Georgia General Assembly Legislative Session Begins

As many of you may know, the Georgia General Assembly 2014 legislative session began on Monday, January 13th. There are several budget requests for the University System of Georgia that may impact Georgia Southern University. If approved, the requests would:

- Provide \$1,014,809 to restore funds for a retired payback project at Georgia Southern University.
- Include \$11.4 million to fund merit pay and employee recruitment and retention salary adjustments. The increase would provide the basis for a salary increase pool with awards based on merit. The proposed funding represents the first salary increase since fiscal year (FY) 2009.
- Provide \$60 million for Major Repair and Renovation (MRR) projects.
- Provide \$9.5 million to fund the construction of a Military Science Building at
