Savannah & Tybee Island

Historic Savannah, Georgia, is located on the Atlantic Coast, at the confluence of the Savannah River and the Atlantic Ocean. Throughout its history, there has been one adjective consistently used to describe Savannah: beautiful.

The reason? There's something about the unique beauty of Savannah that cannot be forgotten. Streets with canopies of moss-laden trees are honored venues for scores of historic homes. The town squares that Savannah's founding father, James Oglethorpe, laid out as public meeting places are now treasured "pocket parks" located throughout the downtown area.

A renovated waterfront area serves as the hub for shopping and entertainment. Nearby sandy beaches draw streams of visitors with persistent cool breezes and the endless lure of the rolling sea. Finally, there's an indescribable - but readily discernible - feeling in the air that pervades Savannah, a kind of "laid back" approach to the world, a "rootedness" that makes living or working in Savannah an experience second to none.

By way of affirmation, *Le Monde*, the leading French newspaper, called Savannah "the most beautiful city in North America."

Savannah has recently captured the imagination of a nation through its history and its appearance in several feature films, including "Glory," "Forrest Gump," "Something to Talk About," "Midnight In The Garden of Good and Evil" and the recently released film "The Legend of Bagger Vance" starring Will Smith and Matt



Damon. As a result, tourism has become one of the major industries - if not the leading industry - in the Savannah Area.

Savannah hosts over six million tourists each year. Tourism impacts the Savannah area by over \$634 million. The city boasts over 7,000 rooms and more than 100 restaurants as folks have learned that Savannah is more than just a convenient rest stop on the interstate to Florida.

The population in Savannah is roughly 130,000 and Chatham County is the fifth most populous county in the state of Georgia.

Savannah also sits centrally located to some of the southeast's finest beaches. Tybee Island, located less than 30 minutes from Armstrong

Atlantic State's campus, offers six miles of unspoiled sands, tempting seafood and gracious accommodations. Resort areas such as Hilton Head, South Carolina, are less than one hour away and provide even more relaxing getaway options.

Whether it's the lure of historical settings, the friendliness of a southern community or the beautiful climate of southeast Georgia, Savannah is the place for you.



AASU advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time in 2000

Dr. Thomas Z. Jones *University President*

Thomas Z. Jones, the sixth president to serve at Armstrong Atlantic State University, begins his second year at AASU. Hired on August 1, 2000, Jones was selected by the Board of Regents and University System of Georgia Chancellor Stephen R. Portch after an exhaustive national search.

Dr. Jones served on the faculty and administration at Columbus State University, as its vice president for academic affairs from 1988-2000, prior to coming to Armstrong Atlantic State. A 30-year veteran of university teaching and administration, Dr. Jones has taught at Indiana State University, Emory and Henry College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology. While at West Virginia Tech, Dr. Jones served as the Westmoreland Professor of Mining, an endowed professorship, and vice president of academic affairs.

Dr. Jones received his Bachelor's degree in physics from Fairmont State College, his Master's of Arts degree in geology from West Virginia University and his Ph.D in Geology from Miami (Ohio) University.

From 1980-1988, he owned and served as president of Technical Evaluation Consultants, Inc., a privately owned business specializing in providing science, technical and engineering services for business, industry, government agencies and the legal community.

Dr. Jones and his wife, Joyce, have two sons, Matthew and Michael.



Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher *Athletic Director*

Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher begins his sixth full year as the athletic director for Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Aenchbacher's responsibilities include overseeing the entire athletic department and promoting Armstrong Atlantic State athletics in the community of Savannah.

Dr. Aenchbacher received his Bachelor's degree in physical education from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1979, where he was a standout student-athlete for the baseball team as a pitcher. He received his Master's degree and Doctorate of Education from the University of Georgia.

Along with his student-athlete experience at AASU, Dr. Aenchbacher also coached the Pirate cross country teams for five years and started the first AASU men's soccer team, which he coached for seven years.

