Armstrong Atlantic State University

Since its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 268-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System. The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to a 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 2002.

The university offers more than seventy-five academic programs and majors in the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Health Professions, College of Education and School of Computing. The academic community includes approximately 7,000 students



and more than 400 faculty members. Enrollment has nearly doubled in the last 15 years, from 3,700 students in 1990 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. Recently completed projects include the nearly 30,000 square foot Armstrong Center for Continuing Education and Community Engagement, which opened this fall; a \$5 million dollar renovation of the Lane Library; a brand new Student Recreation Facility and a 14,500 square foot Dental Hygiene clinic and Communicative Disorders Center. Campus life is abundant with Compass Point, University Crossings and University Terrace offering on-campus, two- and four-bedroom furnished apartments for 856 students.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. Construction of a women's fieldhouse for soccer and softball was completed in the spring of 2007.

AASU sponsors ten intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991. Women's soccer and women's golf debuted in 2005-06, joining men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, men's and women's tennis, men's golf and softball as sports that AASU sponsors. In 2006-07, seven of the 10 sports sponsored by AASU advanced to the NCAA Championships and for a second straight year, the Pirates captured the Peach Belt Conference's Presidential Academic Award.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and non-traditional students. Forty-three percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Thomas Z. Jones University President

Thomas Z. Jones, the sixth president to serve at Armstrong Atlantic State University, begins his seventh year at AASU. Hired on August 1, 2000, Jones was selected by the Board of Regents and University System of Georgia Chancellor Stephen R. Portch after an exhaustive national search.

Dr. Jones served on the faculty and administration at Columbus State University, as its vice president for academic affairs from 1988-2000, prior to coming to Armstrong Atlantic State. A 30-year veteran of university teaching and administration, Dr. Jones has taught at Indiana State University, Emory and Henry College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology. While at West Virginia Tech, Dr. Jones served as the Westmoreland Professor of Mining, an endowed professorship, and vice president of academic affairs.

Dr. Jones received his bachelor's degree in physics from Fairmont State College, his master of arts degree in geology from West Virginia University and his Ph.D in Geology from Miami (Ohio) University.

From 1980-1988, he owned and served as president of Technical Evaluation Consultants, Inc., a privately owned business specializing in providing science, technical and engineering services for business, industry, government agencies and the legal community.

Dr. Jones and his wife, Joyce, have two sons, Matthew and Michael.



Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher Athletic Director

Dr. Eddie Aenchbacher begins his twelfth full year as the athletic director for Armstrong Atlantic State University.

Dr. Aenchbacher's responsibilities include overseeing the entire athletic department and promoting Armstrong Atlantic State athletics in the community of Savannah.

Dr. Aenchbacher received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1979, where he was a standout student-athlete for the baseball team as a pitcher. He received his Master's degree and Doctorate of Education from the University of Georgia.

Along with his student-athlete experience at AASU, Dr. Aenchbacher also coached the Pirate cross country teams for five years and started the first AASU men's soccer team, which he coached for seven years.

During Dr. Aenchbacher's tenure as athletic director, AASU's athletic programs have had tremendous success in the classroom and on the playing field. Student-athletes at AASU have excelled in academics with 56 percent earning a 3.0 grade point average or better. The overall grade point average of AASU student-athletes is 2.97, higher than the overall institutional GPA. In 2006-07, the AASU athletic department sent seven of ten teams to the NCAA DII Championships, captured three regular season Peach Belt Conference titles and three Peach Belt Conference tournament titles, while also capturing the Peach Belt Conference Presidential Academic Award for the second straight year.

Dr. Aenchbacher has been married for 15 years to Michele and together they are the proud parents of two children, Jesse and Lainey

Dr. Donald Anderson Asst. Athletic Director / Services



Dr. Anderson's association with AASU since 1966 includes stints as an Associate Professor, Acting Head of the Department of Education, Dean for Community Services and Registrar/Director of Admissions. Dr. Anderson joined the Athletic Department in 1992 and currently assists the AD with athletic eligibility and serves as academic advisor to AASU student-athletes. He was inducted to the AASU Athletic Hall of Fame as a Citation Award winner in 1996.

Dr. Will Lynch Faculty Athletic Representative



Dr. Will Lynch begins his tenth full year as AASU's Faculty Athletic Representative. A native of northern Michigan, Dr. Lynch came to AASU in 1993 and serves as an assistant professor in the Department of Chemistry and Physics. A three-year men's basketball starter and all-conference performer at Kalamazoo College, he earned undergraduate degrees in mathematics and chemistry in 1986, then received his Doctorate from Wayne State in 1991.

