Armstrong Atlantic State University

Since its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 268-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System. The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to a 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 2002.

The university offers more than seventy-five academic programs and majors in the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Health Professions, College of Education and School of Comput-



ing. The academic community includes approximately 7,000 students and more than 400 faculty members. Enrollment has nearly doubled in the last 15 years, from 3,700 students in 1990 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. Recently completed projects include the nearly 30,000 square foot Armstrong Center for Continuing Education and Community Engagement, which opened this fall; a \$5 million dollar renovation of the Lane Library; a brand new Student Recreation Facility and a 14,500 square foot Dental Hygiene clinic and Communicative Disorders Center. Campus life is abundant with Compass Point, University Crossings and University Terrace offering on-campus, two- and four-bedroom furnished apartments for 856 students.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. Construction of a women's fieldhouse for soccer and softball began in the fall and should be completed in Spring 2006.

AASU sponsors ten intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991. Women's soccer and women's golf debuted in 2005-06, joining men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, men's and women's tennis, men's golf and softball as sports that AASU sponsors.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and non-traditional students. Forty-three percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Thomas Z. Jones University President

Thomas Z. Jones, the sixth president to serve at Armstrong Atlantic State University, begins his seventh year at AASU. Hired on August 1, 2000, Jones was selected by the Board of Regents and University System of Georgia Chancellor Stephen R. Portch after an exhaustive national search.

Dr. Jones served on the faculty and administration at Columbus State University, as its vice president for academic affairs from 1988-2000, prior to coming to Armstrong Atlantic State. A 30-year veteran of university teaching and administration, Dr. Jones has taught at Indiana State University, Emory and Henry College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology. While at West Virginia Tech, Dr. Jones served as the Westmoreland Professor of Mining, an endowed professorship, and vice president of academic affairs.

Dr. Jones received his bachelor's degree in physics from Fairmont State College, his master of arts degree in geology from West Virginia University and his Ph.D in Geology from Miami (Ohio) University.

From 1980-1988, he owned and served as president of Technical Evaluation Consultants, Inc., a privately owned business specializing in providing science, technical and engineering services for business, industry, government agencies and the legal community.

Dr. Jones and his wife, Joyce, have two sons, Matthew and Michael.



Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher Athletic Director

Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher begins his eleventh full year as the athletic director for Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Aenchbacher's responsibilities include overseeing the entire athletic department and promoting Armstrong Atlantic State athletics in the community of Savannah.

Dr. Aenchbacher received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1979, where he was a standout student-athlete for the baseball team as a pitcher. He received his Master's degree and Doctorate of Education from the University of Georgia.

Along with his student-athlete experience at AASU, Dr. Aenchbacher also coached the Pirate cross country teams for five years and started the first AASU men's soccer team, which he coached for seven years.

During Dr. Aenchbacher's tenure as athletic director, AASU's athletic programs have had tremendous success in the classroom and on the playing field. Student-athletes at AASU have excelled in academics with 49% percent earning a 3.0 grade point average or better. The overall grade point average of AASU student-athletes is 2.84, higher than the overall institutional GPA, and in 2005-06 the Armstrong Atlantic State athletic department captured the inaugural Peach Belt Conference Presidential Academic Award, given to the league athletic department whose student athletes record the highest overall GPA compared to the student body. AASU also sent six of 10 intercollegiate teams to NCAA Championship play and six of 10 teams also finished the 2005-06 season ranked nationally.

Dr. Aenchbacher has been married for 14 years to Michele and together they are the proud parents of two children, Jesse and Lainey.





Ted Evans Head Softball Coach

Ted Evans is in his third year as head coach of Armstrong Atlantic State University. Evans came to AASU from Chattanooga State Community College in Chattanooga, Tennessee, in 2005.


Evans is a California native and the son of a highly successful junior high school coach. He brings nearly 30 years of teaching and coaching experience to Armstrong Atlantic State as the program's second-ever head fastpitch softball coach. A former professional baseball player in the Cincinnati Reds organization, Evans played and coached competitive men's fastpitch softball for 17 years. Infused with a self-proclaimed passion for softball, Evans has the reputation of a 'teaching coach' and has earned credit amongst his peers for his innovative hitting technique.

