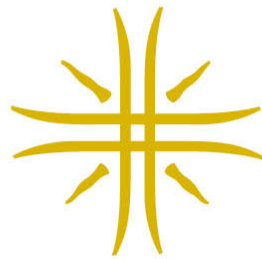


Georgia Southern Cheerleaders Win Back-to-Back National Titles

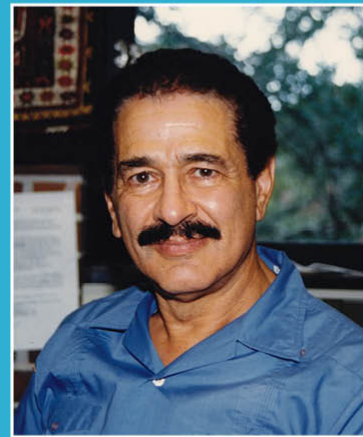

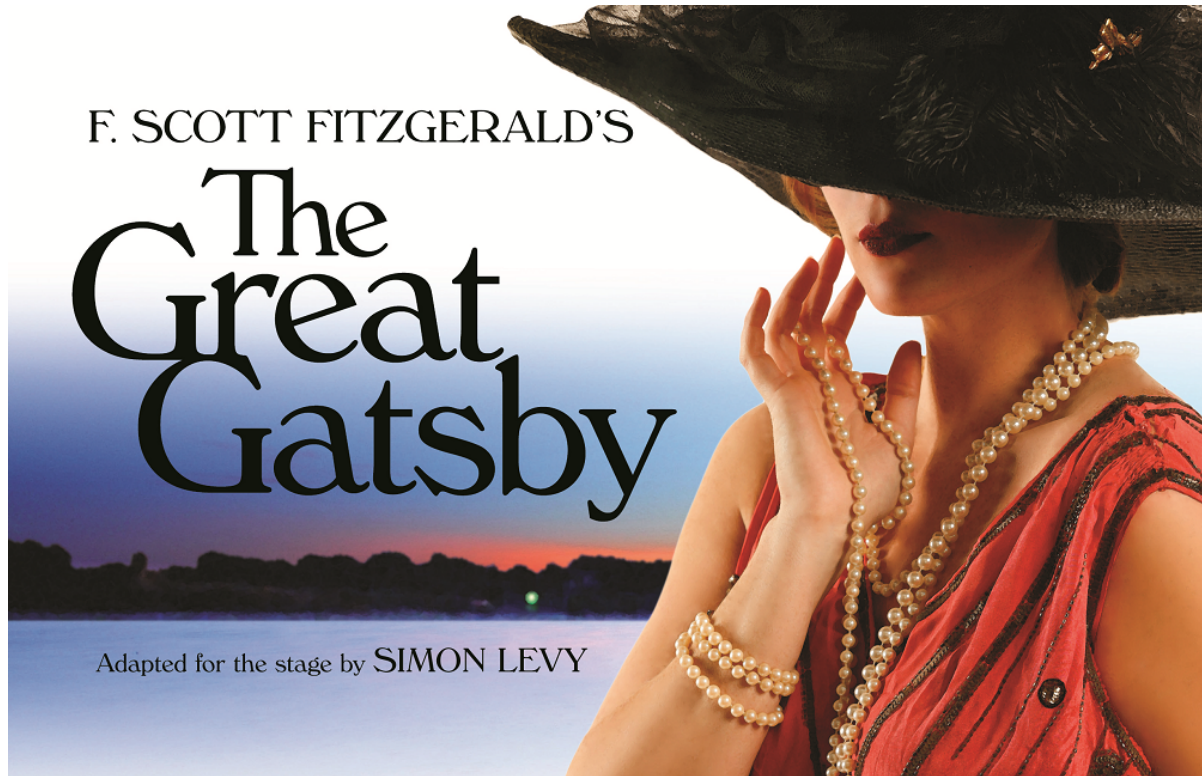
