



# AASU Bids To Follow Up NCAA

Head coach Jeff Burkhamer has accomplished, in two short seasons, several of his stated goals when he took over the Armstrong Atlantic State men's basketball program in 2002.

Compete for the Peach Belt Conference title. Win 20 games in a season. Advance to the NCAA Championships. Play with - and knock off - nationally-ranked teams.

Now comes perhaps the toughest task for coach Burkhamer and the Pirates - sustaining that success.


It will be a tremendous task after the Pirates lost 85 percent of their scoring, 87 percent of their minutes played and 97 percent of their assists from last season's squad, but AASU has a couple of building blocks with which to try and keep the trend of success moving forward.



Sophomore Bryan Taylor averaged 6.9 points and 4.5 rebounds last season and was a candidate for PBC Freshman of the Year.

Sophomore forward Bryan **Taylor** (6-8, 225, Timmonsville, S.C.) was one of the best freshman in the Peach Belt Conference last season, averaging 6.9 points and 4.5 rebounds per game and scoring 10 or more points in seven of his final nine games of the year. Taylor has slimmed down and become more athletic in the offseason and looks to have a huge sophomore season as the Pirates' focus of attack in the post.

Junior **Jerard Manning** (6-5, 190, Savannah, Ga.) is the last holdover from before coach Burkhamer's arrival and the athletic forward is ready to take the next step and become a solid Peach Belt player. Sophomore **Nick Bloemhof** (6-10, 215,Meppel, The Netherlands) was a pleasant surprise off the bench, canning 14-of-28 three-pointers (50 percent) and displaying excellent perimeter shooting skills for a big man. He is another player who should im-

prove greatly in his second season.

Sophomore Jermaine Wilkerson (5-10, 170, Claxton, Ga.) got his feet wet with nine games of action last season and should be one of the main backups at point guard this season, while redshirt freshman Jimmy Fanning (6-10, 210) grew an inch during his redshirt year and is looking forward to his first game action as a Pirate.

Nine newcomers will join the Pirates' five returnees, and several will have to make an immediate impact to keep AASU in the Peach Belt hunt this season.

After sitting out last season, senior guard **Lorenzo Lawrence** (6-3, 210, Jacksonville, Fla.) is itching to get in his first collegiate game action since the 2001-02 season, when he played for Western Illinois University. A former All-State performer at St. Johns River CC in Florida, Lawrence averaged 19.0 points per game as a sophomore at SJRCC and should be the Pirates' starting two guard in 2004-05.

Another incoming senior for the Pirates is forward

# **Berth With Another In 2004-05**



Senior guard Lorenzo Lawrence sat out last season for AASU and will be the Pirates' starting two guard after transferring from Western Illinois University, where he averaged 5.9 points per game.

**Travis Wallace** (6-5, 205,Columbia, S.C.), who joins AASU after playing two seasons at PBC rival UNC Pembroke Wallace should start for the Pirates in the frontcourt after ranking in the top 10 last season in the PBC in field goal percentage (56 percent) and rebounds (7.8 per game). The new man

at the point for

the Pirates in 2004-05 will be junior **Clennon Preyear** (6-0, 180, Monroeville, Ala.), a transfer from Alabama Southern CC. Preyear ranked 10th in NJCAA Division II in assists, averaging 7.5 per game, and led the Eagles to the AJCCC Championship Game twice in his career.

Junior guard **Alex Carter** (6-4, 210, Miami, Fla.) will also add some instant offense to the Pirates with his size on the wing. He averaged 14.5 points per game at Miami Dade College last season and played in the NJCAA Region 8 All-Star Game.

Another junior transfer with a great upside is forward **Kenny Brown** (6-6, 210, Savannah, Ga.), a local product from A.E. Beach HS who was a *Savannah Morning News* All-Coastal Empire honoree as a senior for the Bulldogs. Brown will be in the mix at the power forward position this season.


Junior **Rodney Harrison** (5-10, 170, Baltimore, Md.) played for two season at Baltimore County - Essex CC and can back up at both guard positions.

