2004 Diamond Classic



Although rains washed out one of the three days of the 2003 Diamond Classic, there was enough thrilling baseball packed into the other two days to make fans of the revamped tournament enjoy the second installation.

Preseason No. 1 Georgia Tech, Michigan and Rider joined AASU in the 2003 Diamond Classic and the Yellowjackets wasted no time in flexing their muscle, defeating Rider in the opening game of the Classic on Friday afternoon, 8-1. The host Pirates then made a second successful opening by knocking off Michigan, 11-4, thanks to a seven-run eighth inning that snapped a 4-4 tie.

After weather forced the cancellation of one game on Saturday, fans were treated to a tripleheader on the Classic's final day. Michigan blasted Rider, 15-1, then engaged topranked Georgia Tech in a thriller that went down to the wire - literally - as Georgia Tech won in the bottom of the ninth inning after the Wolverines had tied up the game, 6-6, in the top of the ninth. GT shortstop Tyler Greene rapped a one-out single to give the Yellowjackets the victory.

The final game of the Classic pitted two undefeated teams in AASU and Georgia Tech, but the Yellowjackets proved to be too much for the host Pirates, using a five-run fifth inning to break open a close contest and close out the Classic with a 12-4 win.

All in all, Georgia Tech, Michigan and Rider added their names to the impressive list of teams that have now taken part in the Classic in its 15-year odyssey. Georgia Southern, Wake Forest, Georgia, Liberty and others made up the first field back in 1989 and since then, the Citadel, Kentucky, North Carolina State, North Carolina, Vanderbilt and other top Division I schools have taken the field.

The 2004 edition of the Diamond Classic has a distinct Division II feel as two teams who were No. 1 seeds in their respective NCAA regionals last season join AASU for five games over three days at Pirate Field.

Florida Southern College, led by head coach Pete Meyer, comes to Savannah as DII's all-time winningest team and makes its first appearance in the area since 1988. The Mocs, eighttime NCAA Division II champions and owners of 34 NCAA postseason bids in 36 seasons, are preseason ranked No. 4 in the Collegiate

Baseball Top 40.

Missouri-St. Louis, led by head coach Jim Brady, also journeys to Savannah for the first-time since 1992, bringing a program that has experienced its own postseason success, earning 13 NCAA DII postseason bids and five trips to the College World Series. Both teams are ranked in the NCAA Division II Preseason Top 10.

These three schools have combined to place several players into the major league ranks, including active major leaguers Adam Bernero (AASU), Brett Tomko (Fla. Southern), Lance Niekro (Fla. Southern) and Carlos Reves (Fla. Southern). So of course all of the teams will feel right at home in Savannah with the future Major League talent that has graced the Classic's history. Last year, the Classic field generated 10 picks in the 2003 MLB First-Year Player Draft. highlighted by first-round pick Matt Murton of Georgia Tech, selected by the Boston Red Sox with the 32nd

overall selection. Several former major league players have also came through Savannah in the Classic's previous history, including Georgia's Dave Fleming, Kentucky's Rod Bolton, Larry Luebbers, William VanLandingham and Mark Thompson, Georgia Southern's Joey Hamilton and Todd Greene, The Citadel's Tim Jones, Mercer's Mike and Mark Mimbs, NC State's Corev Lee, Adam Everett and Andy Barkett and Wake Forest's Kevin Jarvis.

Plans are already in place to make the 2005 Classic tournament just as memorable as Kansas, Oregon State and Virginia Tech are committed to come to the Coastal Empire for the tournament. The Jayhawks went 35-28 and swept LSU in three games on the road in 2003, while Virginia Tech went 34-23 in its final year in the Big East Conference - the Hokies join the ACC for 2004. Oregon State, meanwhile, missed the 2002 NCAA tournament by one game in 2002.

The Peach Belt

The Peach Belt Conference is arguably the best - or certainly among the very best - NCAA Division II baseball leagues in the nation. Traditionally, the PBC has several World Series candidates every year.

Since 1993, the PBC has sent six different clubs to Montgomery to play in the NCAA DII World Series; Armstrong Atlantic State, Columbus State, Kennesaw State, Georgia College & State, North Florida and USC Aiken. Since 1984, PBC clubs have made it to 23 World Series, with 6 NAIA World Series appearances and 17 NCAA DII World Series appearances by PBC members in the past 18 years and three national titles since 1994!

