

Schmidt, Lady Pirates Building a Solid

The Armstrong Atlantic State women's basketball team was picked to finish eighth in the Peach Belt Conference in head coach Matt Schmidt's first season with the Lady Pirates last year.

When the dust cleared at the end of the season, however, the Lady Pirates finished the campaign tied for third in the Peach Belt standings, compiling a 17-11 overall record and a 12-8 mark in the league.

Losing All-Conference performer Lacey Willis, however, has once again led to soft expectations for the Lady Pirates in 2009-10 as AASU has been voted to finish eighth for a second consecutive season by the league's head coaches.

Despite the successful first season at AASU, coach Schmidt is quick to preach patience as the Lady Pirates are looking to construct a program that will be built for sustained success, not only in the Peach Belt

but in the regional and national scene as well.

> The Lady Pirates return six players from last season's squad, while adding eight newcomers in coach Schmidt's first full fledged recruiting class to AASU for the 2009-10 campaign.

A trio of seniors lead this year's Lady Pirate squad, with two of the three seniors pictures of patience and perseverance that coach Schmidt likes to talk about. Senior guard/ forward **Dartayvia Thomas** (5-8, Sr., Augusta, Ga.) first came to AASU as a walk-on guard, but now is the team leader after averaging a career-high 10.0 points and 6.2 rebounds a game as a junior last season. Thomas also led the Peach Belt and set a new AASU school record by hitting 82.5 percent of her free throws.

Senior shooting guard **Portia Jones** (5-5, Sr., Savannah, Ga.) also began her Lady Pirate career as a walk-on and last year aver-

aged 7.6 points per

game, ranking 15th in the PBC in three-point baskets made.

The third senior is shooting guard **Lauren Hall** (5-5, Sr., Detroit, Mich.), who averaged 4.7 points per game in her first year as a Lady Pirate after transferring in from Mesa CC in Arizona.

These three players are capable of replacing the 2/3rds of AASU's scoring it lost from last season, but further help will come from several talented newcomers to the Lady Pirates.

Sophomore guard/forward **Brooke Long** (5-10, Soph., Richmond, Va.) is a capable scorer who played her freshman year at Longwood University, where she averaged 6.5 points per game in 21 contests for the Lancers. She'll be joined in the frontcourt by junior **Arpine Amirkhanyan** (5-11, Jr., Van Nuys, Calif.), who averaged 9.6 points and 6.6 rebounds per game as a sophomore at Arizona Western JC, ranking ninth in the ACCAC in rebounding.

A pair of freshman from the Atlanta area will also see plenty of time right away for coach Schmidt and the Lady Pirates. Point guard **Jazmin Walker** (5-7, Fr., Lawrenceville, Ga.) will have first crack at replacing the departed Ashley Duhart for AASU's starting

while her high school teammate Marissa Rimbert (6-0, Fr., Suwanee, Ga.) will provide good minutes in the post. Both players come from an outstanding Collins Hill HS program that also produced former Lady Pirate four-year standout Jasmine Herron. Sophomore Lindsey Hill (6-1, Soph., Weatherford, Texas) will also have an opportunity to play significant minutes after appearing

in 21 games as a freshman for AASU, averaging 2.1 points and 1.6 rebounds per game.

The Lady Pirates' other two returnees are local products who will provide good experience - point guard Mallory Mitchell (5-5., Soph., Savannah, Ga.) played in 25 games as a freshman, while redshirt sophomore Jenea Boni (5-9, Soph., Bluffton, Ga.) saw action in 15 contests last season.

The other newcomers for coach Schmidt include freshman forward Ashley Slade (5-10, Fr., Buckley, Mich.), who unfortunately suffered an injury in preseason and will miss the 2009-10 campaign; guard/forward Brittany Reddy (5-8, Fr., Strongsville, Ohio), who is the all-time leading scorer in Strongsville HS girls basketball history; freshman guard Briana McFarland (5-6, Fr., Dallas, Ga.) and freshman guard Mason Moreland (5-1, Fr., Fort Valley, Ga.).