Ted Evans Head Softball Coach



Ted Evans begins his fourth season as the head softball coach for the Pirates. Evans has directed the Pirates to back-to-back NCAA Championships appearance, including the 2007 South Atlantic Region final. The Andrews College graduate has nearly 30 years of coaching experience and joined the Pirates from Chattanooga State CC, where he served as the hitting and defensive instructor for the Lady Tigers. Evans also played and coached men's fastpitch softball for 19 years.

Chad Jackson Director of Sports Communications



Chad Jackson begins his ninth year at Armstrong Atlantic State as Director of Sports Communications. An active member of CoSIDA, he serves as the vice-chair of the organization's Technology committee. He graduated from the University of North Florida in 1995 with a Bachelor's Degree in history. Jackson and his wife, Melissa - who works in the Lane Library on campus - reside in Pooler.

Lynn Roberts Senior Women's Administrator



Lynn Roberts begins her eighth year as the Senior Women's Administrator for the AASU athletic department. A former women's tennis coach from 1988-1991 for the Pirates, she currently serves as an assistant professor in the Department of Health and Physical Education and also serves as the chair of AASU's Student Athlete Advisory Committee. She is married to current AASU baseball coach Joe Roberts and together the couple have two sons, Brian and Eric.

Simon Earnshaw Head Tennis Coach



Simon Earnshaw begins his ninth season as the head coach of the highly successful men's and women's tennis programs and has compiled a 203-27 overall record with the women and a 142-70 record with the men, leading the Lady Pirates to a 2005 NCAA DII National Championship and both teams to the NCAAs in each season. A graduate of Georgia College & State, Earnshaw and his wife, Nicki, have two daughters - Abigail and Ella - and a son, Luke.

Dianne Lane Athletic Secretary



A native Savannahian, Dianne Lane has been at AASU for the past nineteen years. Lane attended the University of Georgia and has been married to Ken Lane for 43 years. She has three children and six grandchildren, including two sets of twins - Tyler and Evan (11), and Parker and Dylan (8) - Bridgette (7) and Carson (3).

Joe Roberts Head Baseball Coach



Joe Roberts begins his 29th season as head baseball coach. Compiling an overall record of 1,123-524 (.683) in 28 seasons, Roberts ranks as one of the all-time winningest collegiate baseball coaches in NCAA history. A graduate of St. Andrews College, Roberts has led the Pirates to NCAA Division II regional play 12 times, three trips to the DII College World Series and 28 consecutive winning seasons.

Eric Faulconer Head Women's Soccer Coach



Eric Faulconer begins his third season as head coach of the AASU women's soccer team after leading the Pirates to an NCAA Regionals berth and the PBC Tournament Championship game in 2006. Faulconer joined the Pirates from Thomas University, where he directed the Nighthawks to a 68-44-6 record in six seasons. Faulconer graduated from Florida State in 1992 and he and his wife, Ginger, have one son, Zachary.

Jeff Burkhamer Head Men's Basketball Coach



Jeff Burkhamer begins his sixth season as head coach of the AASU men's basketball squad and has compiled a 94-56 record in his five seasons, including three NCAA appearances and 20-win seasons. Burkhamer joined the Pirates from Marshall University, where he served as associate head coach for three seasons, and is a former junior college Coach of the Year while at Santa Fe CC in Florida.

Roger Hodge Head Women's Basketball Coach



Roger Hodge begins his eighth season at the helm of the AASU women's basketball program after leading the Lady Pirates to two NCAA Championship berths, a Peach Belt Conference championship and the program's first national ranking. The 2002-03 PBC Coach of the Year, Hodge and his wife, Kristen, have two daughters; Madison (7) and Emmaline (4), and the family resides in Savannah.

Michael Butler Head Men's and Women's Golf Coach



Michael Butler enters his eighth year as head coach of the AASU men's golf team and is in his third as the head coach of the fledgling women's squad. Butler has led the men's team to the NCAAs each of the last five seasons and directed the Pirates to a runner-up finish at the 2005 DII Men's Golf Championships, held in Savannah. A Savannah native, Butler is married to the former Whitney Greg of Monroe, Ga.

Facilities / Athletic Training



The Armstrong Atlantic State University's athletic department prides itself on having one of the finest athletic facilities not only in the conference, but in the region.

AASU's Sports Center, completed in July of 1995, immediately became a top basketball complex by hosting the 1998 and 1999 Peach Belt Athletic Conference basketball tournaments.

