2001-2002 Season Preview

Defending The Peach Belt Title

The AASU men's basketball team enters the 2001-2002 season having to deal with a lot of new things - a new head coach in John Marhefka, nine new players to incorporate and a new task in defending the school's second Peach Belt Conference championship.

Not everything has changed for the Pirates, however, from last season's squad that won a school-record 16 games in a row, earned the first Division II national ranking for the program in over 20 years and culminated their record-breaking season with a trip to the NCAA Championships, just the Pirates' second such postseason trip since joining the Peach Belt in 1991.

True, the head coach is new, but in title only. Marhefka, the top assistant to departed head coach Griff Mills last season, assumes the head coaching position having spent four of his last five seasons with the Pirates in both a graduate assistant and full assistant coaching capacity. Marhefka's assistant coach in

2001-2002 will be former AASU guard Steve Ray, who moves up from his graduate assistant coaching duties from last season. The third coach on the Pirates' staff is also a familiar face - two-time Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year Robert Campbell will be on the bench, assisting coach Marhefka and coach Ray this season as well.

Nine new players dot the Pirates' roster, but AASU also returns five key contributors to last season's team,

including the starting backcourt of seniors **Donta Humphries** (5-10, Sr., Statesboro, Ga.) and **Mick Jordan** (5-9, Sr., Sarasota, Fla.).

Humphries, who transferred to AASU from Georgia Southern last season, made an immediate impact on the Pirates in 2001-2002, averaging 6.4 points, 3.1 assists and 1.5 steals a game as a junior. Playing mostly two- and three-guard for AASU, Humphries still ranked among the Peach Belt leaders in assists and steals and will focus more on becoming a true point guard for the Pirates in his senior season.

The Peach Belt Conference's leading career three point shooter, Jordan will be one of the top offensive weapons for the Pirates in 2001-2002 after hitting 50.4 percent of his three-pointers in 2001-2002 and helping the Pirates rank 7th in NCAA Division II in three-point shooting. Jordan ranks second all-time on the Pirates' three-point shooting list and needs just 35 three-pointers to become AASU's all-time leader in three-pointers made.

The Pirates' frontcourt in 2001-2002 will benefit from the return of **Bart Westgeest** (6-9, Sr., Wassenaar, The Netherlands). A key bench component AASU's Peach Belt Conference run each of the last two seasons, Westgeest will have the opportunity to start in the middle as a senior and brings a hard-working mentality and toughness to the main post position for the Pirates. Westgeest averaged 3.8 points and 3.4 rebounds per game last season, playing 15 minutes a contest, and should see those numbers rise in 2001-2002.

AASU has two other key returnees in guards **Brian Hobbs** (6-1, Jr., Loganville, Ga.) and **Justin Wood** (6-0, Soph., Midland, Mich.). Hobbs, another

long-distance standout for the Pirates who hit 24 three-pointers last season, will be in the mix at shooting guard while Wood, a walk-on freshman last season who saw action in 31 games, will compete for time at the point guard spot.

For the Pirates to be successful in 2001-2002, however, several of the nine newcomers

will have to make an immediate contribution.

That contribution could come from Missouri Southern State transfer **Willard Winn** (6-7, Sr., Brunswick, Mo.). Winn averaged 7.8 points for the Lions and led the squad in blocked shots last season and projects to be a solid power forward for the Pirates this season.

Joining Winn in the Pirate frontcourt will be Owens CC transfer **Lamarr Cheers** (6-6, Jr., Toledo, Ohio), Calvary Baptist HS standout **Josh Abernathy** (6-6, Fr., Savannah, Ga.) and Cedar Valley College transfers **Nik Douyias** (7-0, Jr., Ionnina, Greece) and **Ian Jones** (6-6, Jr., Oklahoma City, Okla.). A skilled offensive player, Douyias gives the Pirates a good scoring threat in the middle while Cheers, Jones and Abernathy can each see action at the forward positions in 2001-2002.

The Pirates also bring in two more junior college transfers, **Dave Pisarcik** (6-3, Jr., Brook Park, Ohio) and **Jason Sanders** (6-5, Jr., Fort Walton Beach, Fla.) who are skilled enough to play this season at guard or small forward. Pisarcik brings toughness and a good scoring mentality to the Pirates, while Sanders has the quickness and size to be successful in both positions.

