Antioch Missionary Baptist Church

History

Rev. Inman E. Bryant and Rev. M. Kemp organized the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church on September 10, 1863, during the time of slavery and the Civil War. Through the talk of Deacon Mikell this church was organized under a Bush Arbor, near the place of the present well. The first baptized members were, Bro. Channie Jones, Sis. Jane Hendley, Bro. Frank Anderson and Bro. Siller Groover. The first deacon was Dea. Warren Jones, Sr. The first building was a Log Cabin built in the field across in the front of the present church; at that time, it was called the Aborn Nicholls Place.

The first pastor called was Rev. J.E. Holmes who served 16 years. The second pastor called was Rev. Inman Bryant who served three years. The third pastor was Rev. A.J. Grant; the fourth pastor was Rev. I Bryant; the fifth pastor was Rev. James M. Jones; the sixth pastor was Rev. Bryant; the seventh pastor was Rev. L.L. Rainey; and the eighth pastor was Rev. Tom Lonon who served 21 years. The ninth pastor was Rev. J.W.H. Thomas, Sr. who served 10 years. The tenth pastor was Rev. William Daniel who served 17 years. The eleventh pastor was Rev. A.L. Thomas who served for 37 years. The twelfth pastor was Rev. Larry W. Scarboro. The thirteenth pastor was Rev. Cecil Dunlap. In 2000, Rev. Richard Lawrence was elected as 14th pastor of Antioch Missionary Baptist Church.

There are 561 known graves in Antioch Cemetery – 198 are unmarked.

Hodges and Mullin Cemeteries, both associated with the Banks Creek Primitive Baptist Church, will be toured on September 14, 2019
