All those who knew her and loved her miss her.

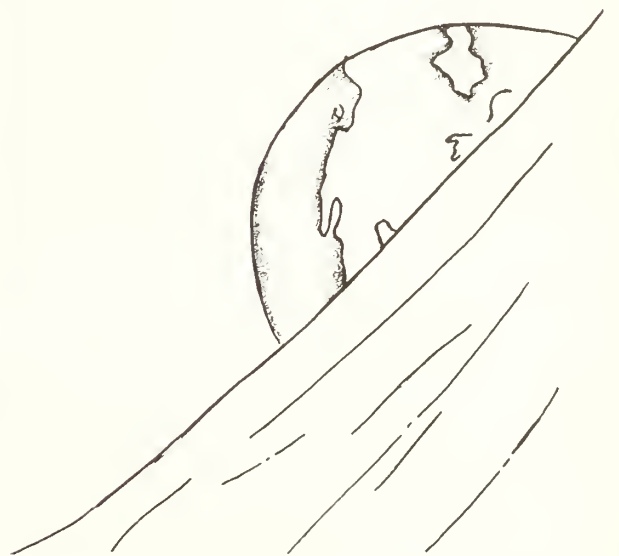

The Marvin Pittman School, named for the late president of the college, comprises both elementary and high schools and serves as a laboratory for the gaining of knowledge and experience.





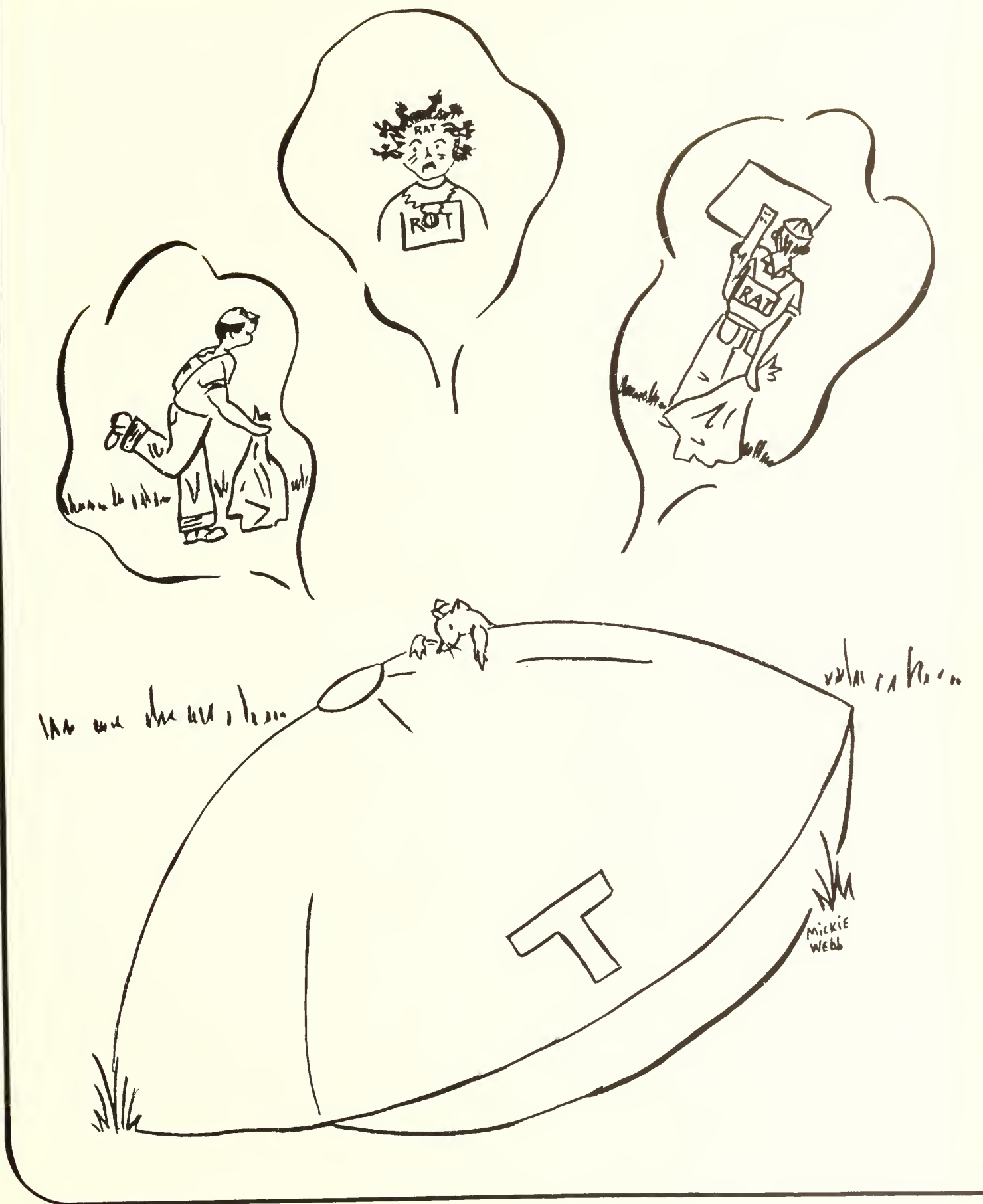
BIOLOGY BUILDING

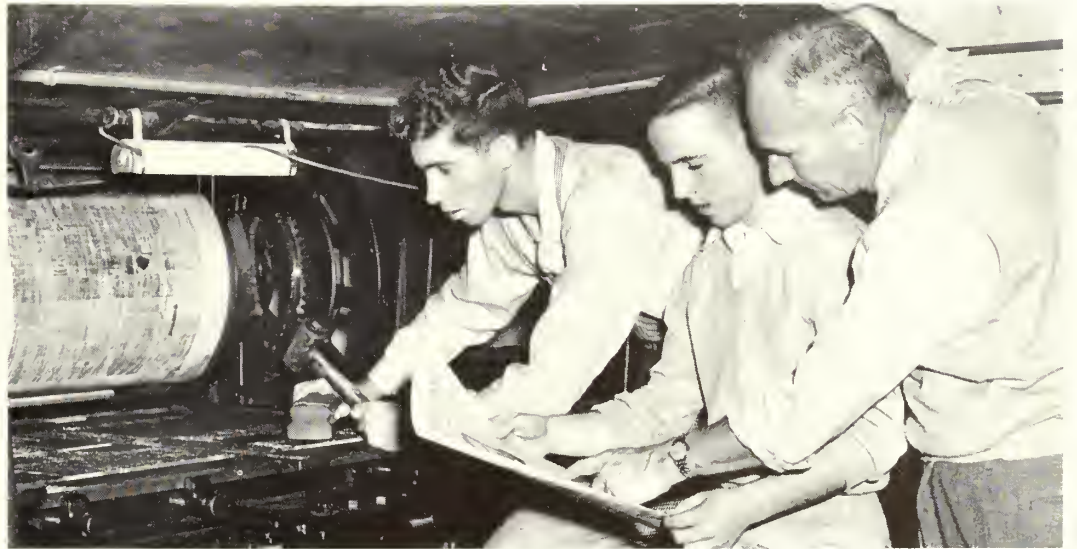
