

## 2001-2002 Season Preview

## AASU Women's Hoops Ready To Make

The Lady Pirate basketball team enters the 2001-2002 season with some definitive goals after last year's season of transition.

Coming off of a year in which the Lady Pirates had to adjust to a new coaching staff and several new players, yet still managed to improve in the win column from a season ago, AASU is now ready to step up and compete for a Peach Belt Conference title.

This year, the Pirates return seven players from last season's squad that went 10-16, but played well down the stretch and knocked off a Top 25-ranked team, Francis Marion, during the year.

Add to the mix a talented group of six newcomers who bring size and athleticism to the Lady Pirates and suddenly the coaches' pick of the Lady Pirates finishing in the top half of the Peach Belt Conference in 2001-2002 becomes justified.

For the Lady Pirates to succeed in fulfilling their preseason promise, leadership will have to come from guard **Lexie Martin** (5-7, Sr., Youngsville, La.), the

lone senior on the squad for AASU. A three-year standout for the Lady Pirates, Martin has averaged 11.3 points per game in her career and has increased her scoring average each season. AASU's alltime free throw shooter, Martin also ranks second alltime in three-pointers and needs just 37 three-pointers to own that record as well.

One of the other reasons the Pirates are picked to do well this season is the return of first-team All-Peach Belt Conference forward Zandrique Cason (6-0, Jr., Mesa, Ariz.). A preseason All-America honorable mention selection and the preseason pick to be the PBC Player of the Year by the Women's Division II Bulletin. Cason transferred to AASU from Liberty last season and made an immediate impact, averaging 16.7 points

and 10.3 rebounds per game in her first season with the Lady Pirates. She became only the second AASU player to ever lead the conference in rebounding and set a school and PBC record with 18 defensive rebounds against Lenoir-Rhyne on December 15, 2001.

Helping direct the one-two offensive punch of Martin and Cason will be guard **Marloes Renskers** (5-7, Jr., Enschede, The Netherlands). Renskers led the Lady Pirates in assists last season and also recorded a season-high seven steals in AASU's win over Lander on January 6.

The Lady Pirates also return guard **Kristin Brewer** (5-6, Jr., Lumber City, Ga.) and guard/forward **Melissa Germany** (5-9, Jr., Macon, Ga.) returning in 2001-2002 as well. Brewer, a former walk-on, has seen action from point guard to small forward in her two seasons with the Lady Pirates, while Germany returns after a year-long rehab of a knee injury she suffered in the 2000-2001 preseason.

Rounding out the Lady Pirates returnees are

forward **Becky Thrift** (6-0, Jr., Rincon, Ga.) and center Rachel **Baker** (6-3, Soph., Houston, Texas). Thrift was one of the top scorers off the bench last season after transferring to AASU from Middle Georgia College, while Baker logged plenty of minutes as Cason's primary backup at center and even ranked among the PBC's leaders in blocked shots as a freshman.

Of the six players who join the Lady Pirates this season, the two key newcomers are twin sisters **Shanetra Hodge** (5-9, Jr.,

Carthage, Texas) and **Shaletra Hodge** (5-10, Jr., Carthage, Texas). The duo transfer to AASU from Odessa JC in Texas and will be looking to step in immediately to the Lady Pirates' lineup as fans look to tell the two apart on the floor. No relation to head coach Roger Hodge, Shanetra is a guard with a good shooter's touch while Shaletra is a forward who earned All-Conference and All-Region honors at Odessa JC in 2000-2001.

The Lady Pirates also welcome another Division I transfer this season in **Becky Tompkins** (5-10, Soph., Richmond Hill, N.Y.). Tompkins averaged 7.8 points and 2.5 rebounds a game last season as a freshman at Manhattan College and will compete for a starting spot at the forward position.

To go along with the three six-footers already on the Lady Pirates' roster, AASU welcomes two more in forwards **Eliza Kucharska** (6-2, Fr., Amsterdam, The Netherlands) and **Ebony McMullen** (6-1, Fr., Center Hill, Fla.). Kucharska is a Polish native who played on the Dutch Junior National Team for two seasons, serving as team captain, while McMullen was an All-State performer for South Sumter HS in Florida.