Rounding out the Pirate newcomers are walk-ons **Luke McGee** (6-6, Fr., Savannah, Ga.) and **Robb Ritch** (6-4, Soph., Mexico Beach, Fla.). McGee, a high school teammate of Josh Abernathy, will add depth at center and Ritch could see time at both guard and forward.

The Peach Belt Conference elected to move from 16 conference games to 19 conference games, adding to the importance of the league's annual slate. AASU starts off the season with two road trips to Wingate - the team that knocked the Pirates out of the NCAA South Atlantic Regional last season - and Presbyterian, then also plays a home-and-home with cross-town rival Savannah State. The Pirates also host Carson-Newman and Lenoir-Rhyne in their annual Christmas Classic.





Head Coach John Marhefka

John Marhefka Head Men's Basketball Coach

John Marhefka becomes the eighth head coach in AASU men's basketball history, on an interim basis, for the 2001-2002 season.

The head assistant coach for the Pirates last season, Marhefka helped the Pirates to a school record-tying 25 wins and a school-best 16-game winning streak. AASU captured its second Peach Belt Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championships in 2000-2001.

As the head assistant last year, Marhefka was responsible for recruiting the seven players who make up the 2001-2002 incoming class of Pirates and, with seven returnees from last season's championship squad, the Pirates are in a good position to defend their Peach Belt Conference title this year.

A former graduate assistant for Griff Mills from 1996-98, Marhefka returned to Savannah for the 2000-2001 season as the Pirates' assistant coach. Marhefka had spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at Grove City College, an NCAA Division III school in Grove City, Pa. With the Wolverines, Marhefka helped Grove City College and head coach Steve Lamie to the 1998-99 President's Athletic Conference championship.

A native of Medina, Ohio, Marhefka was a four-year letterwinner at Hiram College in Hiram, Ohio, where he helped the Terriers to finish as high as third in the Ohio Athletic Conference, fifth in the Great Lakes Region and earn a Top 20 ranking in the NCAA Division III poll. Marhefka earned his bachelor's degree in English from Hiram and completed his master's degree in Health Science from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1998. He also coached high school for three seasons in his home state of Ohio in between his playing days and joining the Pirates - heading up Shaker Heights HS from 1993-95 and Buckeye Senior HS from 1995-96.

John and his wife, Beth, currently reside in Savannah, Ga.

John Marhefka Becomes The Eighth Head Coach In AASU Basketball History

Steve Ray **Assistant Coach**

Steve Ray begins his second season on the Armstrong Atlantic State men's basketball staff as the Pirates' assistant coach. Promoted from his graduate assistant coaching position for the 2001-2002 season, Ray will be in his fifth year at AASU following a stellar two-year playing career for the Pirates from 1997-1999.

The Pirates' all-time leader in three-point baskets with 163, Ray earned his bachelor's degree in English communications in 2000 from AASU.

Ray's playing career took him from Penn Valley CC in Kansas City, Mo., where he helped the Scouts to the 1995-96 NJCAA National Championship, to the Pirates, where he set AASU marks for three-point shooting, hitting 163 of 379 shots (43%). At Penn Valley, Ray was a two-time first-team All-Region selection and earned NJCAA All-Tournament and Academic All-America honors. While at AASU, Ray was the 1999 President's Cup award winner, given to the top Pirate student-athlete.

Ray will assist head coach John Marhefka in all aspects of the basketball program and is currently nearing completion of his Master's degree in public health from AASU.




Robert Campbell **Graduate Assistant Coach**

Following a terrific playing career at AASU, Robert Campbell joins the Pirate coaching staff as a graduate assistant coach for the 2001-2002 season.

A Savannah native and a two-time Division II All-America player at AASU during his four-year career, Campbell finished with 357 career steals, second all-time on the NCAA Division II list. A two-time Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year, Campbell also finished his Pirate career as AASU's all-time leader in games played and steals and ranked third on the all-time scoring chart with 1,587 career points.

Campbell's duties in 2000-2001 will include assisting the AASU coaching staff in all areas and running the Junior Pirate Developmental Basketball League.




Jordan Is The Peach Belt Conference's Active 3-Point Shooting Leader

This Is Armstrong Atlantic State



Since its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 250-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System.

The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to its present 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 1992.

