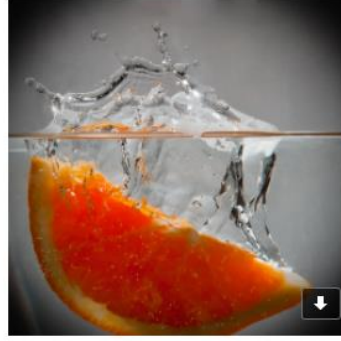
Holi Festival Photo Story
