The Tarheels play Rollins Friday, Saturday and Monday in concluding their Florida trip.

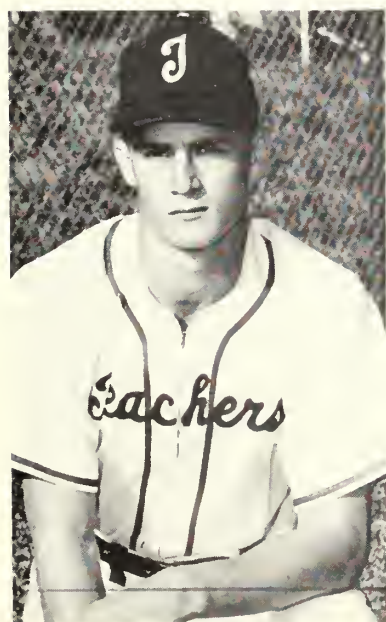

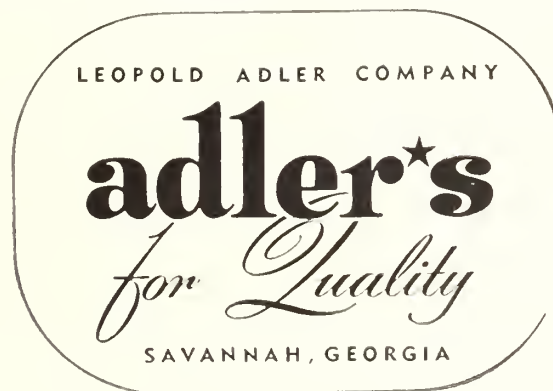

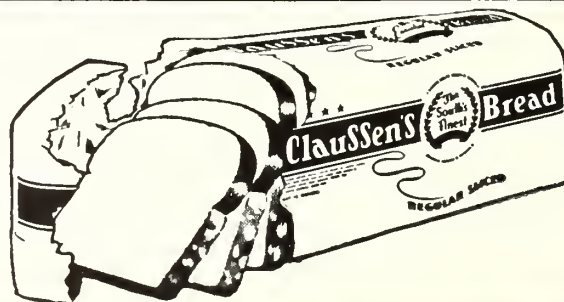