The university offers over seventy-five academic programs and majors in its School of Arts and Sciences, School of Health Professions and School of Education.

The academic community includes approximately 5,600 students and more than 250 faculty members. Enrollment has more



than doubled in the last decade, from 2,740 students in 1987 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. A Fine Arts Center, including a 1,000 seat theatre/auditorium, the Health Professions Building and an academic computing center are recent completed buildings, along with 84,400 square foot University Hall, built to make room for a student population of 8,000. A new 115,000 square foot, \$28 million dollar science building has been under construction and is slated to open in January 2002.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. AASU sponsors eight intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and non-traditional students. Sixty percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - all have come to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Thomas Z. Jones ***University President***


Thomas Z. Jones, the sixth president to serve at Armstrong Atlantic State University, begins his second year at AASU. Hired on August 1, 2000, Jones was selected by the Board of Regents and University System of Georgia Chancellor Stephen R. Portch after an exhaustive national search.

Dr. Jones served on the faculty and administration at Columbus State University, as its vice president for academic affairs from 1988-2000, prior to coming to Armstrong Atlantic State. A 30-year veteran of university teaching and administration, Dr. Jones has taught at Indiana State University, Emory and Henry College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology. While at West Virginia Tech, Dr. Jones served as the Westmoreland Professor of Mining, an endowed professorship, and vice president of academic affairs.

Dr. Jones received his Bachelor's degree in physics from Fairmont State College, his Master's of Arts degree in geology from West Virginia University and his Ph.D in Geology from Miami (Ohio) University.

From 1980-1988, he owned and served as president of Technical Evaluation Consultants, Inc., a privately owned business specializing in providing science, technical and engineering services for business, industry, government agencies and the legal community.

Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher ***Athletic Director***

Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher begins his sixth full year as the athletic director for Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Aenchbacher's responsibilities include overseeing the entire athletic department and promoting Armstrong Atlantic State athletics in the community of Savannah.

Dr. Aenchbacher received his Bachelor's degree in physical education from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1979, where he was a standout student-athlete for the baseball team as a pitcher. He received his Master's degree and Doctorate of Education from the University of Georgia.

Along with his student-athlete experience at AASU, Dr. Aenchbacher also coached the Pirate cross country teams for five years and started the first AASU men's soccer team, which he coached for seven years.

During Dr. Aenchbacher's tenure as athletic director, AASU's athletic programs have had tremendous success in the classroom and on the playing field. Student-athletes at AASU have excelled in academics with 52 percent earning a 3.0 grade point average or better. The overall grade point average of AASU student-athletes is 2.93, higher than the overall institutional GPA. AASU athletic teams are consistently ranked near the top of one of the nation's premier NCAA Division II conferences, the Peach Belt Conference, and in 1999-2000, achieved its best ever Sears Director's Cup final standing, 22nd.

Dr. Aenchbacher has been married for 10 years to Michele and together they are the proud parents of two children, Jesse and Lainey.

2000-2001: A Season To Remember

The Armstrong Atlantic State men's basketball squad enjoyed a season to remember in 2001-2002, capturing its second Peach Belt Conference championship, collecting a school-record 16-game winning streak and earning the school's first national ranking in 17 years.

Led by two-time Division II All-America Robert Campbell and seniors Greg Favors, Tavares Brown and Cyrille Mainnemarre, the Pirates ranked in the top 25 nationally in scoring defense (65.6 ppg, 21st), field goal percentage (49.5 percent, 11th), field goal percentage defense (40.5 percent, 19th) and three-point shooting (41.1 percent, 7th). The Pirates opened the Peach Belt season with 15 straight league wins, a record, and finished the year with a school record-tying 25 wins. AASU also ascended as high as No. 22 in the *Division II Bulletin* Top 25 poll and advanced to the NCAA Championships for only the second time since the Pirates joined the Peach Belt Conference in 1991.

This from a team that started the season an unimpressive 1-2 at the *Disney's* Division II TipOff Classic in early November and, as late as Christmas, stood at just 7-5 on the year. Beginning with a sound 70-51 win over Valdosta State on December 30th, the Pirates would reel off 16 consecutive wins, including a remarkable 13 straight where the margin of victory was just eight points or less. During the streak, the Pirates:

- Trailed at Georgia College & State University by 14 points, 58-45, with 6:33 remaining in the second half but rallied to force overtime and win, 73-68.
- Erased a 10-point deficit to USC Aiken with three points remaining, using a Robert Campbell three-pointer with one second left for a 66-63 win at homecoming.
- Trailed GC&SU at home by six with 2:15 left, but rallied to win, 67-66.

