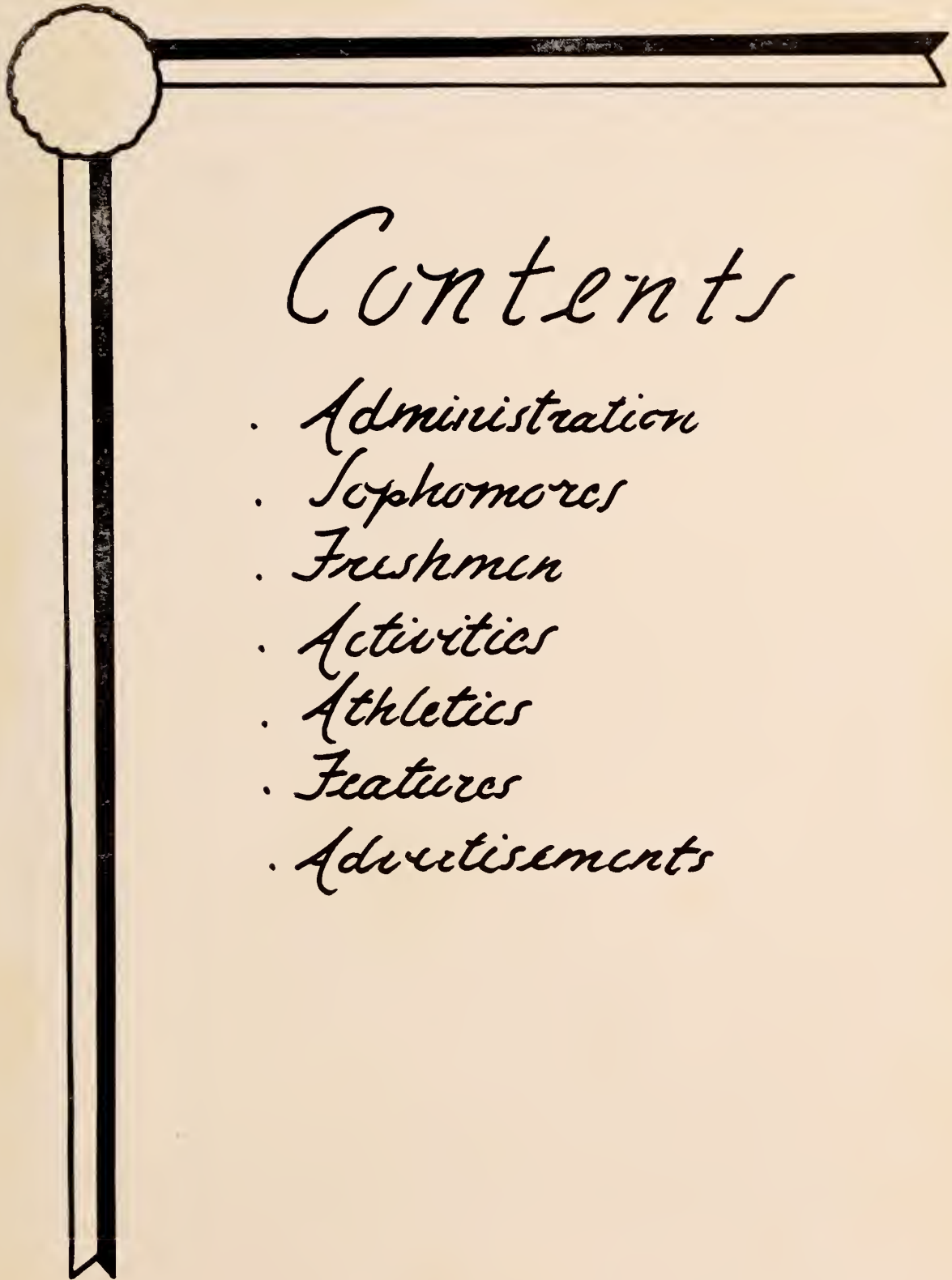
Dedication

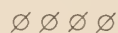
The sophomores of this staff sincerely hope that the business staffs of the future will keep up the good name that has been created for the Inkwell in the line of advertising.

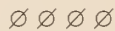

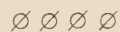

The sponsor for the sorority is Mrs. LeRoy N. Suddath.

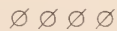

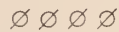

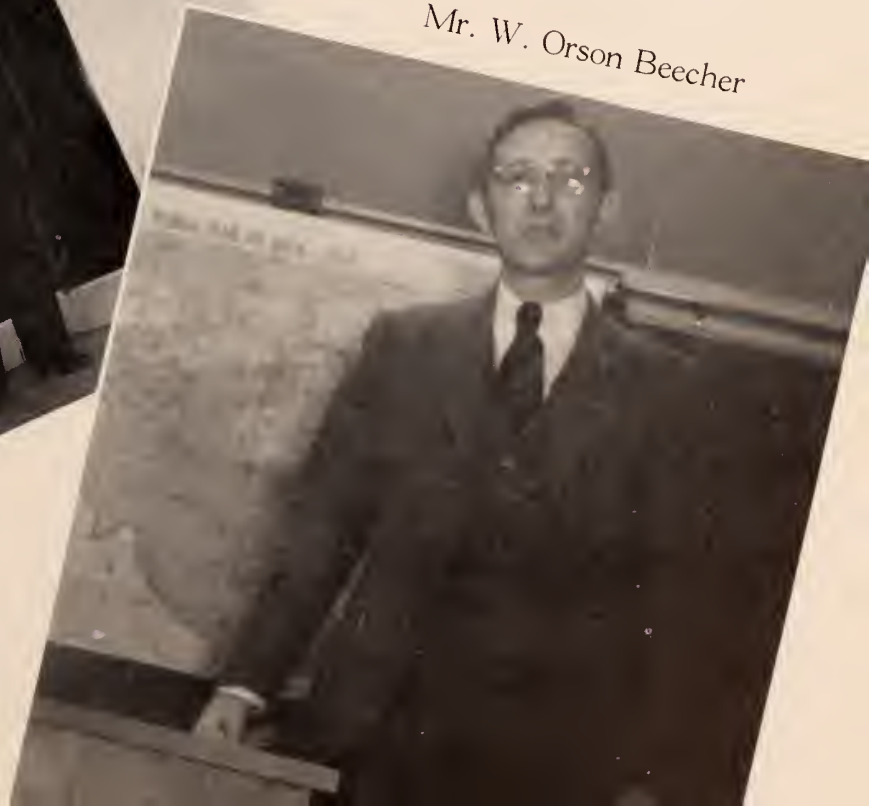
