Paul Rodell published an article "USG Asia Council: Teaching Southeast Asia Workshop," in the Spring 2015 issue of Education About Asia, the pedagogical journal of the national Association for Asian Studies. He also was the co-convener and discussant for a special two session panel "Southeast Asian Religions on the Periphery," at the 8th Euro Southeast Asian Studies conference, August 11-14, hosted by the University of Vienna and the Austrian Academy of Sciences.

Johnathan Bryant's new book, Dark Places of the Earth: The Voyage of the Slave Ship Antelope, was reviewed positively by the Wall Street Journal. Dr. Bryant appeared as a guest on News One Television, on the Roland Martin Radio Show, and on Georgia Public Broadcasting's On Second Thought with Celeste Headly.
