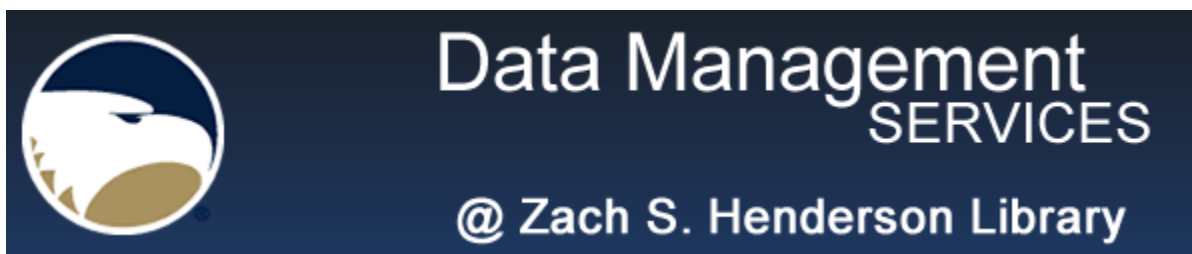

According to the NIH, data sharing is essential for expedited translation of research results into knowledge, products, and procedures to improve human health. Investigators applying to the NIH for \$500,000 or more of direct research costs in any single year are expected to include a plan for sharing their final research data, or state why sharing is not possible.