This 82,000-square-foot multi-purpose building provides expanded academic offerings in spacious, modern surroundings. Students have a three-station computer lab, a 1,965-square-foot weight training/fitness center with 21 Cybex machine exercise stations and a free weight area; four new classrooms, and two 3,535-square-foot activity areas.

AASU's athletic teams play home events in a 4,000-seat arena that contains theater-type seating for all spectators, and also plays host to a wide variety of social and sporting events.

Directly behind the Armstrong Sports Center sits the home fields for the baseball and softball teams.

Pirate Field seats 750 fans for the Armstrong Atlantic State University's highly successful baseball program. Generally regarded as one of the best playing surfaces in the conference, Pirate Field has seen the baseball squad advance to 10 NCAA



regionals over the past 15 seasons.

To the west of Pirate Field sits the AASU Softball Complex, home to the Pirate softball squad, while the AASU Soccer Field, the home of AASU soccer, lies to the north. The AASU Women's Fieldhouse for Soccer and Softball was completed in January of 2007.

The **Aquatics and Recreation Center** serves as the host of the AASU volleyball squad. The 1,000 seat arena has been upgraded with new lighting and air conditioning fixtures and is the sole volleyball-only facility in the Peach Belt Conference.

AASU Athletic Training

AASU's training room, part of the Armstrong Sports Center, sits adjacent to the fitness center and across the hall from the Pirate locker rooms. The room offers the most modern and advanced equipment to help players deal with injuries and rehabilitation.

Dr. Wheeler and Hinely are aided by assistant trainer Jessica Miller and two graduate assistant trainers, Adam Gustafson and Wendy Darwin.

Strength & Conditioning

The AASU volleyball team also benefits from a fine strength and conditioning program, headed by Olympic Weightlifting champion Team Savannah's head coach, Henry Meyers.

As the strength and conditioning coach of the volleyball squad, Meyers has been integral to the team's fitness and strength for the past two seasons.

Meyers, a native of Savannah and a graduate of Jenkins HS in 1989, was named the 2000 USOC Coach of the Year for Weightlifting as five of Team Savannah's lifters represented the United States in the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney. Three more represented the United States in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens.

Myers, 36, is married to Michelle Powell-Meyers.

Head Coach Alan Segal

Alan Segal Head Volleyball Coach

Alan Segal begins his ninth season as head coach of the Armstrong Atlantic State University volleyball squad after leading the Pirates to back-to-back Peach Belt Conference regular season titles, the first two league volleyball titles in school history.

A three-time Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year, Segal and the Pirates finished the 2006 season with a 20-15 overall record, captured the regular season league title and advanced to the PBC Tournament championship match for the eighth straight year. AASU also had its first CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree in senior Traci Knuth, the two-time Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year, and the squad earned the AVCA Team Academic Award for the first time in program history as the Pirates compiled a 3.43 overall team GPA.

In eight seasons, Segal has compiled a 217-84 overall record at AASU and has a 257-116 overall head coaching record in 10 seasons.

In his first season as the Pirates' head coach, Segal directed the Pirates to 29 consecutive victories to start the season and finished the year with a school-record 36 wins.

Segal also directed a 23 and a half-game turnaround from a team that finished 8-24 the year before, the best single-season turnaround in the NCAA that season.

Segal's second season at AASU saw the Pirates achieve their first AVCA Division II national ranking (No. 24) and advance to their first NCAA Division II National Championship appearance. AASU won its first post-season match, 3-1 over USC Spartanburg, and also had one of its players earn AVCA All-Region honors for the first time in school history in middle hitter Sarah Haynes.

The Pirates matched their 29-10 record in Segal's third season and made their second-straight trip to the NCAAs, while the 2002 season saw AASU capture its first Peach Belt Conference tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAAs. In 2003, AASU overcame a 1-5 start to finish the 2003 season with a 22-14 record, the fifth straight year of 20 or more wins for AASU - with a team that included no seniors. The Pirates made another NCAA appearance in 2004, then captured the school's first-ever regular season Peach Belt title in 2005.

Prior to joining the AASU coaching ranks, Segal coached for two years at Michigan Tech, where he led the Huskies to a 40-32 record over two seasons and a No. 23 national ranking at the end of the 1997 season. Before his inaugural collegiate head coaching position, Segal was an assistant coach at Florida Southern from 1994-96, where the Mocs twice advanced to NCAA Tournament play.