Three talented freshman round out the incoming

players for the Pirates in 2004-05. Freshman guards **Jamaal Galloway** (5-10, 175, Inverness, Fla.) and **Sean Alarcon** (6-2, 185, Delray Beach, Fla.) each have great three-point range and will be counted on to help extend opponent's defenses and knock down the open shot. Forward **Patrick Sanou** (6-6, 205, Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso) is a big, thick athletic post player who will only get better in the coming years.

The Pirates again have a challenging schedule for the 2004-05 season, playing several NCAA Championships teams in both the conference and non-conference schedule. AASU will have home-and-home series with two South Atlantic Region foes, Wingate and Mars Hill, and will also host South Atlantic Region power Lenoir-Rhyne in the AASU Christmas Classic. The Pirates will return this season to St. Petersburg to face Eckerd and Nova Southeastern. The Pirates will also host CIAA and region foe Elizabeth City State, as well as perennial power Queens (N.C.) before diving into Peach Belt play in January.

AASU has been picked to finish fourth in the Peach Belt Conference in 2004-05, behind defending NCAA DII National Champion Kennesaw State, preseason Top 10-ranked Clayton State and Columbus State. The road ahead for AASU to make a repeat trip to the NCAA Championships is a tough one, but the Pirates know they will be up to the task.

# Head Coach Jeff Burkhamer

# Jeff Burkhamer Head Men's Basketball Coach

Jeff Burkhamer enters his third season as head men's basketball coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University. Burkhamer directed the return of the Pirates to NCAA postseason play, leading AASU to a 21-10 record and a berth in the NCAA South Atlantic Regional, only the third NCAA berth for the Pirates since they joined the Peach Belt Conference and the fifth postseason berth overall.

To get into the postseason, the Pirates had to knock off No. 5-ranked Francis Marion in the Peach Belt Conference tournament quarterfinals. A three-point shot by Jason Sanders as time expired propelled AASU to the 72-69 win and represented the third nationally-ranked team that the Pirates have knocked off in coach Burkhamer's two years at AASU.

Burkhamer joined AASU as its ninth head men's basketball coach on June 10, 2002 and led the Pirates to a 14-14 record in his first season, but a 12-7 mark in the Peach Belt, good for fourth place. A native of Williamstown, West Virginia, Burkhamer had been at Marshall University for four seasons under head coach Greg White, first as an assistant coach and then, in 2001-2002, as associate head



coach. While at Marshall, Burkhamer helped the Thundering Herd to a 70-44 record in four seasons in Mid-American Conference play.

Prior to joining Marshall, Burkhamer served as the head coach at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville, Fla., leading the Saints to two Mid-Florida Conference titles. He earned **National Junior College Coach of the Year** honors by College Sport Magazine in 1995-96 as the Saints set a school record with 28 wins and also won 21 straight games to begin the season, gaining a No. 5 NJCAA national ranking and finishing the year with a 28-4 record. In four seasons, the Saints went 97-31 under Coach Burkhamer.

Burkhamer also served as an assistant coach for three seasons in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA), the developmental league of the NBA, with the Grand Rapids Hoops before leading the Santa Fe program and previously served as a head coach at North Greenville College in Tigerville, S.C., where he went 58-10 in two seasons and earned NJCAA Region 10 Coach of the Year honors twice from 1989-1991. He started his coaching career as an assistant coach at Winthrop University in 1984-85, the moved to Charleston Southern (1985-87) and Morehead State (1987-89).

A graduate of Alderson-Broaddus College in Philippi, West Virginia, Burkhamer was a four-year letterman for the Battlers in basketball and baseball and holds the school's all-time assist mark with 646. Burkhamer was inducted into the Battler Hall of Fame in 2001 and was recently honored by the *Parkersburg News and Sentinel* as a member of their silver anniversary team, spotlighting the top high school players from the Parkersburg area over the last 25 years. He graduated from Alderson-Broaddus with a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1984 and earned his master's degree in health and physical education from Morehead State in 1989.