Evans played for 19 years in the renowned Dixie Major League in Chattanooga, where he was honored as the Chattanooga Softball Player of the Year three times. He was also the player/coach for the McKee fastpitch team for 17 years, guiding the team to 12 city championships and at one time a 101-1 overall record.

On February 27, 2006, Evans was inducted into the Greater Chattanooga Sports Hall of Fame.

Evans graduated from Andrews University with a bachelor's degree in physical education, and earned his master's of education from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

In Evans' first year at AASU, he guided the Lady Pirates to a .500 campaign with a squad that lost 12 players from the previous season. "I'm honored to be at Armstrong Atlantic," Evans says. "I'm looking forward to continuing challenges of building a softball program that will be a consistent national power."

Jodie Swavely Assistant Softball Coach

Jodie Swavely, a native Pennsylvanian, enters her first season as assistant coach for the Armstrong Atlantic State Softball squad. Swavely a 2006 graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania where she played softball for four seasons is working to obtain her master's degree in health sciences from Armstrong Atlantic State.


While at IUP Swavely was named a Regional All-American in 2002-2006. Jodie was also named to the NCAA Mid-Atlantic All-Star team in 2006. During her stint as a pitcher at IUP Jodie hurled 620 innings in 110 appearances, while striking out a school record 643 batters to compile a career ERA of 1.66.

Swavely also had a stellar career at the plate appearing 502 times, driving in 96 runs, and knocking 26 home runs to tally a .325 batting average.

Before her career at IUP, Swavely attended Fleetwood Area HS in Fleetwood Pennsylvania where she helped the Tigers to a state championship in 2001. She was also named Player of the Year in 2000, 2001, and 2002.



2007 Season Preview



Sophomore Ashley Bain slugged an impressive .340 while driving in 40 runs for AASU in 2006.

The Armstrong Atlantic State Softball squad opens the 2007 season up with a new lineup. Returning just four players, one senior and three sophomores, from the 2006 squad that made a surprising run in the NCAA South Atlantic Regionals last year, defeating two nationally ranked squads and finishing the year ranked No.23.

Sophomore outfielder Ashley Bain (5-6, Soph., Cleveland, Tenn.) returns to play shortstop for the 2007 season. Bain compiled a .340 average in 65

games while driving in 40 runs and collecting 67 hits as a freshman for the Pirates during the 2006 season. Amanda Baxter (5-11, Sr., Covington, Ga.) returns as a strong utility player who played in 42 games last season hitting a .160 average with four hits and scoring 16 runs. Sophomore pitchers Courtney Tucker (5-5, Soph., Okatie, S.C.) and Pam Bykowski (5-1, Soph., Perry, Ohio) return to the circle for AASU in 2007. Tucker hurled 108 and 2/3 innings for the Pirates giving up 124 hits, 64 runs, 34 walks and striking out 61 batters as a freshman. Bykowski gave up 55 hits, 28 runs, 18 walks and struck out 15 in 41 and 1/3 innings of work as a freshman for the Pirates in 2006.

Senior Vanessa Becerra (5-3, Sr., Littleton, Colo.), a transfer from Otero Junior College where she helped the Rattlers to two Region IX Championships in 2004 and 2005. Becerra was also named Region IX Player of the Year in 2005 as well as a 2004 All-American will suit up for the Pirates behind the plate.

Juniors Amanda Vickers (5-4, Jr., Manteca, Calif.) and Kari Marsico (5-8, Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) will fill the voids in the outfield. Vickers a transfer student from San Joaquin Delta College where she played for two years and was named to the Big Seven All-Conference squad both years. Marsico a transfer from Western Nebraska Community College where she earned NJCAA Academic All-American honors as well as being named to All-Region and All-Tournament teams. Sara Morris (5-4, Jr., Petaluma, Calif.), a junior transfer from Santa Rose Junior College where she compiled a .456 batting average and drove in 15 RBI as well as being named to the All-Conference team in 2005 and 2006 will fill the void at third base. Playing second base for Armstrong Atlantic in 2007 is junior transfer Natalie Vogler (5-6, Jr., Lynn Haven, Fla.). Vogler hails from Gulf Coast Community College where she played for two seasons and

helped the Commodores secure a National Championship title and earned a spot on the first team All-Conference squad.