In 1999, UNF (No. 5) won the PBC with eight losses while KSU (No. 2), CSU (No. 17) and Armstrong (No. 10) all ended up with nine losses. Lander (No. 24) and GC&SU (No. 30) also were ranked. In 2000, UNF (No. 3) ran away with the PBC title, but a tight race for second saw GC&SU (No. 6) and CSU (No. 24) tie and KSU (No. 17) finish one game back. Armstrong (No. 25) was also ranked. In 2001, UNF (No. 3) won again with KSU (No. 6) edging GC&SU (No. 10) for second by a game. AASU (No. 15) and Lander (No. 18) tied for third, two games back, and CSU (No. 22) was also ranked. 2002 saw Columbus State capture the NCAA Championship despite finishing third in the league, as Kennesaw State (No. 5) won the league crown and North Florida (No. 10) finished second. GC&SU (No. 14) and USC Aiken (No. 20) also finished the season ranked nationally. In 2003, AASU (No. 9) and UNF (No. 5) tied for the league title with FMU (No. 8) one game back. KSU (No. 3) finished 4th, two games out, but got into the regional, won it and finished 3rd at the World Series. It was the second straight year a PBC team finished higher in at the Series than they did in the PBC and the PBC has finished in the top 3 of the Series every year since 1995.

It appears that 2004 will again be a banner year in the PBC with eight teams in the preseason rankings - UNF (No. 3), KSU (No. 4), AASU (No. 8), FMU (No. 15), GC&SU (No. 17), CSU (No. 22), ASU (No. 34) and USCA (No. 40).

The 2004 Schedule

Once again, AASU will play a demanding NCAA Division II slate with 21 of their PBC games vs. Top 40 clubs and 36 games overall will be against Top 40 teams! Also, the Pirates will have another nine games against teams that received votes for the Top 40, meaning that 45 of their 56 games will be against Top 40 teams or were receiving votes as Top 40 teams.

The Pirates are hosting their 17th annual Savannah Invitational with the 2003 defending national champions from Central Missouri State (No. 1). Northwest Missouri State (No. 29), Kutztown (No. 36), Wayne State (No. 37), SIUE (RV), Southern Connecticut (RV) and Wisconsin-Parskide (RV) are among the 2004 entrants.

AASU has a number of new opponents on the 2004 schedule. Defending national champion Central Missouri State (No. 1) faces AASU for the first time since the 1994 World Series, seven-time national champion Florida Southern (No. 4) plays AASU for the first time since the 1988 Series, Missouri-St. Louis (No. 10) plays the Pirates for the first time since 1992.

2004 Season Outlook



AASU has twelve teams on its schedule that have been to the NCAA DII World Series since 1993 in North Florida, GC&SU, Kennesaw State, Columbus State, USC Aiken, Valdosta State, SIU Edwardsville, Kutztown, Missouri-St. Louis, Rockhurst, Florida Southern and Central Missouri State.

As always, the PBC schedule determines post-season opportunities. The five road series are at Augusta State (No. 34), Lander (RV), Francis Marion (No. 15), 2002 National Champion Columbus State (No. 22) and USC Aiken (No. 40). Home series in 2004 are with Kennesaw State (No. 4), North Florida (No. 3), USC Spartanburg, GC&SU (No. 17) and UNC Pembroke.

Pirate Overview

Armstrong Atlantic State is working hard to post an above-average baseball season this spring. The "average" baseball season at AASU since 1983 is a 43-17 record with probable post-season contention. AASU is one of only eight NCAA Division II teams to play in 10 of the past 16 regionals and the Pirates are the second winningest NCAA DII team since 1983.

Head coach Joe Roberts has 13 new faces on his versatile 22-man roster this spring. AASU is ranked 8th nationally and the Pirates have finished in the Top 25 in 12 of the last 16 years. AASU expects to post its 25th consecutive winning season and hopes that the 13 versatile new recruits can contribute and help the nine returnees play itself into contention in the powerful Peach Belt Conference and for another South Atlantic Regional berth this spring. A position-by-position nutshell follows:

Pitching

Pitching coach Calvain Culberson has had 10 pro signees from his staff in the past six years and yet he has his deepest and most talented staff entering the 2004 season. Last year he rebuilt a staff returning only two relievers into a staff that was No. 2 nationally in team ERA (2.71) and carried AASU into a PBC co-championship and a No. 9 final national ranking. This year AASU returns an All-America starter, two outstanding late-inning relievers, two lefty relievers and one emergency arm to go along with five outstanding recruits who will fill three of the four starting slots and add quality depth to the staff.