Burkhamer and his wife, Diane, have two children - Melissa (13) and Lindsey (8) - and the family lives in Savannah.

#### Questions and Answers with AASU Head Coach Jeff Burkhamer

#### What were the most important factors in your decision to become the head basketball coach at Armstrong Atlantic?

There were a number of factors that went into my decision. First of all, I wanted to be a head coach again and run my own program. I truly enjoy making the tough decisions and love running practices and coaching in games. Second, I wanted to live in the South and in a city where my family would enjoy living. The beautiful city of Savannah, the beach and the weather fulfilled that wish. Third, I wanted to coach at a school where I thought we could be successful and have a first-class basketball program. Our facilities are outstanding, we have scholarship money available and we have beautiful on-campus apartments.

#### How did last season's success establish the Peach Belt as one of the top basketball leagues in the country?

The Peach Belt Conference is, year in and year out, one of the premier NCAA DII leagues in the nation. Last year was no exception as we placed four teams in the South Atlantic Regional - filling three of the five at-large bids based on power ratings. Also, two Peach Belt teams played in the Regional final and, of course, Kennesaw State waltzed through the Elite Eight in Bakersfield. The PBC can boast of having three different teams in the Elite Eight since 1999, having the No. 1 seed in the region during the last two years and having two teams listed in the top 10 final rankings last season. The PBC is a tough league.

#### What do you feel makes AASU an attractive place to play college basketball and pursue an education.

Armstrong Atlantic provides the best of both worlds. A college diploma from AASU is a valuable tool. You will be very prepared in your field of study and will be marketable in the work world upon completion of your degree. We have state of the art classroom buildings, outstanding professors instructing in the classroom and, equally important, we have professors that care about the students and are willing to work with them to ensure academic success. AASU is a terrific place to play because of the philosophy of our basketball program. We want good people, individuals that will work to get their degree, and players that will compete on the basketball court. We have all the things a student-athlete needs to be successful at AASU.

#### How did qualifying for the NCAAs in just your second season at AASU help lay the foundation for the future of Pirate basketball?

I am very proud of our players and our basketball program. Making the NCAA in just our second season is a huge accomplishment and the quickest its ever been done at AASU. I think it proves that we are doing things the right way and with the right kind of people. The bar has been set high and future Pirates must work hard and play with a tremendous passion in order for us to continue to compete in postseason play. Our goal is to win the PBC and play in the NCAA Tournament every year.

You've been involved with the marketing and promoting AASU basketball. What changes have taken place from the past two seasons?

We have worked very hard at getting the word out about Pirate basketball. I feel we are a hidden jewel on Abercorn. Last year we were fourth in the PBC in attendance after being eighth my first year. We've really tried to get our student body involved in the "Compass Crazies" student section. We've even created a special AASU student entrance at games. Our goal is to have the best home court in the Peach Belt. We've also been involved in the community. Kids are involved in contests and special promotions. We want everyone to have fun and at the same time cheer for the Pirates. We have a variety of events planned again this year. Listed below are some of these planned events:

# Assistant Coaches G.G. Smith and Jason Helton

# G.G. Smith Assistant Men's Basketball Coach

G.G. Smith begins his first season at Armstrong Atlantic State as an assistant coach for head coach Jeff Burkhamer in 2004-05.

A former four-year standout at the University of Georgia and the eldest son of University of Kentucky head coach Tubby Smith, G.G. joins the Pirates after spending last year teaching in Honolulu, Hawaii. Smith's prior experience includes a one-year stint on the staff at Tennessee Tech University in 2002-03, as well as two seasons as the graduate manager for his father's UK program from 2000-02.

Smith played from 1995-1999 at the University of Georgia and is the third-leading assist maker in school history, dishing out 440 assists in four seasons. He was the 29th player in school history to reach the 1,000 point plateau and finished his career with 1,131 points.



He received his bachelor's of science degree in health and physical education from the University of Georgia in 1999, and also received his master's degree in sport management from the University of Kentucky in 2002.

