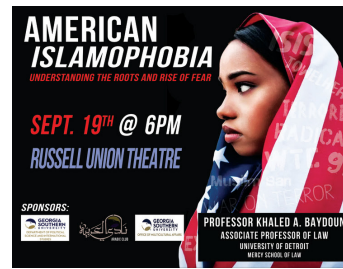


### **Wednesday, Sept. 19** **American Islamophobia: Understanding the roots and rise of fear**