The schedule for coach Schmidt and the Lady Pirates not only includes several tough non-conference opponents but a change in the Peach Belt schedule as well. With the addition of two new schools to the conference - Montevallo and Flagler - the Peach Belt will be split up into East and West divisions for the first time. The Eastern division features home-and-home contests against Augusta State, USC Aiken, Lander, Francis Marion, UNC Pembroke and Flagler.

The non-conference slate features three games against Sunshine State Conference foes - Barry, Nova Southeastern and SSC co-champion Tampa; two region games against Conference Carolinas foes Pfeiffer and Limestone, as well as contests against Newberry, Edward Waters and Allen.

2008-09 Southeast Region champion Clayton State has been picked to finish first in the aforementioned preseason poll of the league's coaches. Regular season champion Francis Marion has been picked to finish second, followed by 2008-09 PBC Tournament champion Lander. Columbus State and GCSU were each picked to finish fourth, followed by USC Aiken and UNC Pembroke. Following the Lady Pirates' pick to finish eighth comes North Georgia, Georgia Southwestern, Montevallo, Augusta State and Flagler. The Lady Pirates open the 2009-10 season on Sunday, November 15, with a 5:30 p.m. contest at Limestone.

Head Coach Matt Schmidt



Matt Schmidt Head Women's Basketball Coach

Matt Schmidt begins his second season as the head women's basketball coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University.

In his first season as a collegiate head coach, Schmidt led the Lady Pirates to a third-place finish in the Peach Belt Conference and a 17-11 overall record, including a 12-8 mark in the league. The Lady Pirates continued their streak of defeating at least one nationally-ranked team each season, stretching that streak to nine straight years with wins over No. 7-ranked USC Aiken and No. 7-ranked Francis Marion.

Schmidt joined AASU last year from Northern Kentucky, where he served as an assistant coach from 2004-08. He was instrumental in helping the Norse achieve its second NCAA Division II National Championship a season ago as Northern Kentucky went 28-8 and defeated South Dakota 63-58, in the national championship game.



During his four seasons with the Norse, he assisted head coach Nancy Winstel in all aspects of the Northern Kentucky program, including recruiting, scouting, practice and game-day

coaching, and helped the Norse to a 92-32 record during that span.

A native of Johnstown, Pa., Schmidt spent three seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Findlay prior to joining the Northern Kentucky coaching staff. He also previously served as an assistant coach at both West Virginia University and the University of Maryland-Baltimore County.

Schmidt took over an AASU women's basketball program that went 20-11 in 2007-08 and advanced to the 2008 Peach Belt Conference Championship game, the third title game appearance in Lady Pirate basketball history.

Schmidt played basketball at West Liberty State College in West Virginia, where he graduated in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education. He earned his master's degree in physical education from West Virginia University in 2000.

Schmidt and his wife, Brittany, were married in May of 2009 and reside in Savannah. Brittany is also a part of the AASU athletic department, serving as an assistant to the AD for Marketing and Promotions.

Karmen Graham Assistant Coach

Karmen Graham joins the Armstrong Atlantic State women's basketball coaching staff as head coach Matt Schmidt's assistant for the 2009-10 season.

Graham comes to AASU from Ashland University, where she served as a graduate assistant during the 2008-09 season. While at Ashland, she coordinated film exchange, conducted individual workouts and was involved with recruiting for the Lady Eagles, who went 17-11 overall and 13-9 in the GLIAC.

A graduate of Northern Kentucky University with her bachelor's degree in education, Graham was a four-year standout for the Norsewomen, helping lead NKU to three NCAA Championships appearances. A Kodak/WBCA Division II Honorable Mention All-American honoree in 2005-06, Graham finished her career as the 19th leading scorer in NKU

history, as well as ranking in the top 10 in free throw percentage (3rd) and field goal percentage (7th).

