viewer's attention away from the distractions of society by challenging their understanding of space and depth.

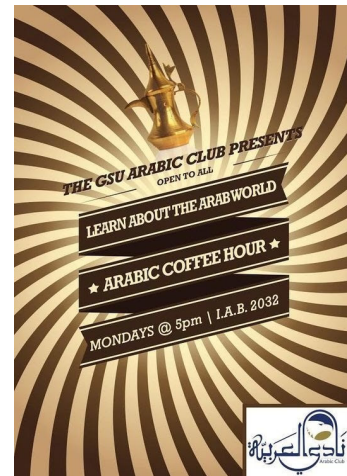

The sale is located at the Roxie Remley Center for Fine Art (29 East Vine Street) in Downtown Statesboro.

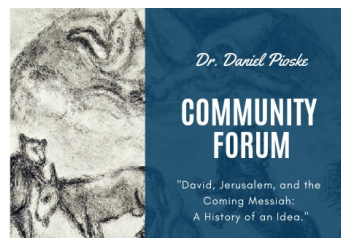