Segal has also accumulated coaching experience as head girls' volleyball coach at Agoura High School (1989-92), where he led the team to the Division 3A finals in the California Interscholastic Federation in 1989; assistant men's coach for Pierce Junior College in Woodland Hills, Calif. (1989-91); assistant women's coach at Western Illinois University in Macomb, Ill. (1988-89); assistant women's coach at Delta Junior College in Stockton, Calif. (1983-84); assistant women's coach at Cosummes River College in Sacramento, Calif. (1982); and assistant girls' coach at Cordova High School in Rancho Cordova, Calif. (1980).

Segal is a 1982 graduate of California State University at Sacramento, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in recreation administration. An active member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, Segal is on the 40-member coaches panel that determines the AVCA Division II Top 25 each week. Segal is also a veteran volleyball official. He officiated the National Junior College Championships in both 1994 and 1995 and for the past twelve years has been one of the top-rated officials on the AVP Professional Beach Tour. Born March 16, 1959, Segal is single and resides in Savannah, Ga.

Jenni Holste begins her fourth season as Armstrong Atlantic State's assistant volleyball coach for the 2007 season.

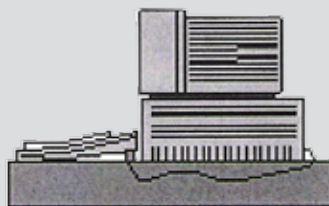
For the past three years, Holste has helped the Pirates to a 71-35 record, two Peach Belt Conference regular season titles and an NCAA Championships berth.

“New Look” Pirates Head Into 2007 With Eye On A Third Straight Peach Belt Conference Title

The Armstrong Atlantic State volleyball squad heads into the 2007 season looking for a three-peat, as the Pirates have earned Peach Belt Conference regular season titles each of the last two seasons. A vastly different roster, however, will have to try and accomplish the feat after the Pirates graduated eight seniors and lost nine players overall from last season’s squad that finished with a 20-15 overall record and a 10-2 mark in the Peach Belt.

The cupboard isn’t entirely bare for the Pirates, however, as five returnees join nine newcomers to make up the 2007 edition of the AASU volleyball squad.

Senior rightside hitter Rindy Vidovich leads the returnees after an All-PBC junior season. The San Pedro, Calif., native was named to the 2007 PBC Preseason All-Conference team and her versatility means that she could also see time at middle hitter this year.

Two other seniors join Vidovich in wrapping up their four-year careers at AASU as outside hitter Stacia McCoy and middle hitter Kassi Kixmiller also return to lead the Pirates. McCoy has been one of the steadiest defensive players in her four seasons, while Kixmiller will be asked to fill the void of the Pirates’ departing middle hitters, much like she did last year in the last home weekend when she started three matches in place of injured Traci Knuth.

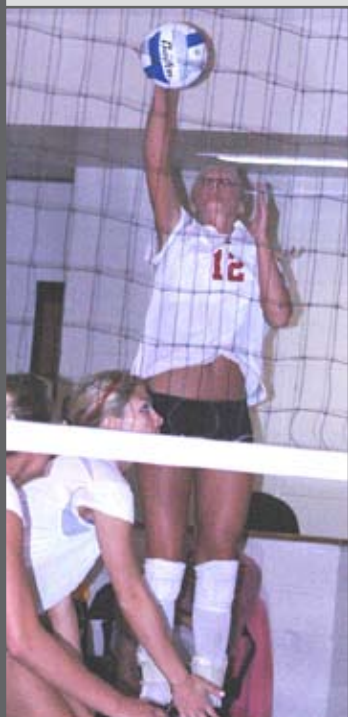
Also returning for the Pirates are sophomores Nicole Yates and Gwen Clarke. Yates played extensively last year as AASU’s primary defensive specialist, while Clarke saw time at outside hitter and will be asked to step up and compete for a starting spot this season.

Replacing two of the top blocking middles in the PBC in Knuth and Leah Schmiedge will be a tall task, but the Pirates have a trio of newcomers who will attempt to do just that. German native Antje Reuleke (5-10, Jr., Magdeburg, Germany) brings international experience to the Pirates from her club team SV Padagogik Schonebeck, while Allyson Ray (6-0, Jr., Hudson, Fla.) comes from Pasco Hernando CC, where she was an honorable mention All-Conference honoree as a sophomore. Freshman Leah Kettelson (5-11, Fr., Wray, Colo.) was a two-time All-State honoree for Wray HS and will also be in the mix.

