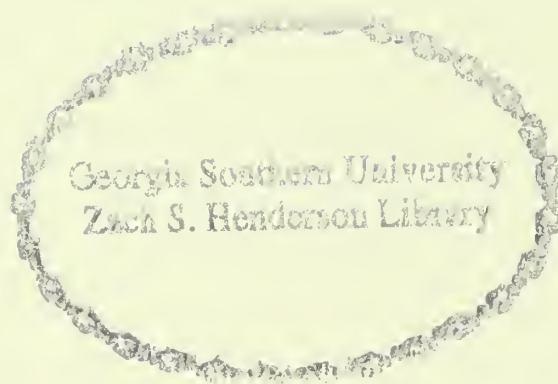

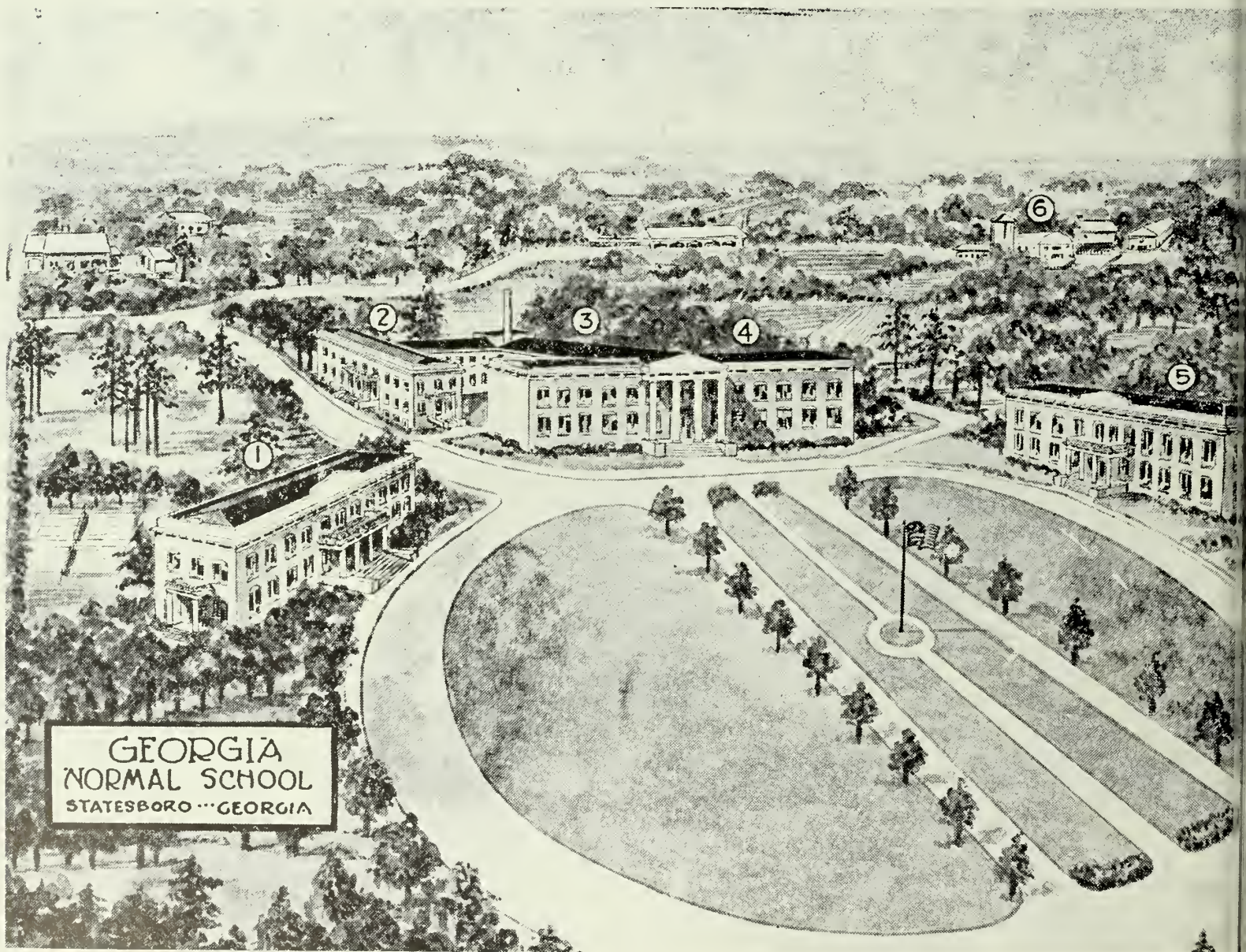


Zach S. Henderson —

The Man and the College

Zach Suddath Henderson—a man caught up in and dedicated to a vision of the importance of education and the future of an institution, and yet, a man with the activism, the capacity for leadership, to make the vision of progress a reality . . . this is the man who, in his twenty years as president, has brought Georgia Southern College from a small teachers college to a full-fledged institution of higher learning. His retirement this year, after forty years of service as an administrator, marks the end of an era—an era of progress and phenomenal growth—and the beginning of a new era of advancement and continued improvement.

When Henderson became Dean of Georgia Normal School in 1927, only the normal diploma in education was offered, and the physical facilities of the school were limited to the three original buildings of the 1908 campus, the Administration Building and East and West Halls, plus Anderson Hall, an annex to the Ad building. Henderson's twenty years as Dean were years of growth for the man as well as the college. During these years the school's name was changed to South Georgia Teachers College and authority given to confer the B. S. degree in education; as student enrollment increased, buildings were added. It was also during these formative years that Henderson, working under four presidents, gained much of the insight and experience which was to make him such an able and effective leader.









Henderson was named President of the college in 1948 by the Board of Regents, succeeding Judson C. Ward, who had served one year following the retirement of Dr. Marvin S. Pittman, and Paul S. Carroll was appointed Dean. In 1948 there were twelve buildings on the campus and an enrollment of 724. The first half of the Marvin Pittman laborator school was in use, and around it centered most of the academic activity of the college, for the preparation of teachers for Georgia schools was still the main objective of the college. Under Henderson's leadership Georgia Teachers College came to be recognized as one of the top teacher education schools