Senior Jon Dobyns (RHP, 6-2, 210) headlines the returnees as a first-team All-America and the South Atlantic Region pitcher of the year. Dobyns went 12-2, 3.07 with 106 strikeouts in 105 innings and

Georgia Tech was his only loss until the regionals. Senior Zach Shelnutt headlines the returnees in the bullpen. The fourth-year closer was 4-0, 0.91, 5 saves last year and he is 9-2, 2.31, 13 saves in three years at AASU with 95 strikeouts in 97 innings over 59 career appearances.

Three talented newcomers will fill the starting slots along with Dobyns. Marcus Barriger (RHP, 6-1, 205) from Kaskaskia JC (Ill.) and Thomas Ferrara (RHP, 6-5, 235) from St. Petersburg JC (Fla.) are a pair of very talented transfers who have both been previously drafted and should be solid weekend starters this spring. Leon Boyd (RHP, 6-6, 210) from Seminole JC (Okla.) is slated to be the new weekday starter this spring for AASU.

The Pirates have a pair of pitchers who could fill any role. Sophomore Brett Hart (RHP, 5-10, 160) returns after an outstanding freshman year at 3-2, 1.32, 2 saves with 35 strikeouts and only 36 hits and 11 walks in 41 innings pitched. He is a solid emergency infielder as well. Junior transfer Josh Tallent (RHP, 6-3, 200) is a talented newcomer who could fit in any spot well on the staff as both of these pitchers give AASU a lot of quality depth and options this year.

Traditionally, AASU is lacking southpaws, especially those who can come in and get out left-handed hitters. In 2004, the Pirates have <u>three</u> solid southpaw relievers. Senior George Fletcher (LHP-UTIL, 6-1, 215) is a middle-order starting DH who was used sparingly last year at 0-1, 2.38, with 16 strikeouts and only seven hits and one walk allowed in 11 innings. Junior newcomer

Chad Grass (LHP, 6-0, 175) from Wabash Valley CC (Ill.) will be an excellent situational southpaw. Junior southpaw Jon Troop (LHP, 6-0, 200) was AASU's most effective hurler a year ago in the fall but redshirted because of surgery after a solid start. He was 0-0, 1.74, 2 saves with nine strikeouts and only nine hits and one walk in 10 innings before surgery. He had the No. 6 ERA in the state of California junior colleges two years ago and he could become a very key guy for AASU. Senior Brian Dice (CF-RHP, 6-2, 175) is the starting CF and is an emergency only staff member this year.

Catching

The Pirates' past five catchers have signed pro contracts after junior Stacy Bennett (NY Mets, 14th round) and junior Andrew Graham (Detroit, 19th round) were junior first-day draftees last year. The streak can continue this year as gifted freshman Sean Hotzak (C-INF, 6-2, 180) is a draft-eligible freshman with excellent defensive skills. He was listed as the No. 15 Canadian pro prospect last spring. Australian senior Michael Pelley (1B-C, 6-2, 200) is a converted player with an excellent throwing arm and improving skills. Senior Kyle Maddux (C-OF, 6-2, 235) is another converted player with excellent size and improving skills.

First Base

Australian senior Michael Pelley (1B-C, 6-2, 200) is a solid defensive player, team leader and situational hitter who hit .306 last year for AASU. Junior college transfer Steven Kinney (INF-OF, 5-11,

180) is a capable sophomore hitter and defender who should get playing time here when Pelley catches. Senior George Fletcher and Sean Hotzak are the emergency depth here.

Second Base

Canadian transfer Rob Recuenco (2B-SS, 5-10, 170) was a part-time starting SS at Oregon State University in the Pac-10 last year. A lefty hitter, the junior could become a key performer offensively and defensively this season at AASU. He and Adam Pelley should become AASU's best-ever middle infield combination. Steven Kinney and pitcher Brett Hart provide the depth at second base.

Shortstop

Australian transfer Adam Pelley (SS, 6-0, 160) comes from Clarendon JC (Texas) where he was selected All-Conference for hitting .434 with 17 doubles and 64 RBI. He is a key player both offensively and defensively for the Pirates and he and Rob Recuenco should become AASU's best-ever middle infield combination. Freshman catcher Sean Hotzak, Recuenco or pitcher Brett Hart can all go to short defensively to provide depth.