While at NKU, Graham assisted with head coach Nancy Winstel's individual and team camps all four years. After graduating, she served as an assistant varsity coach at Highlands HS in Fort Thomas, Ky., for the 2007-08 season prior to joining the Ashland staff.

A native of Kettering, Ohio, Graham played high school ball at Kettering Fairmont HS and was a two-time All-Conference honoree.

Nicole Chiodi Graduate Assistant Coach

Nicole Chiodi joins the Armstrong Atlantic State women's basketball coaching staff as a graduate assistant coach for the 2009-10 season.

Nicole played collegiate basketball for four years for then-assistant coach Matt Schmidt at Northern Kentucky University. She was the starting point guard for the 2008 National Championship Norse, where she led the team in assists, steals and was second on the team in rebounding. Chiodi also set a Norse all time record for minutes played in a season. She graduated in 2008 from NKU with her bachelor's degree in radio and television.

A native of Highland Heights, Kentucky, Nicole played high school basketball at Newport Central Catholic High School, where she set the all time scoring record with 2,124 career points, as well as setting all-time records in assists and steals.

The daughter of Susan and Tony Chiodi, Nicole has one sister, Maria, and one brother-in-law, Jeff. She is currently pursuing her master's degree in education from AASU and resides in Savannah.

Armstrong Atlantic State University

Since its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 268-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System. The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to a 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 2002.

The university offers more than seventy-five academic programs and majors in the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Health Professions, College of Education and School of Computing. The academic community includes approximately 7,000 students and more than 400 faculty members. Enrollment has nearly doubled





in the last 15 years, from 3,700 students in 1990 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. Recently completed projects include the nearly 30,000 square foot Armstrong Center for Continuing Education and Community Engagement; a \$5 million dollar renovation of the Lane Library; a brand new Student Recreation Facility and a 14,500 square foot Dental Hygiene clinic and Communicative Disorders Center. Campus life is abundant with three on-campus housing complexes, plus Windward Commons as well as a new \$16 million, 60,180 square-foot Student Union both coming online in 2010.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. Construction of a women's fieldhouse for soccer and softball was completed in the spring of 2007 and renovations to Pirate Field, home of AASU baseball, will be finished in fall 2009.

AASU sponsors eleven intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991. Men's cross country was reinstated in 2009 with women's soccer and women's golf debuting in 2005-06, joining men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, men's and women's tennis, men's golf and softball as sports that AASU sponsors. In 2008-09, the AASU men's and women's tennis teams each captured NCAA Division II National Championships for a second straight season.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and non-traditional students. Forty-three percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.



AASU Administration

Dr. Linda M. Bleicken University President

Dr. Linda M. Bleicken joins AASU after serving at Georgia Southern for 19 years. She becomes the seventh AASU president and the first woman to lead the institution since the establishment of Armstrong Junior College in 1935.

A woman with deep roots in Iowa farm country, Bleicken began her career at Georgia Southern as an assistant professor of management in 1990. Over the following years she would serve as acting chair of the department of management, associate dean of the College of Business Administration, vice president for student affairs, acting provost and vice president for academic affairs and lastly provost, a position she held since 2005.

A marketing major from Georgia State University who graduated magna cum laude, Bleicken's experiences in the business arena include a foray into real estate in Atlanta as owner and manager of residential properties and serving as a sales representative for Innerface International. She also spent two years in marketing research for BellSouth and Brittain Associates, both in Atlanta.



It was her experiences in marketing research that led her back to higher education. In 1987, she chose to continue her education in a university campus, this time as a teaching instructor at her alma mater, Georgia State University. Three years later she earned her academic credentials, a master's and Ph.D. in management, once again from Georgia State.

A long-time resident of Savannah—she commuted to Georgia Southern all those years—Bleicken knows and cares deeply about Savannah and the Coastal Georgia region. She has served on the Ossabaw Island Foundation Board since 2007 and been involved with the Savannah Downtown Neighborhood Association.

Andy Carter Athletic Director

Andy Carter begins his first year as the Athletic Director at Armstrong Atlantic State University for the 2009-10 season.