Returning to the squad after a year off is sophomore Jaclyn Parlo (5-6, Soph., Calhoun, Ga.). Parlo played in 29 games as a freshman for AASU in 2005 where she recorded three hits and drove in seven runs. Rounding out the sophomore class is catcher and outfielder Jessica Strong (5-6, Soph., Fountain Valley, Calif.), who transfers from El Paso Community College where she was named first team All-Conference and Most Valuable Player for the Tejanas.

Freshman Nicole Huddleston (5-4, Fr., Rossville, Ga.) fills a slot at pitcher and first base for the Pirates. Huddleston was named to the North Georgia Dream Team two years during her career at Ft. Oglethorpe high school. Freshman Jessica Waters (5-11, Fr., Florence, S.C.) will also fill in a slot at pitcher and first base during the 2007 season. Waters played for four years at South Florence high school where she earned District One Player of the Year honors and was also named the Most Valuable Player. Rounding out the freshman class and playing outfield is Savannah product, Tori Richter (5-3, Fr., Savannah, Ga.). Richter played four seasons of softball for Windsor Forest HS, where she was named as the team Most Valuable Player three years running.

2006 Season Review



The Armstrong Atlantic State softball squad returned to the postseason in 2006, culminating with a surprising run in the NCAA South Atlantic Regional in which the Pirates finished third, sending home two nationally-ranked squads, and finishing the season ranked No. 23 in the NFCA's final Division II top 25 Poll - the first national ranking achieved by the Pirates since the 2004 season.

A key to the Pirates' success in 2006 was a solid hitting lineup from top to bottom. Danielle Bertram took over the leadoff spot in the lineup midway through the year and parlayed that into an All-Conference season that saw the senior hit a team-best .385 with 18 stolen bases. Senior shortstop Deanna Beaty led the PBC in sacrifice hits with 18, hitting in the second spot, and finished second on the squad in home runs with 11 and RBI with 36.

Those two ably set the table for junior slugger Amber Hunt, who hit .350 with 13 home runs and an AASU-record 63 RBI, a total that led the Peach Belt. Hunt not only earned All-PBC and All-Region honors but became just the third AASU player to earn NFCA DII National Player

of the Week honors when she hit .500 with four home runs, tying a PBC record with homers in five consecutive games.

As a team, the Pirates hit .302 in 2006 and set school records for home runs (51), doubles (106) and stolen bases (63).

They slugged their way into the South Atlantic Regional,

the fifth postseason appearance for the Pirates in the eight-year existence of the program. While there, the Pirates sent home nationally-ranked Columbus State, 3-2, and Wingate, 2-1, to advance to the semifinals- the third time that the AASU softball squad has advanced that far in the postseason.

In addition to the fine senior seasons turned in by Bertram and Beaty, senior third baseman Jeana Short hit .324 with six home runs and 23 RBI while also earning the AASU President's Cup, given annually to the top female student-athlete at AASU. She is just the second AASU softball player to earn the prestigious academic award.



Junior Amber Hunt led the Pirates in 2006 with 13 home runs and set a new single-season AASU record with 63 RBI.





Tesh Wiewel was a member of the inaugural AASU softball team in 1998 and a member of the 2000 softball squad that captured the school's first-ever Peach Belt Conference title with a 15-2 record and also earned the school's first ever-berth in the NCAA Division II National Championships, advancing to the South Atlantic Regional in Kennesaw, Ga., in just the program's third year of existence. During her career, Wiewel played and started a school record 204 games, collected a school record 229 hits, 10 home runs, 123 RBI, a school record 10 triples and a .353 average in a school record 648 at bats. Wiewel was named to the All-South Atlantic Regional team in 2000, the All-South Atlantic tournament team in 2000, All-Peach Belt honors in 2000 as well as Peach Belt Player of the Week on March 27, 2001.

