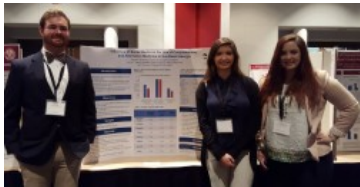

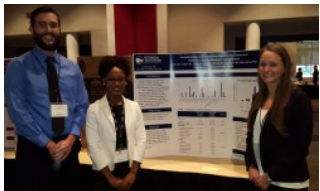
Georgia Southern Students Receive Awards from Rural Health Conference
