- Dec. 31, 2020 and Jan. 1, 2021 -- closed
- Jan. 2, 2021 -- open, 8-10 a.m.

Savannah/Chatham County (at the Savannah Civic Center, 301 West Oglethorpe Ave.)

- Dec. 21 23, 2020 -- open, 8:30 am-3:30 p.m.
- Dec. 24 27 -- closed
- Dec. 28 31, 2020 -- open, 8:30 am 3:30 p.m.
- Jan. 1, 2021 -- closed
- Jan. 2, 2021 -- open, 8:30-11:30 a.m.

3. CARES Center will be available during the break

The <u>CARES Center (for COVID-19 self-reporting)</u>, which *will* be staffed during the holiday break, continues to be an important University resource that not only provides University officials real-time indication about COVID-19's impact on our campuses, but also initiates a support system for the student's benefit to assure their well-being and academic success.

The CARES Center's ability to mitigate the spread of the virus on our campuses relies on the University community's willingness to be honest and forthcoming with information. In order to monitor public health, it is important that students and employees are encouraged to contact the CARES Center to report if they:

- · Have tested positive for COVID-19, or
- Are experiencing COVID-19-related symptoms, or
- Were notified they are a close contact with a COVID-19 positive case.