Smith and his wife, Lorie, a Kingsland, Ga., native, are already familiar with the Savannah area as the couple exchanged wedding vows on Bull Street in 2003.

Coach Burkhamer: "G.G. brings a lifetime of basketball experiences with him to Armstrong Atlantic. He's been in the gym with his dad and around good players and great basketball programs his entire life. I also believe his career as a player at the University of Georgia will give us instant 'name recognition' with high school players in our state. G.G. will be in charge of recruiting, will oversee academics and will be heavily involved with the individual development of our players on the court. I believe G.G. is a perfect fit for our basketball program.

# Jason Helton Assistant Men's Basketball Coach

Jason Helton begins his first season with head coach Jeff Burkhamer as an assistant coach at Armstrong Atlantic State in 2004-05.

A native of Savannah, Helton joins the Pirates after completing his bachelor's of science degree in education from the University of Georgia in 2003. While at the University of Georgia, Helton served as a student assistant coach for two seasons, helping the Bulldogs to the 2002 SEC Eastern Division title and two NCAA Championships appearances.

A lifelong basketball disciple, Helton began coaching children's basketball at the age of thirteen and has not stopped coaching since. He has worked numerous camps, including the Jim Harrick Basketball Camps in 2001 and 2002, and will be directly involved with film exchange, video breakdown and individual work with post players. He will also assist with practices and gameday preparation for the Pirates.

## This Is Savannah

Historic Savannah, Georgia, is located on the Atlantic Coast, at the confluence of the Savannah River and the Atlantic Ocean. Throughout its history, there has been one adjective consistently used to describe Savannah: beautiful.

Savannah has recently captured the imagination of a nation through its history and its appearance in several feature films, including "Glory," "Forrest Gump," "Something to Talk About," "Midnight In The Garden of Good and Evil" and the 2000 hit



film "The Legend of Bagger Vance" starring Will Smith and Matt Damon. Also, Savannah hosted the yachting events of the 1996 Summer Olympics. As a result, tourism has become one of the leading industries in the area.

Savannah hosts over six million tourists each year. Tourism impacts the Savannah area by over \$634 million. The city boasts over 7,000 rooms and more than 100 restaurants as folks have learned that Savannah is more than just a convenient rest stop on the interstate to Florida.

The climate of Savannah features warm, and sometimes hot, weather for most of the year. There are seven months in which the average temperature is 70 degrees or higher. The lowest average high is in January at 60.3 degrees.

The population in Savannah is roughly 130,000 and Chatham County is the fifth most populous county in the state of Georgia.

Savannah also sits centrally located to

some of the southeast's finest beaches. Tybee Island, located less than 30 minutes from Armstrong Atlantic State's campus, offers six miles of unspoiled sands, tempting seafood and gracious accommodations. Resort areas such as Hilton Head, South Carolina, are less than one hour away and provide even more relaxing getaway options.

Whether it's the lure of historical settings, the friendliness of a southern community or the beautiful climate of southeast Georgia, Savannah is the place for you.

### Armstrong Atlantic State University

Since its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 250-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a twoyear unit of the University System.

The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to its present 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original

structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 2001.

The university offers more than seventy-five academic programs and majors in its School of Arts and Sciences, School of Health Professions and School of Education.

The academic community includes approximately 6,500 students and more than 250 faculty members. Enrollment has more than doubled in the last 15 years, from 2,740 students in 1987 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. Recently completed buildings include the Fine Arts Center, with a 1,000 seat theatre/auditorium, the Health Professions

Building and an academic computing center, along with 84,400 square foot University Hall, built to make room for a student population of 8,000. A 115,000 square foot, \$28 million dollar science building opened in 2002. This fall, the campus welcomes the second phase of Compass Point, an addition to the school's first apartment complexes. Phase two provides an additional 300 beds to the already existing 275 beds from phase one and campus leaders are in talks for a planned phase three addition to Compass Point.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. In 2004-05, Armstrong Atlantic State will host Peach Belt Conference Championships in volleyball and golf, while also hosting the 2005 NCAA Division II Men's Golf National Championships.