Third Base

Replacing the departed MVP, drafted junior Stacy Bennett (3B/C) remains the main lineup question going into the season. Junior college teammates Steven Kinney and Dustin Thomas (INF, 6-2, 190) are the primary candidates. Kinney, a lefty hitter, could see action at possibly six different positions while Thomas is a third baseman. Kinney had the better fall while Thomas hit .380 last spring and was an all-league JuCo player.

Outfield

Returning senior starters Brian Dice (OF, 6-2, 175) and Brandon McKinnon (OF, 6-0, 225) will lead a solid outfield corps. Dice, a late-season starter, led the team at .377 with quality offense and defense. McKinnon is capable of the big play on offense, defense or the bases just

like Dice. They will trade spots defensively with Dice to center and McKinnon to left.

Brandon Nunez (OF, 5-10, 185) is a junior college transfer from Oxnard CC (Calif.) where he was a second-team All-Conference selection last year. He is a solid all-around player who should start in right. Two local area freshman outfielders are Kyle Craven (OF, 5-8, 155) from local power Savannah Christian and Heath Simmons (OF, 5-7, 145), a lefty from Emanuel County Institute. Both are capable backups with above average wheels. Steven Kinney, George Fletcher and Kyle Maddux also provide solid offensive possibilities as outfield depth.


Designated Hitter

Versatile senior George Fletcher (UTIL-LHP, 6-1, 215) is the primary option here after hitting .332 with 13 doubles, six homers and 44 RBI last year as a middle-of-the-order hitter. Kyle Maddux (C-OF, 6-2, 235) is the primary backup who has tremendous power and hit .268 with five doubles and three dingers in 56 at-bats a year ago.

Coaches' Comments

"We should have our best club in terms of having both quality pitching with depth and a very solid defensive squad behind it. Our pitching and defense should put us in position to have a chance to win each time out," Coach Roberts said.

2003 Season Review

The Pirates captured its third Peach Belt Conference title in 2003, going 20-10 in league play and 36-15 overall, sharing the crown with North Florida and advancing to its first NCAA Championships berth since 1999.

AASU won 18 of its first 19 games in 2003, with its only loss during the stretch coming to Georgia Tech, and ascended to No. 3 in the NCAA Division II rankings. The Pirates would remain in the Top 10 for the rest of the season as AASU won 20 PBC games for the first time in school history in winning its first league crown since 1993.

The strength of the Pirates' squad in 2003 was a pitching staff that ranked second in the country in team ERA (2.71) and boasted two All-PBC and All-region starters in Jon Dobyns and Jeremy Olson. Dobyns was the South Atlantic Region Pitcher of the Year and AASU's first first-team All-America pitcher since 1992, going 12-2 with a 3.07 ERA and tying the school record for wins in a season. Olson went 10-4 with a 2.96 ERA and gave the Pirates two 10-game winners in the same season for the first time since 1987.

Junior Stacy Bennett earned All-PBC Utility honors for hitting a team-best .339 with six home runs and 47 RBIs while playing both third base and catcher.

Three seniors also excelled for AASU in their final seasons -Olson and the Pirates' middle infielders, shortstop Chris Boaen and second baseman Adam Brandenburg. Boaen finished his four-year

career ranking in the top 10 in five offensive categories, becoming just the fourth player in AASU history to record 200+ career hits (213) and hitting .323 for his career. Brandenburg hit .310 in his two-year career and got hit by 31 pitches, one off of the all-time AASU record. He was also selected to the Verizon Academic All-District III team as selected by CoSIDA.

The MLB First-Year Player Draft claimed two players from the Pirates as Bennett was selected in the 14th round (pick 409) by the New York Mets, while junior catcher Andrew Graham was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 19th round (pick 550), continuing the Pirates' streak of having a player from each team advance sign professionally for the 22nd straight season.

Joe Roberts begins his 25th season at the helm of Armstrong Atlantic State. While at AASU, Roberts has posted an overall 981-442 (.689) record and has established a winning tradition that has resulted in 24 consecutive winning seasons. During his career, Roberts' teams have been consistently ranked among the nation's elite, including a streak of 110 straight weeks in the NCAA Division II Poll, covering seven full seasons. Roberts also currently serves as the DII National Poll Chairman for baseball, the ABCA Coaches' Association President and a member of the ABCA Executive Committee

The 1988, 1989 and 1994 Pirate squads advanced to the NCAA Division II World Series, and the 1990 team was ranked No. 1 in the country for the entire season.