Armstrong Atlantic State University Facilities

The Armstrong Atlantic State University's athletic department prides itself on having one of the finest athletic facilities not only in the conference, but in the region.

AASU's Sports Center, completed in July of 1995, immediately became a top basketball complex by hosting the 1998 and 1999 Peach Belt Athletic Conference basketball tournaments. This 82,000-square-foot multi-purpose building provides expanded academic offerings in spacious, modern surroundings. Students have a three-station computer lab, a 1,965-square-foot weight training/fitness center with 21 Cybex machine exercise stations and a free weight area; four new classrooms, and two 3,535-square-foot activity areas.

AASU's athletic teams play home events in a 4,000-seat arena that contains theater-type seating for all spectators, and also plays host to a wide variety of social and sporting events.

Directly behind the Armstrong Sports Center sits the home field for baseball. Pirate Field seats 750 fans for the Armstrong Atlantic State University's highly successful baseball program. Generally regarded as one of the best playing surfaces in the conference, Pirate Field has seen the baseball squad advance to 12 NCAA regionals over the past 20 seasons.

The Aquatics and Recreation Center serves as the host of the AASU volleyball squad. The 1,000 seat arena has been upgraded with new lighting and air conditioning fixtures and is the sole volleyball-only facility in the Peach Belt Conference.



Cingular Field serves as the home pitch for the AASU soccer squad. The 114 yds. x 72 yds. grass pitch that was constructed in early 2005 took the place of the Armstrong Atlantic intramural fields that were nestled behind both the baseball and softball fields.

The field house, recently completed in February 2007, is a 3500-square foot complex that features locker rooms, laundry facilities and an athletic training area for the AASU women's soccer and softball programs, as well as restrooms and a concessions area for the public.

The Armstrong Atlantic State University softball team plays on campus at the Pirate Softball Complex, located behind the Pirate baseball field. The on-campus complex includes home and visitor dugouts with storage areas in each and a restroom located in the home dugout. The Pirate softball scoreboard is located in right-center field and two bullpens are on each side of the field for pitcher/catcher use.

For facility maintenance, the Pirates have a tarp that covers the entire infield, reaching into the outfield to help avoid rain-outs. The field is totally enclosed with left and center field reaching 200 feet and right field reaching 190 feet. Aluminum stands sit behind home plate and seat approximately 500 fans. A parking lot providing easy access to the softball complex rests behind the first base dugout. 2002 marked the debut of live internet webcasting of AASU softball games through a wireless internet connection to the Pirate softball field.

Dr. Spencer Wheeler is the medical director and team physician for Armstrong Atlantic's athletic teams. Dr. Wheeler completed his medical school training at the Medical College of Georgia in 1985, and his orthopaedic training at the University of Florida. Wheeler served two sports medicine fellowships; one at Johns Hopkins Institute and one in Sydney, Australia. Dr. Wheeler served as the head of athletic care in Atlanta for the 1996 Summer Olympics.



Daniel Hinely, MED, LAT, ATC **Head Athletic Trainer**

Daniel Hinely enters his first season as head athletic trainer for the Pirates. A graduate of Valdosta State University in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in Sports Medicine, Hinely became familiar with the Peach Belt Conference by completing his master's degree in physical education from GC&SU in 2005.

Hinely joins AASU from Belmont Abbey College, where he served as an assistant trainer for the 2005-06 season.

While at Belmont Abbey, Hinely provided gameday coverage for women's soccer, men's basketball, men's tennis and lacrosse while helping provide daily training needs to more than 260 student-athletes for the Crusaders. Hinely is certified with the ATC and is a member of both the National Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA) and the Georgia Athletic Trainers' Association (GATA).



Jessica Miller, ATC **Assistant Athletic Trainer**

Jessica Miller enters her first season as an Assistant in the AASU Athletic Training Department. Miller will also serve as part time physical education instructor.

A member of the National Athletic Trainer's Association, Miller received her associate's degree in physical education from Ricks College in Rexburg, Idaho. 