AASU sponsors 10 intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991. The Pirates have not finished below fourth in the league's allsports competition since joining the league and finished third in 2003-04, behind North Florida and Kennesaw State.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and non-traditional students. Sixty percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.

AASU's 115,000 square-foot state-of-the-art \$28 million science building opened in 2002.

AASU's enrollment is projected to top the 10,000 mark by 2010

Dr. Jones served on the faculty and administration at Columbus State University, as its vice president for academic affairs from 1988-2000, prior to coming to Armstrong Atlantic State. A 30-year veteran of university teaching and administration, Dr. Jones has taught at Indiana State University, Emory and Henry College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology. While at West Virginia Tech, Dr. Jones served as the Westmoreland Professor of Mining, an endowed professorship, and vice president of academic affairs.

Dr. Jones received his bachelor's degree in physics from Fairmont State College, his master of arts degree in geology from West Virginia University and his Ph.D in Geology from Miami (Ohio) University.

From 1980-1988, he owned and served as president of Technical Evaluation Consultants, Inc., a privately owned business specializing in providing science, technical and engineering services for business, industry, government agencies and the legal community.


Along with his student-athlete experience at AASU, Dr. Aenchbacher also coached the Pirate cross country teams for five years and started the first AASU men's soccer team, which he coached for seven years.

During Dr. Aenchbacher's tenure as athletic director, AASU's athletic programs have had tremendous success in the classroom and on the playing field. Student-athletes at AASU have excelled in academics with 48 percent earning a 3.0 grade point average or better. The overall grade point average of AASU student-athletes is 2.9, higher than

the overall institutional GPA. In 2003-04, the AASU athletic department sent seven of eight teams to the NCAA DII Championships for the second straight season, the best ratio in the nation. The Pirates also collected the third-most points per sport sponsored in the annual NACDA Director's Cup competition, which tracks the performance of Division II schools in all sports. AASU accumulated its most Director's Cup points ever (328.5) and averaged 41.1 points per sport, behind only Grand Valley State (MI) and Cal State Chico.

Dr. Aenchbacher has been married for 13 years to Michele and together they are the proud parents of two children, Jesse and Lainey.


## 2003-04 Season Review

The Armstrong Atlantic State men's basketball squad returned to the NCAA Championships in 2003-04, capping a successful season that saw the Pirates go 21-10 and knock off the No. 5-ranked team in the nation en route to the fifth postseason berth in program history.

The Pirates opened the season by going 9-2 in nonconference action, picking up key South Atlantic Region wins over Presbyterian, Fayetteville State and Lenoir-Rhyne. As PBC play opened, the Pirates started off the slate by winning three straight, including a key 64-60 win over Clayton State in Savannah. AASU showed great consistency in 2003-04, not losing to a team with a below .500 record all year long.

AASU finished in a tie for third place in the PBC's South Division with a 10-6 league mark, meaning the Pirates would have to take on Francis Marion, the North Division champions in the quarterfinals of the PBC tournament. After defeating Lander in the opening round, the Pirates faced the No. 5-ranked Patriots and played a nipand-tuck game that came down to the final second - literally. Senior Jason Sanders drained an off-balance threepointer as time expired to give AASU a 72-69 win over FMU and assure the Pirates of a postseason berth.

Making their fifth NCAA postseason appearance in

school history and third in the Peach Belt era, the Pirates again matched up with Francis Marion in the regionals, and again it was a close affair, but this time the Patriots came out on top, 84-86 - the only time since head coach Jeff Burkhamer has been at AASU in which the Pirates have scored 70 or more points in a game and lost.

Seniors Brian Bain and Daryl Williams were the goto-guys during the year and both turned in fantastic seasons in their final years as Pirates. Bain was a first-team All-PBC honoree after averaging 17.2 points per game, ranking fourth in the Peach Belt Conference, while Williams averaged 21.8 points per game in 19 games and was named to the All-

PBC Tournament team in helping AASU reach the semifinals.