As impressive as Roberts' teams have been on the field, they've been just as impressive in the classroom, with 94 graduates in the past 18 years alone.

Roberts was a four sport letterman at Lebanon (Ind.) HS before attending Lake Sumter CC in Leesburg, Fla. He finished his collegiate career at St. Andrews College in Laurinburg, N.C., where he was again a four sport letterman and a basketball standout, setting several school, conference and NCAA records during a two year career that saw him named All-Conference twice. He was selected the Dixie Conference MVP in his junior year of 1974 and was inducted into the St. Andrews Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

The Lebanon, Ind., native is married to the former Lynn Tucker of Port Wentworth. The couple have two sons, Brian, 14, and Eric, 13.

Calvain Culberson Assistant Baseball Coach

Calvain Culberson will be in his ninth season as a full-time assistant coach at AASU, after completing an eight-year professional baseball career. Calvain is no stranger to Armstrong Atlantic, having played for the Pirates from 1985-1988, and having assisted coach Roberts in a part-time role during his professional career.

Calvain's coaching role at AASU includes working with the outfielders and pitchers, and assisting with baserunning and hitting instruction.

While working with AASU's pitchers, Culberson has instructed several players who have, like him, enjoyed professional success. Current Colorado Rockie pitcher Adam Bernero, who Culberson coached during the 1999 season, reached the major leagues in just 15 months, becoming AASU's first major league player. Another Culberson pupil, Doug Sessions, was a AAA All-Star for the New Orleans Zephyrs in 2003 while pitching in the Houston Astros organization.

Culberson finished his pro career in 1995 at Pawtucket, a triple-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. He had joined the Red Sox organization as a free agent after having pitched at Double-A Chattanooga and Triple A Indianapolis in the Cincinnati Reds farm chain. Calvain began his pro career in 1989 in the Atlanta Braves farm system, hitting .313 in his first season, then continuing as a pitcher.

During Culberson's AASU career, the Pirates posted an overall 181-66 (.733) record, with Calvain hitting in the leadoff spot his final three years. The Rome, Georgia native holds seven school records with the most notable being his 32-game hitting streak (1988) and his 128 career stolen bases.

Calvain was an all-Big South Conference selection in 1986 and 1987 when AASU was playing NCAA I baseball. In his last season with the Pirates he was an AASU co-captain and was chosen as a member of the all-South Atlantic Region team and an honorable mention DII All-American.

Calvain is married to the former Pamela Johnson of Port Wentworth, an AASU graduate, who works as a System Analyst II for AASU. The couple have a five-year old son, Matthew, and a one-year old son, Brandon







For a second-straight season, the Pirates ranked among the top drawing NCAA Division II teams in both total and average attendance per game. AASU, who led the nation in total attendance in 2002 with 14,516 total fans coming to watch the Pirates, drew 7,886 fans for its 25 home dates, including the 2003 Memorial Health Diamond Classic in which more than 4,000 people visited Historic Grayson Stadium in midtown Savannah to watch AASU, Michigan, Rider and Georgia Tech play.

The 7,886 total fans were the third-most in NCAA Division II behind only North Florida (8,503) and Valdosta State (7,936).

The Pirates averaged 315 fans per date, sixth-best in NCAA Division II behind Mesa State (397), Cal State Chico (358), Delta State (337), St. Anselm (331) and Valdosta State (317).

The Pirates will have 32 home dates in 2004, including the 2004 Diamond Classic at Historic Grayson Stadium, which this year features three teams ranked in the Top 10 in NCAA Division II - AASU, Florida Southern and Missouri-St. Louis.

3,115 fans watched the Pirates defeat the University of Georgia, 7-6, in 11 innings at the 2002 Memorial Health Diamond Classic on February 24, 2002.






Chad Armstrong (2000)

The only player to have his number retired (#13), Charlie concluded a four-year career in 1987 with 25 school records and still is the Pirates' all-time leader in career hits, runs scored and runs batted in.


Tommy Cannon (2000)

A four-year standout for the Pirates from 1981-84, Yeomans was a career .325 hitter who still holds six hitting records at AASU, including most games played and at-bats.