Rounding out the Lady Pirates newcomers is walkon guard/forward **Bethany Sales** (5-7, Fr., Powder Springs, Ga.).

The Peach Belt Conference elected to move from 16 conference games to 19 conference games, adding to the importance of the league's annual slate. AASU starts off the season by hosting the 2001 Chatham Orthopaedics/Lady Pirate TipOff Classic, featuring two 20-game winners from last season - Presbyterian and Fayetteville State - and Ferris State.

The Lady Pirates also travel for non-conference games at Fort Valley State and Lenoir-Rhyne, take on cross-town rival Savannah State in a home-and-home series, and face its first Division I team in five season as AASU travels to Nicholls State for a game against the Colonels on November 24. The last time the Lady Pirates played a Division I school came in 1996-97 when AASU opened up against Charleston Southern.

Coach Hodge and the Lady Pirates know the task is a tough one as the Peach Belt Conference has sent 13 teams to the NCAA Championships in the last five years, but AASU is ready for the challenge in 2001-2002!

## **Head Coach Roger Hodge**

## Roger Hodge Head Women's Basketball Coach

Roger Hodge begins his second season at the helm of the Armstrong Atlantic State women's basketball program after leading the Lady Pirates to an improved 10-16 mark last season and coaching the Lady Pirates' first first-team All-Conference player, Zandrique Cason, in five seasons.

The Lady Pirates also registered their first win against a team ranked in the Top 25 in over four years with their 75-72 overtime win against No. 22 Francis Marion on January 3, 2001.

With eight players returning from last season's squad and a talented group of incoming recruits, coach Hodge has the AASU women's basketball program heading in the right direction.

The sixth AASU women's basketball coach in school history, Hodge succeeded Lynn Jarrett in 2000-2001 and was hired from Division I Liberty University, where he served as an assistant on the highly successful Flames program.



Entering the collegiate coaching ranks in 1997 with Liberty University, Hodge assisted Lady Flames head coach Rick Reeves on two Big South Conference championship squads in 1997-98 and 1998-99 and last year assisted head coach Carey Green. Liberty finished the 1999-2000 season with a 23-8 overall record and a 12-2 mark in the Big South, capturing the conference tournament for the fourth straight season and advancing to the NCAA Women's Basketball National Championships.

Prior to Liberty, Hodge was an assistant coach at Mercer Christian Academy in Princeton, W. Va., and helped lead the school to the 1996 Class A state championship. Hodge also assisted at Summers County High School from 1987-1994 and



1997, while the school captured three West Virginia Class AA State Championships in 1988, 1992 and 1994. Hodge also directed the Southern West Virginia AAU team that finished runner-up in the AAU National Championships in 1990 and finished second in the state of West Virginia

A graduate of Concord College in Athens, W.Va., Hodge received a bachelor of arts degree in 1992. He

received a bachelor's of science degree in education with a concentration in business principles in 1997. Hodge and his wife, Kristen, recently celebrated the birth of their first child, Madison.

## Andrea Bloodworth Assistant Coach

Andrea Bloodworth begins her first season as the Lady Pirates' head assistant coach. Promoted from her graduate assistant coaching position for the 2001-2002 season, Bloodworth is in her second year overall with the AASU women's basketball program.

Bloodworth came to Savannah after serving as an assistant coach at Ferris State University in 1998-99 and working with the Athletes in Action women's basketball squad during the fall of 1999.

A former standout at Lake Michigan Community College and Calvin College, Bloodworth earned All-MIAA honors for Calvin as a senior and led them to the NCAA Division III Regionals in each of her two seasons. She graduated from Calvin in 1998

with a bachelor's degree in physical education and is currently pursuing her master's degree in sports medicine/health science at Armstrong Atlantic State.