in the state; but President Henderson's vision and insight led him to seek to expand and broaden the program of the college. Pursuing this goal, he obtained approval of the Board of Regents for an A. B. degree program in history and English in 1955, launching the college on its way to becoming a liberal arts college. The mid-fifties brought a general surge of growth as the enrollment of the college increased rapidly and new buildings were added. In 1959, the name was changed again, this time to Georgia Southern College.





Henderson's intense determination to expand and improve Georgia Southern College led him to seek out friendships and associations within circles of influence and power. He promoted Georgia Southern everywhere he went, among educators, legislators, the state Board of Regents, and the public, and through his ability and activity built up an immense personal prestige and influence. His personal friendships with Georgia governors through the years and with other influential people are in large measure the key to President Henderson's success in leading the progress of the college.









Though always active in educational affairs and in promoting the college throughout the state and beyond, as well as constantly busy discussing and planning with the administration and faculty of the college, President Henderson took an active and interested part in the campus life of the college, for he was interested primarily in the students and concerned that he should remain in contact with students. He actively participated in the traditions and spirit of the college and was concerned that these traditions and this spirit be preserved.





The result of the capacity for progressive leadership, the dedication, the insight, and the hard work of Zach Henderson—in short, the effect of the man on the college—is evident in the steady growth by giant steps over the twenty years of his presidency. The surge which began in the mid-fifties has today blossomed into a complete, multi-purpose academic program offering five undergraduate degrees in some thirty major fields, and four graduate degree programs in sixteen fields, plus a six-year program in education in seven fields.