Adam Bernero: AASU's First Major Leaguer

dam Bernero continues to make strides in his ascent from former Armstrong Atlantic State staff ace to Detroit Tiger prospect and now, Colorado Rockie Major Leaguer.

The 2003 season saw
Bernero begin the year in the
Detroit Tiger starting rotation,
where he made 17 starts
before the All-Star break,
going 1-12 with a 6.08 ERA,
but receiving the worst run
support in the majors, getting
only 2.50 runs per game. At
the break, he was traded
straight up for Ben Petrick, a
catcher-outfielder for
Colorado, and pitched in 31
games out of the bullpen.

going 0-2 with a 5.23 ERA and giving up just 33 hits in 32.2 innings pitched. The Rockies feel he will be an important part of the 2004 bullpen.

The previous year, Bernero reversed his fortunes from an injury-plagued 2001 season, making his first nine starts at Toledo and compiling a 2-2 record with a 1.58 ERA, earning a promotion to the Tigers and an immediate insertion into the starting rotation.

On a hot spring day in New Comiskey Park on May 26, Bernero baffled the White Sox for eight innings, allowing just four hits and two runs in picking up his first major league victory in only his fifth career start.

On June 20th, Adam made his first professional start in the state of Georgia since leaving AASU at Turner Field. Again, Bernero was up to the task, allowing five hits and one run in eight innings, striking out four and walking none in a game that Atlanta would win in the bottom of the ninth, 3-2. Still, the message to the rest of



baseball had been sent - Adam Bernero was here to stay.

Bernero's meteoric rise to the majors took just 14 months after signing with Detroit following the 1999 NCAA DII Regional in Jacksonville, Fla.

His major league debut came on August 1, 2000, as he pitched 5.2 innings at Anaheim, in front of dozens of friends and family for the San Jose, Calif., native. Bernero held the Angels to five hits and two runs while striking out five, including the game's leadoff hitter, Darin Erstad. Adam made four starts for the Tigers and pitched in 12 games overall in 2000, then after spending most of

the 2001 season in AAA Toledo following a shoulder injury, Bernero made it back into the bigs for five games of action in September.

Bernero has continued the AASU tradition of success in the professional ranks, including 23 players advancing to the next level of baseball in the past six seasons.

Savannah and Tybee Island

Savannah also sits centrally located to some of the southeast's finest beaches. Tybee Island, located less than 30 minutes from Armstrong



The Peach Belt Conference



ince its inception in 1991, the Peach Belt Conference has worked tirelessly to become one of the elite conferences in NCAA Division II. Now entering its 13th season with 18 national championships and 16 national finalists, the PBC has accomplished that goal.

Starting with only two championships in 1991, in men's and women's basketball, the conference has expanded to 12 championship sports with the addition of women's soccer in the fall of 2000.

The conference traces its roots back to November of 1988 when 11 schools first met in Greenville, S.C. to form a Division II conference. Following a second meeting on Dec. 3, 1989, five of those 11 schools, plus two others, formed the Peach Belt and began play in 1991.

The Peach Belt was less than a year old before capturing a national championship. The Columbus State golf team took the honor by winning the 1992 national crown, the first of three golf championships the Cougars own.

The PBC has seen continued success in all sports with national rankings and multiple NCAA appearances in every sport last season, including a national championship for the Columbus State

baseball team and a national championship finals appearance by the Armstrong Atlantic State women's tennis team.

The seven charter members of the conference were Armstrong Atlantic State University, Columbus State University, Francis Marion University, Georgia College & State University, Lander University, USC Aiken and USC Spartanburg. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January of 1990 and modified to Peach Belt Conference in May of 2000.

Augusta State joined the conference in 1991 and UNC Pembroke became the ninth member on July 1, 1992. They were followed by Kennesaw State University on July 1, 1994, Clayton College & State University on July 1, 1995 and the University of North Florida on July 1, 1997, to bring the current membership to 12 institutions

Former Augusta State basketball coach and athletic director Marvin Vanover was named the interim commissioner in April, 1990, and served in that capacity until his appointment as the conference's first full-time commissioner in July of 1991. He established the conference office in Augusta, Ga., which houses the commissioner and his staff.

Dr. Thomas Hallman, president of the University of South Carolina at Aiken, is the president of the Peach Belt in 2003-04.

The conference currently holds championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women. They are men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, baseball, softball and men's golf.