## Dawn Cason Graduate Assistant Coach

Dawn Cason begins her first year with the AASU women's basketball program in 2000-2001, serving as the Lady Pirates' graduate assistant coach.

A two-year standout at California Baptist University, Cason graduated from CBU with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 2001 after averaging 13.3 points and 5.6 rebounds for the Lancers as a senior. A native of Tempe, Ariz., and the sister of current Lady Pirate center Zandrique Cason, Dawn will be pursuing a master's degree in public health administration at AASU.

## This Is Armstrong Atlantic State

ince its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 250-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System.

The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to its present 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 1992.

The university offers over seventy-five academic programs and majors in its School of Arts and Sciences, School of Health Professions and School of Education.

The academic community includes approximately 5,600 students and more than 250 faculty members. Enrollment has more





than doubled in the last decade, from 2,740 students in 1987 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. A Fine Arts Center, including a 1,000 seat theatre/auditorium, the Health Professions Building and an academic computing center are recent completed buildings, along with 84,400 square foot University Hall, built to make room for a student population of 8,000. A new 115,000 square foot, \$28 million dollar science building has been under construction and is slated to open in January 2002.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. AASU sponsors eight intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and non-traditional students. Sixty percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - all have come to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.




## **Dr. Thomas Z. Jones** *University President*


Thomas Z. Jones, the sixth president to serve at Armstrong Atlantic State University, begins his second year at AASU. Hired on August 1, 2000, Jones was selected by the Board of Regents and University System of Georgia Chancellor Stephen R. Portch after an exhaustive national search.

Dr. Jones served on the faculty and administration at Columbus State University, as its vice president for academic affairs from 1988-2000, prior to coming to Armstrong Atlantic State. This 82,000 square foot multipurpose building provides expanded academic offerings in spacious, modern surroundings.

Students have a three-station computer lab, a 1,965 square foot weight training/fitness center with 21 Cybex machine exercise stations and a free weight area; four new classrooms, and two 3,535 square foot activity areas.

AASU's athletic teams play home events in a 4,000 seat arena that contains theatre-type seating for all spectators, and also plays host to a wide variety of social and sporting events.



## 2000-2001 Season Review



The Armstrong Atlantic State women's basketball team finished the 2000-2001 season with a 10-16 overall record and a 5-11 mark in the Peach Belt Conference, both improvements over the previous season, under first-year head coach Roger Hodge, who became the sixth AASU women's basketball coach in school history before the season after serving the last three years as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I Liberty University.

During the 2000-2001 season, the Lady Pirates rode the strong post game of sophomore Zandrique Cason and the three-point shooting of senior Michelle Hubbard, each of whom made their marks on the AASU record books during the season.


Hubbard, who returned to the Lady
Pirate program after two seasons away
from basketball, capped her senior season
by reaching the coveted 1,000 point
milestone against Lander on January 6,
2001. Only the fifth player ever to reach
that plateau, Hubbard finished her career as
the Lady Pirates' fourth all-time leading
scorer. Also AASU's leading all-time three-point shooter,
the Beaufort, S.C., native is ranked in the top 10 in nine

career categories for the Lady Pirates.

Cason averaged a standout 16.7 points and 10.3 rebounds per game in her first season with the Lady Pirates after transferring from Liberty University, ranking fourth and first, respectively, in the Peach Belt Conference. The first AASU player to average a double-double a game since Renee Rice in 1991-92 and only the ninth player to accomplish the feat, Cason also earned PBC Player of the Week honors twice during the season and was named to the All-PBC First Team, the first such honoree for the Lady Pirates since Nicole Smith was a first-team All-PBC selection in 1994-95.

Cason's 433 points were the ninth-most single-season total by a Lady Pirate player and her 269 rebounds were the eighth most. She put up 31 points against Spelman on November 29 and put up 20 rebounds - including an AASU record and Peach Belt Conference record 18 defensive rebounds - against Lenoir-Rhyne on December 15.

