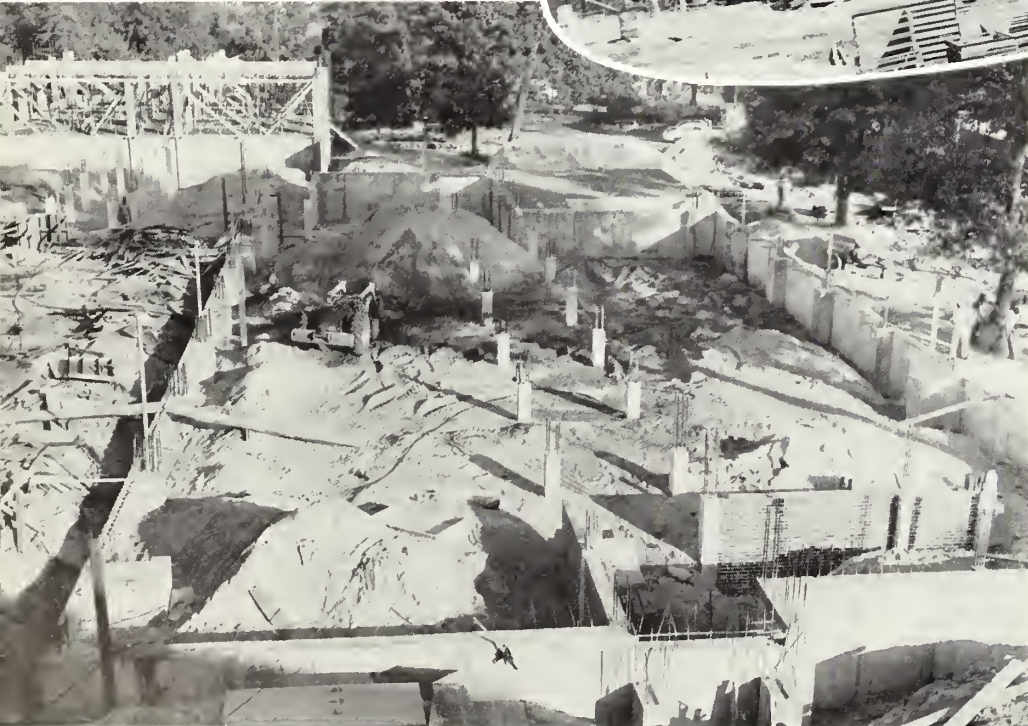

Dining Hall-Student Center under construction at the beginning of the school year.




Classroom and science building under construction at the beginning of the school year.

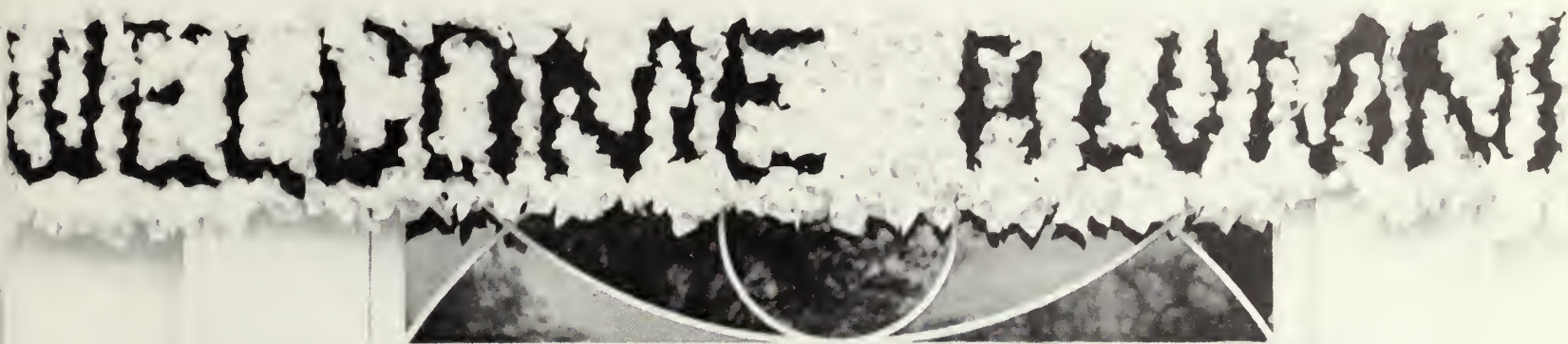

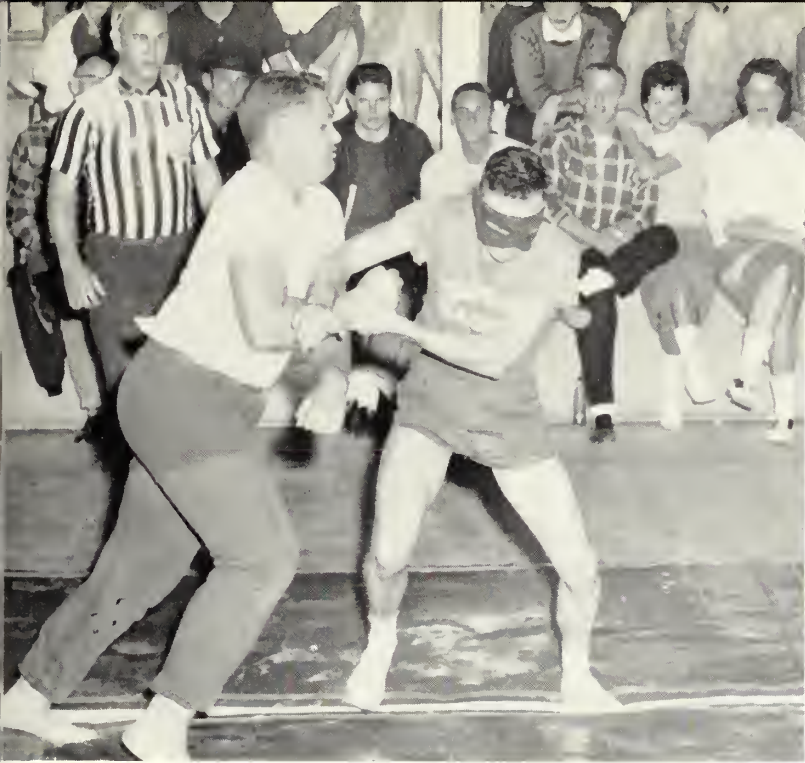