AASU will also have to replace both setters from a year ago and have a pair of newcomers ready to step in. Alabama A&M transfer Kara Jerden (5-11, Jr., Bloomington, Ind.) was a two-time All-SWAC performer for the Bulldogs, while freshman Hannah Segebart (5-7, Fr., Littleton, Colo.) earned honorable mention All-Conference honors for Chatfield Senior HS.

Two more freshmen round out the incoming class as lefthanded Sarah Schwanz (5-11, Fr., Eagan, Minn.) and Brendyce Budd (5-9, Fr., Page, Ariz.) will each compete for time on the right side. Schwanz comes from the same hometown as Pirate senior Stacia McCoy.

A new regional configuration for NCAA Division II coming up in 2008, means that the Pirates’ schedule has undergone a dramatic change in preparation for the switch. AASU will play in five tournaments this season, including hosting the Chatham Orthopedics Volleyball Classic in September, and will get a taste of early season action in Memphis and Alaska on a 12-day season opening trip. A 10-game Peach Belt slate as well as non-conference matches with West Georgia, Flagler, Tusculum and St. Andrews round out the schedule.

Pirates Successfully Defend Peach Belt Conference Regular Season Title In 2006

The Armstrong Atlantic State volleyball squad successfully defended its Peach Belt Conference regular season crown, earning the 2006 championship and advancing to the PBC Tournament championship game for the eighth straight year.

A senior-laden team for head coach Alan Segal won 20 matches for the eighth straight season as well, paced by two-time Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year Traci Knuth.

Knuth finished her AASU career as the Pirates' all-time leader in kills (1,409) and blocks (536) while also earning ESPN: The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, the first female student-athlete in AASU history to be named a CoSIDA Academic All-American. The Nebraskan ranks among the Pirates' top 10 in eight separate career categories; in addition to blocks and kills, she also ranks second in games played (377), fourth in digs (1,169), fourth in blocks per game (1.09), fifth in kills per game (2.86), fifth in hitting percentage (.278) and ninth in service aces (130).

Senior outside hitter Christina Flores set the AASU all-time digs record with 1,541 before suffering a season-ending injury in October and also finished seventh on the AASU all-time kill chart with 933. Senior middle hitter Leah Schmiedge again ranked as one of the league's top blockers, ranking third in the PBC with 1.14 per game. Her two-year career blocking average of 1.17 ranks as the second best in AASU history.

Along with Knuth and Flores, senior rightside hitter Lauren Good completed a four-year career in which she collected 522 kills and 252 blocks. Seniors Nikki Ciapponi, Rachel Falco and Stacy Yates also completed their two-year careers as Pirates - Yates teamed again ably with Margaret Thornton to average 12.48 assists per game, third-best in the league.

Representing the underclassmen, junior rightside hitter Rindy Vidovich enjoyed a strong season, earning All-PBC and All-PBC Tournament honors.

As a team, the Pirates ranked second in the league and 29th in NCAA DII in blocking, averaging 2.60 per game, while also ranking second in the league and 56th nationally in digs per game with 18.64. AASU set a new single-season digs record as well, notching 2,385 during the season.

In the eight seasons that head coach Alan Segal has directed the Pirates, AASU has finished no lower than second in the Peach Belt Conference standings and has compiled a composite 90-18 Peach Belt Conference record and a 217-84 overall record.

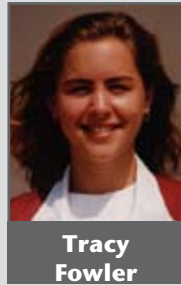

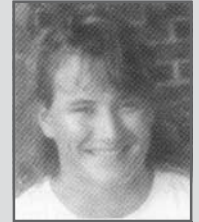

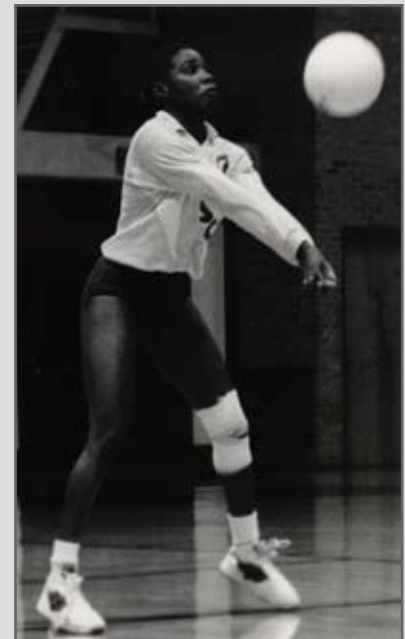

This Is Savannah

mon. Also, Savannah hosted the yachting events of the 1996 Summer Olympics and most recently served as the media home for the G-8 Summit. As a result, tourism has become one of the leading industries in the area.