During Dr. Aenchbacher's tenure as athletic director, AASU's athletic programs have had tremendous success in the classroom and on the playing field. Student-athletes at AASU have excelled in academics with 52 percent earning a 3.0 grade point average or better. The overall grade point average of AASU student-athletes is 2.93, higher than the overall institutional GPA. AASU athletic teams are consistently ranked near the top of one of the nation's premier NCAA Division II conferences, the Peach Belt Conference, and in 1999-2000, achieved its best ever Sears Director's Cup final standing, 22nd.

Dr. Aenchbacher has been married for 10 years to Michele and together they are the proud parents of two children, Jesse and Lainey.

Faculty Athletic Representative



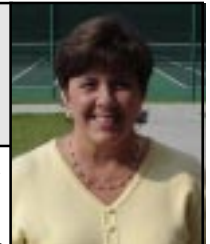

Marty McDaniel Head Softball Coach



Marty McDaniel enters his fifth season at the helm of the Armstrong Atlantic State University softball program. McDaniel put together the Pirates' inaugural 1998 squad as AASU fielded a varsity fastpitch softball squad for the first time. In just four seasons, McDaniel has built a program that captured its first Peach Belt Conference championship, earned an NCAA Regional berth and achieved a No. 1 ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Top 25 poll during the 2000 season.

McDaniel joined the AASU coaching ranks from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, where he served for three seasons as assistant coach to Ralph Weekly, the Mocs' head coach and an U.S. Olympic Assistant Coach. During that time, UTC won three Southern Conference Championships.

A native of Chattanooga, Tenn., McDaniel received his Bachelor's of Science degree from Carson Newman College in 1989 and also assisted the baseball team as a coach for two seasons. A top-rated pitcher himself, McDaniel has played men's fastpitch for over 15 years and has made numerous All-Region squads.

McDaniel and his wife, the former Kelly Stewart, currently reside in Savannah.

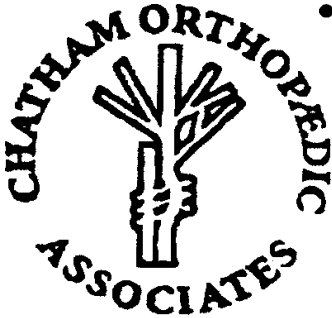
A career military officer, Grider served two tours in the Middle East and is currently a member of the U.S. Army Reserve unit in Savannah.

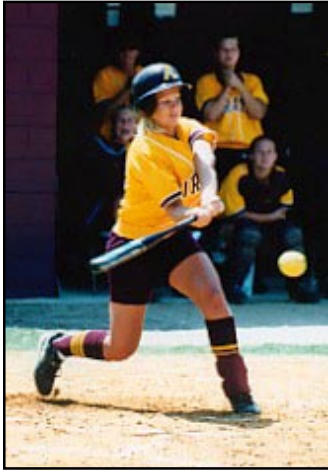




2002 Season Preview

The Armstrong Atlantic State softball squad begins a new era in 2002 - for the first time, the Pirates will take the field without four seniors who had played every game since the inception of AASU fastpitch softball in 1998.

Gone are outfielder Crystal McCracken, second baseman Tesh Wiewel, first baseman Nicole Weirauch and shortstop Ansley Paschal, key parts of the Pirates' squad that finished 33-14 last season and led NCAA Division II in fielding with a .976 average.

In fact, the Pirates have only two players left from the 2000 squad that brought home AASU's first Peach Belt Conference championship and an NCAA berth - senior pitcher Annie Sells and senior third baseman Brea Smith.

A new era could not have a better foundation than Sells, a three-time All-PBC and All-Region pitcher who is the conference's career leader in strikeouts. The PBC's Freshman of the Year in 1999 and Player of the Year in 2000, Sells will find competition in the circle this season from junior Australian hurler Delaney Warrian and freshman Californian Katy Perkins, giving the Pirates a steady rotation heading into the season.

Smith, a 2001 PBC All-Tournament selection last season, is the only returner in a brand new infield that features a University of Georgia transfer and two freshman. Sophomore Lindsay Phillips, who started all 61 games for the Bulldogs in 2000, will be AASU's new shortstop and her double-play mate will be freshman Californian Stacy Oliver. Freshman Amanda Kort will play first base, while sophomore UGA transfer Diana Corwin will see time at catcher

with returnee Kelli McNary.

