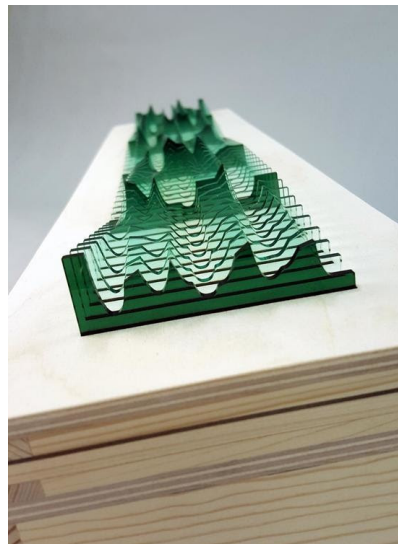

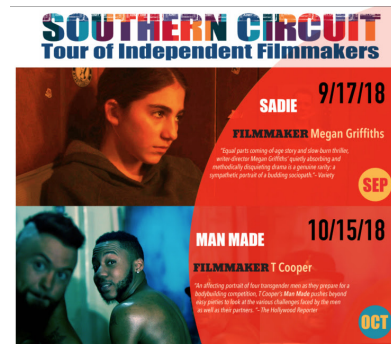
The South Arts Southern Circuit Tour of Independent Filmmakers

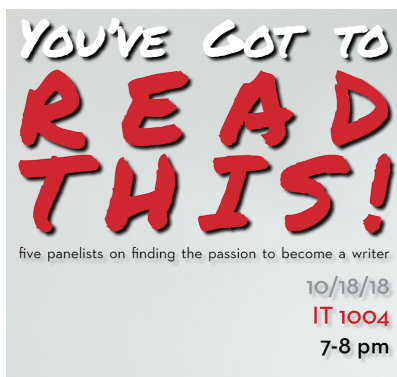

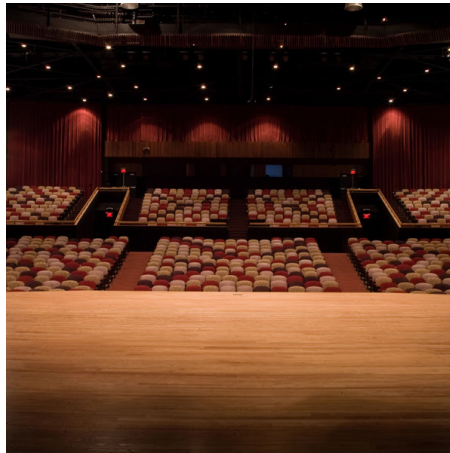

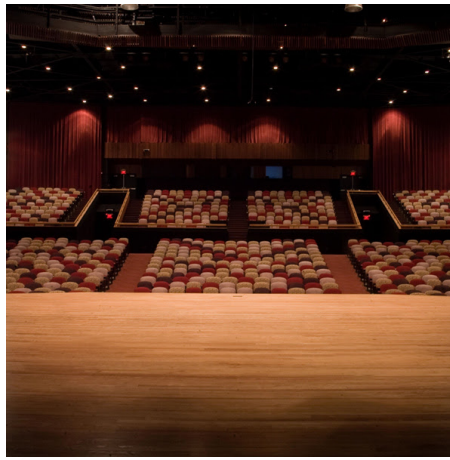
audiences the total spectrum of today's musical literature.