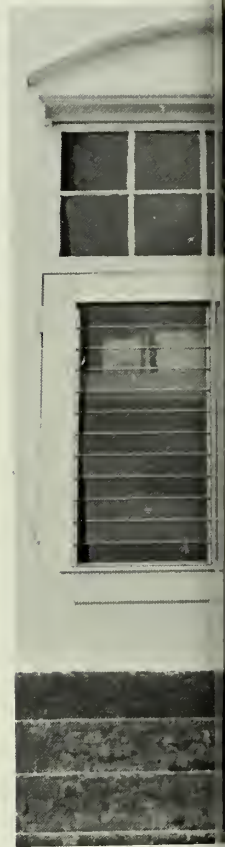


The effect of the man is evident in the burgeoning campus of today, with over four thousand students and thirty-two buildings, and in the far-sighted and carefully planned comprehensive development program which President Henderson initiated and which is already underway with construction on the Hanner Gym annex and the first phase of the science building complex.

Georgia Southern—the college today—stands as a tribute, as a concrete indication of the vision, ability and strength of the man—Zach Suddath Henderson.









Through the twenty years of Zach Henderson's presidency, he has had at his side a capable administrator, and able assistant, a valuable advisor—a man who shared his vision of progress and played a vital role in the realization of this vision. This man was Dean Paul F. Carroll. Carroll was appointed as Dean of the College in the same year that Henderson became president, and has retired this year along with Henderson.

Much of the progress of the college in the academic realm is due to his efforts and abilities in working with the faculty to expand existing programs and set up new programs, and provide the personnel for them. Dean Carroll is largely responsible for maintaining a consistent policy of academic freedom of individual professors, an element of vital importance to the development of a strong, progressive college. In the overall story of the growth and progress of Georgia Southern, Dean Carroll's influence has contributed much of lasting value.

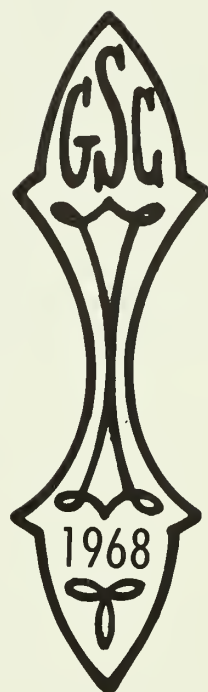
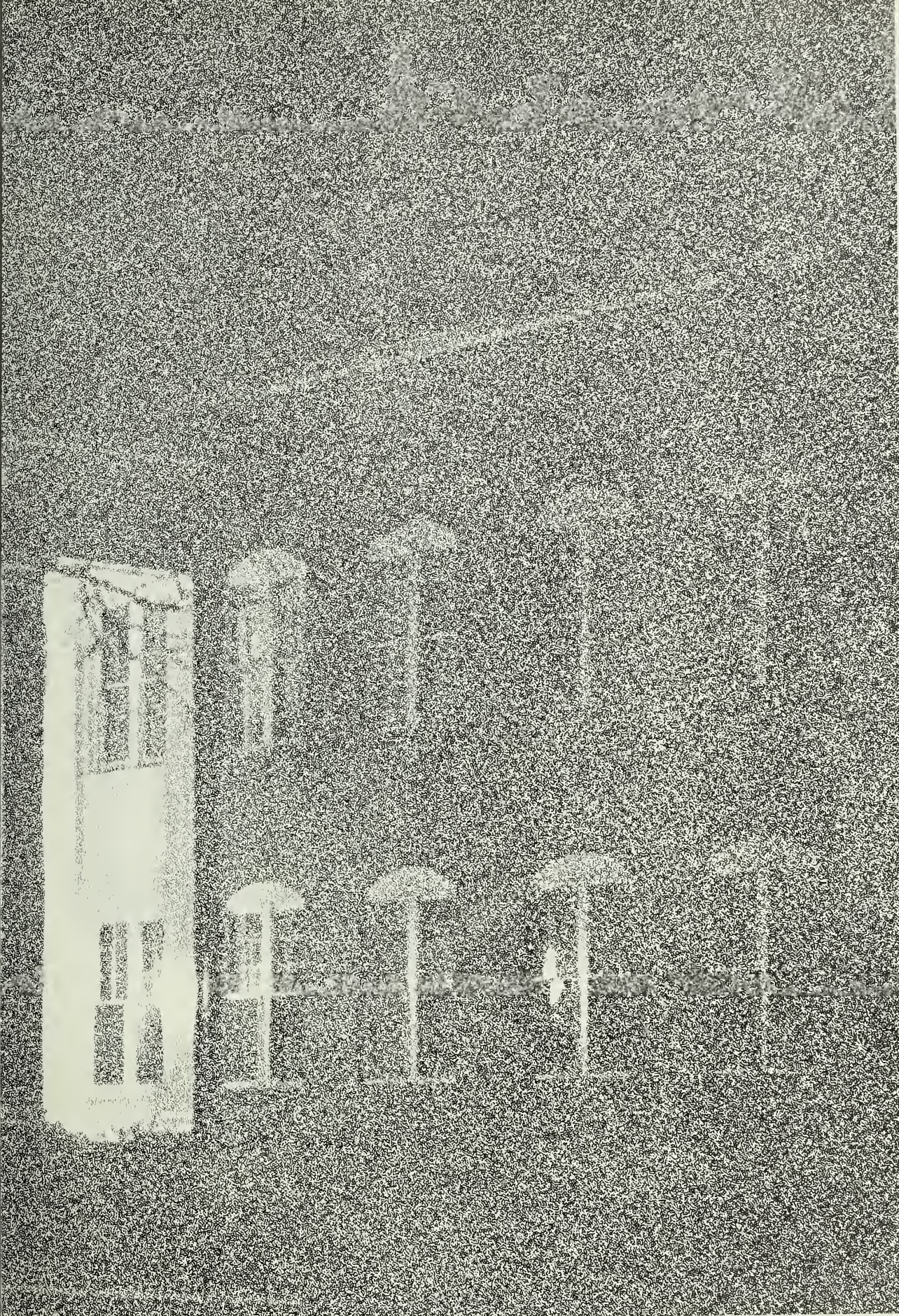