The outfield features two returnees in right fielder Breon Michel, a 2001 All-PBC and All-Region performer, and center fielder Sara Noe, a speedy slap hitter who led off most of the season last year for the Pirates. Joining Noe and Michel in the outfield will be sophomore Jocelyn Lavender, a transfer from Graceland University.

Another Georgia transfer, sophomore Stacey Richardson, will be the Pirates' designated player, but could also see time in the outfield, as could freshman Allison Bell from Richmond Hill.

The Lady Pirates have been picked to finish third in the Peach Belt Conference in a preseason poll of conference coaches, behind No. 3 preseason-ranked Kennesaw State and No. 12-ranked North Florida.

The schedule contains several strong non-conference opponents as the Pirates will visit North Florida, Kennesaw State and Francis Marion for tournament action, as well as the always competitive PBC schedule. AASU will play seven games against teams ranked in the NFCA's Division II Top 25 Preseason Poll, and with a new expanded field of 48 for the NCAA Championships, a second trip to the big dance for the Pirates is definitely within reach.

2001 AASU Season Review



The Pirates endured a rollercoaster season in 2001, culminating in a runner-up finish at the Peach Belt Conference tournament and on the outside looking in of their second straight NCAA Championships appearance.

AASU began the season with 19 wins in its first 22 games, but a midseason swoon in PBC play left the Pirates with a 24-10 record and just a 5-7 mark in the league heading into a doubleheader at Francis Marion on April 11. The Pirates reeled off eight straight wins after that point, including knocking off PBC champion Kennesaw State 11-7 in the conference tournament and advancing to the championship game, where they lost a heartbreaking 5-4 game to North Florida. In the final region rankings, the Pirates finished fifth, one spot out of the NCAA tournament, ending the year with a 33-14 record, 11-9 in the Peach Belt Conference.

Despite the lateseason disappointment, the Pirates had plenty to celebrate in 2001, as four outstanding players finished their four-year careers at AASU - Crystal McCracken, a two-time All-PBC and All-Region outfielder, finished her Pirate career with a .332 average and 26 home runs; Tesh Wiewel, the Pirates' all-time leader in career batting average at .353 and a 2000 All-PBC and All-Region second baseman; first baseman Nicole Weirauch, who ranks as the PBC's all-time leader and among the NCAA leaders in walks and hit a career-best eight home runs in 2001; and shortstop Ansley Paschal, AASU's all-time stolen base leader with 40. These

four players were part of the inaugural AASU softball team and helped lay the foundation for the Pirates to become one of the nation's finest DII softball programs.

Senior Julie King, who recorded 47 wins for the Pirates, and Diana Julian also finished their AASU careers in 2001.

The senior leadership by these players helped the Pirates lead the nation in fielding percentage as the Pirates committed just 33 errors all season long. The .975 fielding percentage ranks as one of the division's top fielding percentages ever and is the first time an AASU softball squad has led the country in a statistical category.

Junior pitcher Annie Sells earned All-PBC and All-Region honors for the third season in a row as the Pirates' ace went 18-6 with a 1.69 ERA and 187 strikeouts in 153.1 innings pitched. Joining Sells on the All-Conference and All-Region squad was junior Breon Michel, a junior college transfer who hit .333 for the Pirates in her first season at AASU. Sells and junior Brea Smith were named to the All-PBC Tournament squad, as were McCracken and Wiewel. Wiewel was also the PBC's Player of the Week for March 27, while Sells was the PBC's Pitcher of the Week for the sixth time in her career.

The Armstrong Atlantic State University softball team plays on campus at the Pirate Softball Complex, located behind the Pirate baseball field.

The on-campus complex includes home and visitor dugouts with storage areas in each and a restroom located in the home dugout. The Pirate softball scoreboard is located in right-center field and two bullpens are on each side of the field for pitcher/catcher use. For facility maintenance, the Pirates have a tarp that covers the entire infield, reaching into the outfield to help avoid rainouts. The field is totally enclosed with left and center field



reaching 200 feet and right field reaching 190 feet. Aluminum stands sit behind home plate and seat approximately 500 fans. A parking lot providing easy access to the softball complex rests behind the first base dugout and two new batting cages behind the left field fence were recently completed.