Savannah hosts over six million tourists each year. Tourism impacts the Savannah area by more than \$634 million. The city boasts over 7,000 rooms and more than 100 restaurants as folks have learned that Savannah is more than just a convenient rest stop on the interstate to Florida.

The climate of Savannah features warm, and sometimes hot, weather for most of the year. There are seven months in which the average temperature is 70 degrees or higher. The lowest average high is in January at 60.3 degrees.

The population in Savannah is roughly 130,000 and Chatham County is the fifth most populous county in the state of Georgia.

Savannah also sits centrally located to some of the Southeast's finest beaches. Tybee Island, located less than 30 minutes from Armstrong Atlantic State's campus, offers six miles of unspoiled sands, tempting seafood and gracious accommodations. Resort areas such as Hilton Head, South Carolina, are less than one hour away and provide even more relaxing getaway options. Whether it's the lure of historic settings, the friendliness of a Southern community or the beautiful climate of southeast Georgia, Savannah is the place for you.

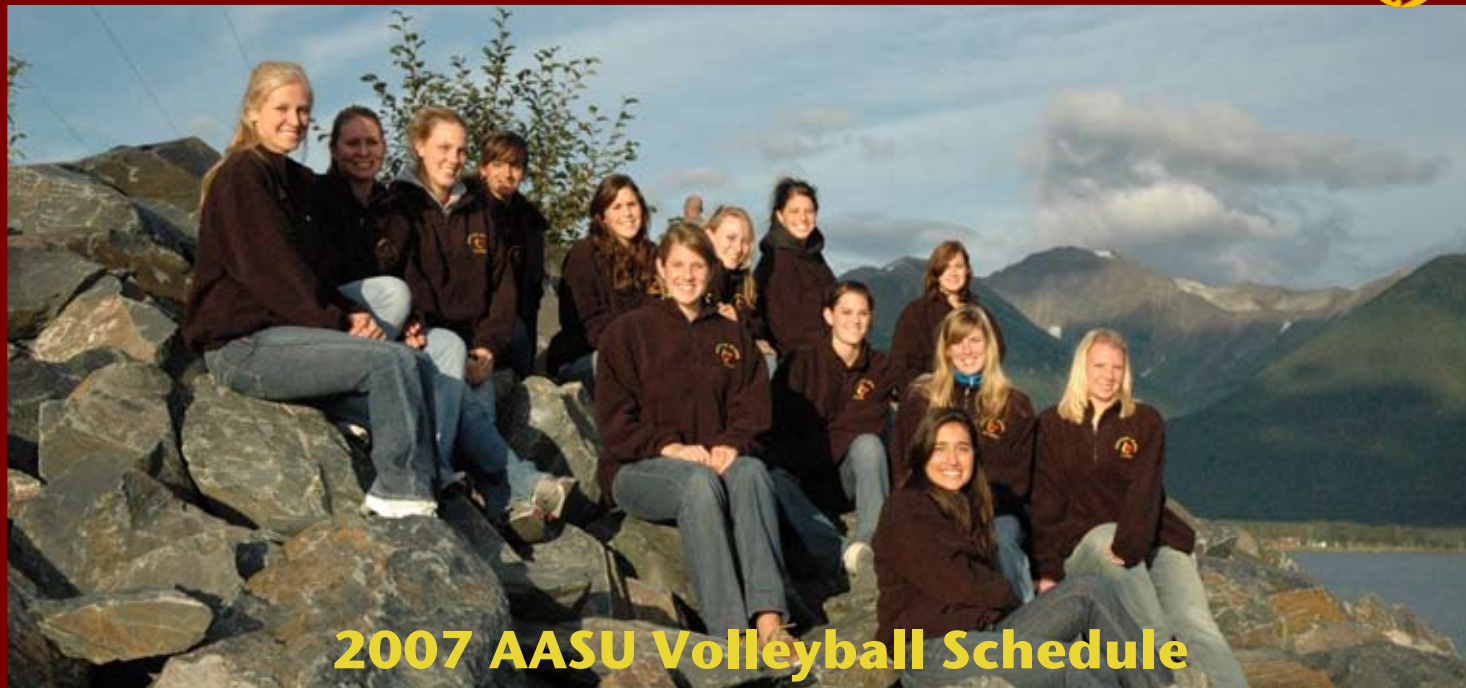