Five other seniors played their final games as Pirates, including Sanders, whose game-winning three-pointer against Francis Marion should not have been a surprise since the guard led the PBC in three-point field goal percentage during the season, hitting 47 percent of his treys (32-of-68). Sanders also earned the Ashley Dearing Cup in 2004-05, given to the top free-throw shooter on the squad.

Senior Justin Wood finished his career ranked fourth on the all-time AASU chart for games played (113) and ninth in three-point field goals made (88). The former walk-on shot a career-best 39 percent from three-point range (39-of-100) and ranked seventh in the PBC.

Seniors Scott Mattingly (4.8 points, 2.5 rebounds per game) and Tim Brewer (2.7 points per game, 45 percent on three-pointers) finished up their two-year careers, while senior Tim Black averaged 7.9 points and shot 52 percent from the floor in his one season at AASU.

Even with the spotlight on so many seniors in 2003-04, one underclassman did excel during the year - freshman forward Bryan Taylor, who was one of the candidates for Freshman of the Year honors in the league. Taylor averaged 6.9 points and 4.5 rebounds and scored in double figures in seven of his last nine games, giving the Pirates a go-to-guy heading into 2004-05.

As a team, the Pirates led the Peach Belt Conference in field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage, ranking 39th in the country in the latter category as well. The 20-win season was the seventh such season in school history and the Pirates look to continue the recent success in 2004-05.

# The Peach Belt Conference

Since its inception in 1991, the Peach Belt Conference has worked tirelessly to become one of the elite conferences in NCAA Division II. Now entering its 14th season with 21 national championships and 16 national finalists, the PBC has accomplished that goal.

Starting with only two championships in 1991, in men's and women's basketball, the conference has expanded to 12 championship sports with the addition of women's soccer in the fall of 2000.

The conference traces its roots back to November of 1988 when 11 schools first met in Greenville, S.C. to form a Division II conference. Following a second meeting on Dec. 3, 1989, five of those 11 schools, plus two others, formed the Peach Belt and begin play in 1991.

The Peach Belt was less than a year old before capturing a national championship. The Columbus State golf team took the honor by winning the 1992 national crown, the first of three golf championships the Cougars own.

The PBC has seen continued success in all sports with national rankings and multiple NCAA appearances in every sport last season, including a national championship for the Columbus State baseball team and a national championship finals appearance by the Armstrong Atlantic State women's tennis team.

The seven charter members of the conference were Armstrong Atlantic State University, Columbus State University, Francis Marion University, Georgia College & State University, Lander University, USC Aiken and USC Upstate (formerly USC Spartanburg). The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January of 1990 and modified to Peach Belt Conference in May of 2000.

Augusta State joined the conference in 1991 and UNC Pembroke became the ninth member on July 1, 1992. They were followed by Kennesaw State University on July 1, 1994, Clayton College & State University on July 1, 1995 and the University of North Florida on July 1, 1997, to bring the current membership to 12 institutions.

Former Augusta State basketball coach and athletic director Marvin Vanover was named the interim commissioner in April, 1990, and served in that capacity until his appointment as the conference's first fulltime commissioner in July of 1991. He established the conference office in Augusta, Ga., which houses the commissioner and his staff.

Dr. Thomas Hallman, president of the University of South Carolina at Aiken, is the president of the Peach Belt in 2004-05.

The conference currently holds championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women. They are men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, baseball, softball and men's golf.



• Seven of AASU's eight intercollegiate athletics teams advanced to the NCAA Championships in 2003-04 for the second year in a row, the best ratio among Division II schools in the nation.

• **13** AASU student-athletes earned Division II All-America honors in 2002-03.

• AASU accumulated its most points ever in the NACDA Director's Cup all-sports competition (328.5), ranking **third in the country** in points per sport with 41.1, behind only Grand Valley State and Cal State Chico.