Despite the 10-16 record, the Lady Pirates picked up several key wins during the season. The Lady



Junior Lori Green averaged 6.0 rebounds per game, 14th in the Peach Belt Conference, in 2000-2001.

Pirates' 76-74 win over Lander on January 6 snapped a 10-game road winless streak in the Peach Belt, while AASU's 75-72 overtime win against No. 22-ranked Francis Marion on January 3 was the first win for a Lady Pirate squad over a nationally-ranked team since December 15, 1997, when AASU defeated No. 18 Florida Tech, 59-47. The win also snapped a 12-game winless streak against ranked squads. AASU also won for the third straight year on "Senior Night," the final home game of the season, as the Lady Pirates defeated Augusta State, 66-61, on February 21. Junior guard Lexie Martin enjoyed another fine season for the Lady Pirates, averaging 12.2 points per game, ranking 15th in the Peach Belt, and leading AASU in threepoint shooting. Junior Lori Green also turned in a fine season, averaging 6.0 rebounds per game, 14th in the Peach Belt Conference, and ranking among the league's leaders in blocked shots. With just one senior - Hubbard - graduating from the Lady Pirate basketball pro-

gram following the 2000-2001 campaign, the AASU women's hoops team heads into the 2001-2002 season with a key year of experience under their belts and a renewed sense of pride and accomplishment, ready to keep charging to the top of the Peach Belt Conference.



The Lady Pirates scored a season-high 90 points in a 90-56 win over visiting Spelman College on December 6, 2000.

## The Peach Belt Conference

he Peach Belt Conference concludes its first decade of competition this season as the 2000-2001 athletic year marks its 10th year of existence.

In its short history, the league has established itself as one of the premiere Division II conferences in the country.

The 1999-2000 season was no exception with Lander University bringing home its eighth consecutive NCAA Division II men's tennis national championship and Kennesaw State University advancing to the NCAA Division II softball finals. Peach Belt schools have now won 19 national championships and finished second 13 times in the past five years.

The seven charter members were Armstrong State College, Columbus College, Francis Marion College, Georgia College, Lander College, The University of South Carolina at Aiken, and The University of South Carolina at Spartanburg. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January, 1990, then modified in the summer of 2000 with the dropping of the word 'Athletic' to its current name, the Peach Belt Conference.

Augusta College applied and was accepted in November, 1990, with the

effective date of membership on July 1, 1991. Another college joined the Peach Belt on July 1, 1992, when Pembroke (N.C.) State University officially became a member. Kennesaw State University located in Marietta, GA, became the tenth full member of the conference on July 1, 1994. The league accepted its 11th member when Clayton State College, located in Morrow, GA., was accepted in June of 1995.



### Terralyn Edwards

The 1981-82 Georgia Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (GAIAW) Player of the Year, Terralyn Edwards was one of the most talented women's basketball players ever to put on an Armstrong uniform.

As a freshman in 1979-80, Edwards averaged 24.4 points per game, still the single-

season standard for AASU women's basketball. Although injuries limited her to just three games the following year, her junior season saw the standout score 653 points and lead the Lady Pirates to their finest season ever, a 20-12 record and a berth in the AIAW Region III Tournament. Even though injuries hampered her again in her senior season, limiting her to just one game, Edwards' lasting impression on the AASU program was complete.

The first AASU player to score 1,000 career points, Edwards finished her career with 1,275 points, second-most all-time. Her scoring average of 22.0 points per game is third best and she is still the AASU all-time leader in free throws made (361).

In 1995, Edwards, along with her head coach, B.J. Ford, were inducted into the Armstrong Atlantic State Athletics Hall of Fame in the inaugural class.

## This Is Savannah

Tybee Island, located less than 30 minutes from Armstrong Atlantic State's campus, offers six miles of unspoiled sands, tempting seafood and gracious accommodations. Resort areas such as Hilton Head, South Carolina, are less than one hour away and provide even more relaxing getaway options.

Whether it's the lure of historical settings, the friendliness of a southern community or the beautiful climate of southeast Georgia, Savannah is the place for you.