The Pirates swept the season series with Kennesaw State for the first time in school history and also defeated Columbus State three times during the year,

including a 76-71 win in the Peach Belt Conference tournament that was the Pirates' first-ever triumph over the Cougars in conference tournament action.

Individually, senior Robert Campbell embarked on a season-long chase for the all-time NCAA Division II steals record. Trailing Oronn Brown of Clarion by 117 coming into the 2000-2001 season, Campbell - already AASU's and the Peach Belt Conference's leader in steals - collected a career-high 113 steals to finish second by just four thefts to Brown on the all-time NCAA Division II steals chart. The two-time PBC Player of the Year, Campbell added plenty of other highlights during his career, becoming the PBC's all-time leader in assists, earning All-PBC honors three consecutive years for the first time in school history and finishing his Pirate career as the all-time leader in games played and third on the all-time point scoring chart, becoming just the third AASU player to score 1,500 career points.

Senior Greg Favors earned All-PBC honors and in just two seasons with the Pirates, ranks 10th all-time in AASU history in rebounds. Senior Tavares Brown, who holds the AASU mark for all-time games played with Campbell at 118, became the 15th player in AASU history to score 1,000 points and ended his career eight on the all-time rebounds chart.

All in all, the 2000-2001 season was one to remember for the Pirate men's basketball program !



The Peach Belt Conference



The Peach Belt Conference concludes its first decade of competition this season as the 2000-2001 athletic year marks the 10th season.

In its short history the league has established itself as one of the premiere Division II conferences in the country.

The 1999-2000 season was no exception with Lander University bringing home its eighth consecutive NCAA Division II men's tennis national championship and Kennesaw State University advancing to the NCAA Division II softball finals.

Peach Belt schools have now won 19 national championships and finished second 13 times in the past five years.

The seven charter members were

Armstrong State College, Columbus College, Francis Marion College, Georgia College, Lander College, The University of South Carolina at Aiken, and The University of South Carolina at Spartanburg. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January, 1990, then modified in the summer of 2000 with the dropping of the word 'Athletic' to its current name, the Peach Belt Conference.

Augusta College applied and was accepted in November, 1990, with the effective date of membership on July 1, 1991. Another college joined the Peach Belt on July 1, 1992, when Pembroke (N.C.) State University officially became a member. Kennesaw State University located in Marietta, GA, became the tenth full member of the conference on July 1, 1994. The league accepted its 11th member when Clayton State College, located in Morrow, GA., was accepted in June 1995.

Armstrong Atlantic State has fared very well in the Peach Belt, capturing conference championships in baseball, men's basketball, men's and women's tennis and softball. The AASU men's basketball team captured its second-ever PBC championship in 2000-2001 and last year, four AASU student-athletes were named PBC Players of the Year in their respective sports - Sarah Haynes (volleyball),

Former Augusta College basketball coach and athletic director Marvin Vanover was named the interim commissioner in April, 1990, and served in that capacity until his appointment as the conference's first full-time commissioner in July, 1991. The conference has established an office in Augusta, GA, which houses the commissioner and his staff.



With a history as long as the existence of basketball at Armstrong, the Dearing Cup has become a symbol among the Pirate faithful for dedication, preparation and execution on the basketball court. Named for longtime Savannah and Armstrong Atlantic State basketball supporter Ashley Dearing, the Dearing Cup is awarded to the AASU player with the best free throw percentage each season. Below are listed the winners of the Dearing Cup - an award that has been given each of the past 47 years.

Last year, junior Mick Jordan (right, pictured receiving the award from Ashley Dearing) captured the Dearing Cup by hitting 32 of his 37 free throws for an outstanding .865 free throw percentage. The Peach Belt Conference's active three-point shooting leader, Jordan is a 70% free throw shooter for his career at Armstrong, proving that the Sarasota, Fla., native has the right touch from anywhere on the court.


The population in Savannah is roughly 130,000 and Chatham County is the fifth most populous county in the state of Georgia.