Carter was hired on April 8, 2008, by University President Dr. Thomas Z. Jones after an exhaustive national search.

Carter joins the Pirates from Newberry College, where he served as since 2002. In that time, he increased the visibility and success of the Newberry athletic department both on and off the competitive playing field. Newberry has won four of the past five South Atlantic Conference academic titles, while also leading 14 teams to NCAA Championships appearances after the school had collected just one in the previous 11 seasons.

He developed the "Newberry College Athletic Initiative" upon arriving at the Newberry, S.C., campus, a long-term plan to improve Newberry's athletic program while maintaining the school's excellent academic record. Other highlights include the beginning of an intercollegiate wrestling program that finished second in NCAA Division II



in 2009; SAC Championships for football in 2006 and 2008, as well as SAC titles in women's basketball and men's golf. Prior to Newberry, Carter served as the Director of Athletics at Missouri Baptist University in St. Louis, Mo., from 1997 through 2002. He served as the baseball coach from 1991 through 1999, leading the team to seven straight conference titles.

Carter received his bachelor's of science degree in business administration from Missouri Baptist in 1987, then earned his MBA from Lindenwood University in 1990. He and his wife, Rena, have six children – Aaron (21), Becca (19), Beth (16), Jake (14), Rachel (13) and Micah (8).

The Armstrong Atlantic State University's athletic department prides itself on having one of the finest athletic facilities not only in the conference, but in the region as well.

AASU's Sports Center, completed in July of 1995, immediately became a top basketball complex by hosting the 1998 and 1999 Peach Belt Conference basketball tournaments.

This 82,000 square foot multipurpose building provides expanded academic offerings in spacious, modern surroundings. Students have a three-station computer lab; a 1,965 square foot weight training/fitness



center with more than 30 Cybex machine exercise stations, stair climbers, treadmills, upright and semi-recumbent bike, elliptical trainer and a free weight area; four new classrooms and two 3,535 square foot activity areas.

AASU's athletic teams play home events in a 4,000 seat arena that contains theatre-type seating for all spectators, and also plays host to a wide variety of social and sporting events.

2008-09 Season Review

When new AASU head coach Matt Schmidt took over the helm of the Lady Pirate basketball program in September of 2008, expectations were not high as AASU was picked to finish eighth in a preseason poll of the league's coaches.

The Lady Pirates far exceeded expectations in 2008-09, however, finishing tied for third in the Peach Belt Conference standings with a 12-8 league mark, as well as a 17-11 overall record. Pirates tied for third in the Peach

Schmidt and the Lady Pirates also kept a streak alive of knocking off at least one nationally-ranked opponent each season, stretching that streak to nine straight years with two wins over Top 10-ranked foes during the 2008-09 campaign.

AASU hosted No. 7-ranked USC Aiken on December 6 and picked off the Lady Pacers, winning 63-55, extending a streak of at least one nationally-ranked opponent beaten in each season

since 2000-01. The Lady Pirates didn't stop there, however, picking up perhaps their best road win in the Peach Belt Conference era with a 92-91 overtime win at No. 7 Francis Marion on February 25.



Senior Lacey Willis was a four-time PBC Player of the Week as a senior and finished her four-year career ranked among the AASU top 10 in games played, points scored and rebounds.

Senior Lacey Willis capped off a stellar AASU career with an outstanding season, earning PBC Player of the Week honors four times, while also earning All-PBC honors and Daktronics All-Southeast Region accolades, despite playing most of the spring with a broken right (shooting) hand.

She became just the 10th player in AASU history to record 1,000 career points and finished her career ranked among the top 10 in games played (114), points (1,240), rebounds (597), field goals made (485) and free throws made (257).

Senior center Kelly Versluis set a single-season record for blocked shots with 59, ranking third in the PBC and 28th in NCAA DII, while also setting the career record in just two seasons with 101 blocked shots, AASU's first player to record 100+ career blocks. Senior shooting guard Lindsey Holmes finished her career with 159 three-pointers,

third-most all-time, while senior point guard Ashley Duhart finished her career with 210 assists, eighth all-time.

The Lady Pirates also excelled in free throw shooting in 2008-09, as not only did junior Dartayvia Thomas set a

single-season AASU record in that category (82.5 percent, 94-114), but the Lady Pirates as a team hit 72.9 percent, setting a team singleseason record and ranking second in the PBC.

The Lady Pirates also ranked fourth in the league in blocked shots per game (3.50), 67th in NCAA Division II, while also ranking fourth in the league in opponents' field goal percentage (.292), which ranked 49th in NCAA Division II.

Head coach Matt Schmidt and the Lady Pirates finished tied for third in the PBC standings after being picked to finish eighth in the preseason.

AASU's third-place finish in the PBC standings was its highest since 2003-04

on July 1, 1994, Clayton State University on July 1, 1995 and the University of North Florida on July 1, 1997. Kennesaw State and North Florida departed for the Division I ranks in 2005, USC Upstate did the same in 2007, and the conference welcomed in North Georgia College & State University in 2005 and Georgia Southwestern State University in 2006.

For 2009-10, the Peach Belt has grown once again with the addition of the University of Montevallo and Flagler College, giving the PBC 13 members, the most the league has ever had - returning the league into Florida and adding a school in Alabama for the first time.

David Brunk was named the second PBC commissioner in May of 2007. Brunk replaced Marvin Vanover, who was the first PBC commissioner from 1991 to 2007.

Brunk is charged with continuing the strong growth of the conference as its second era begins.

Dr. David Potter, president of North Georgia College & State University, returns as the president of the Peach Belt in 2009-10. The conference currently holds championships in 13 sports, six for men and seven for women. They are men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, baseball, softball and men's and women's golf.

Now entering its 20th year of existence in 2009-10, the Peach Belt Conference has become one of the elite Division II conferences in the nation. Since its inception in 1990-91, the Peach Belt has developed a consistent history of excellence which continues to this day with 28 national championships and 25 national finalist

Starting with only two championships in 1991, in men's and women's basketball, the conference has expanded to 13 championship sports with the addition of women's golf in the fall of 2009.

The conference traces its roots back to November of 1988 when 11 schools first met in Greenville, S.C. to form a Division II conference. Following a second meeting on Dec. 3, 1989, five of those 11 schools, plus two others, formed the Peach Belt and begin play in fall 1990.

The Peach Belt was less than a year old before capturing a national championship. The Columbus State golf team took the honor by winning the 1992 national crown, the first of three golf championships the Cougars own. One year later, the Lander men's tennis team began their record-breaking run of eight straight national titles, the first PBC dynasty. Since then, USCA men's golf has won three straight national titles from 2004-06 while AASU women's tennis has captured four titles overall.

The 2008-09 season was among the conference's most memorable. The Armstrong Atlantic State men's and women's tennis teams both won their respective national championships – for the second year in a row; a feat only done once before in college tennis. In addition, the Augusta State men's basketball team became the first conference program to make back-to-back trips to the NCAA Elite Eight, Armstrong Atlantic became the first PBC volleyball team ever to advance to the Elite Eight and the North Georgia softball team was ranked #1 in the nation and reached the World Series.

The seven charter members of the conference were Armstrong Atlantic State University, Columbus State University, Francis Marion University, Georgia College & State University, Lander University, USC Aiken and USC Upstate. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January of 1990 and modified to Peach Belt Conference in May of 2000. Augusta State joined the conference in 1991 and UNC Pembroke became the ninth member on July 1, 1992. They were followed by Kennesaw State University



This Is Savannah



Tybee Island, located less than 30 minutes from Armstrong Atlantic State's campus, offers six miles of unspoiled sands, tempting seafood and gracious accommodations. Resort areas such as Hilton Head, South Carolina, are less than one hour away and provide even more relaxing getaway options.