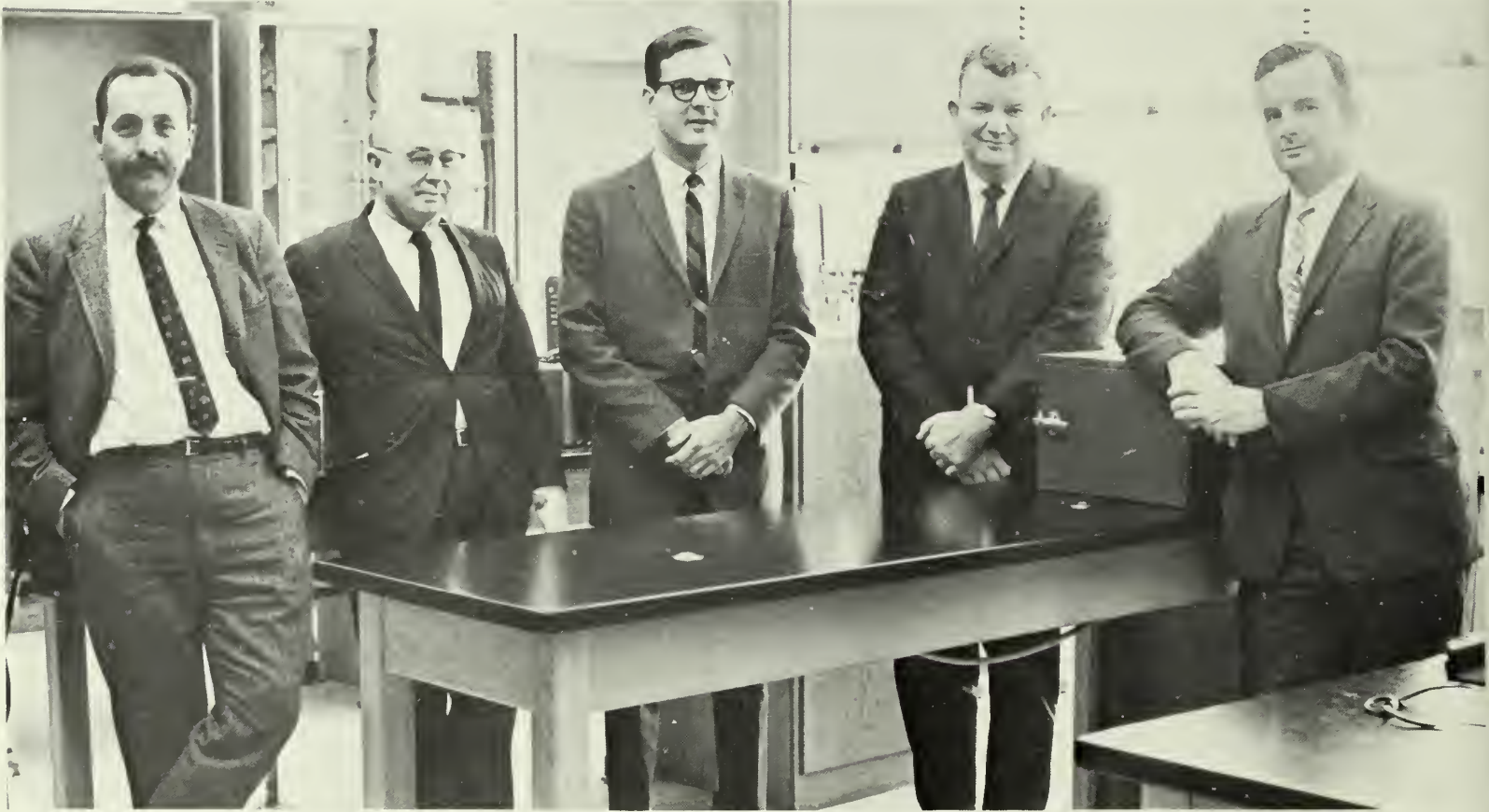


Division of Science and Mathematics

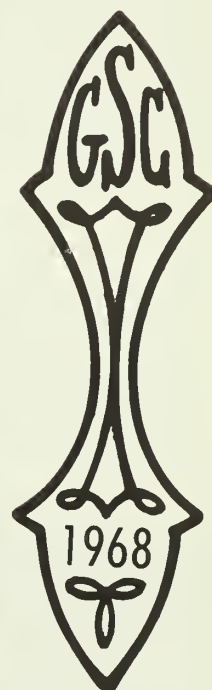

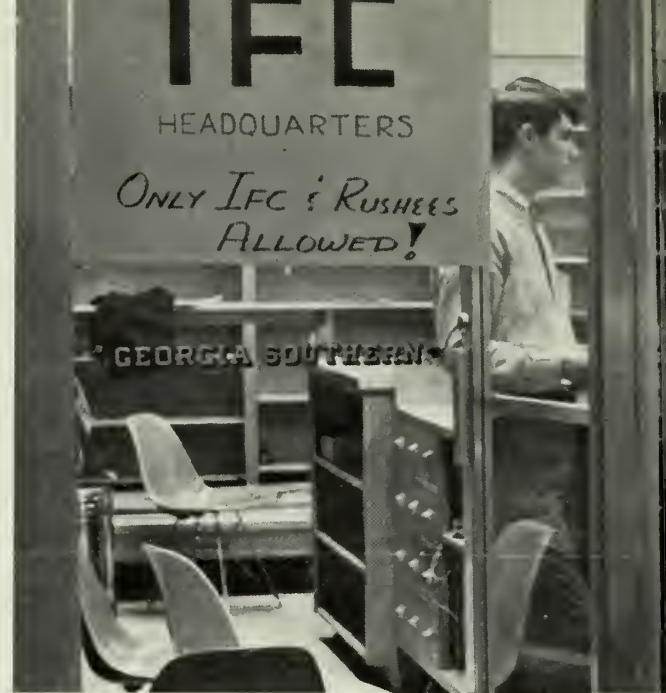


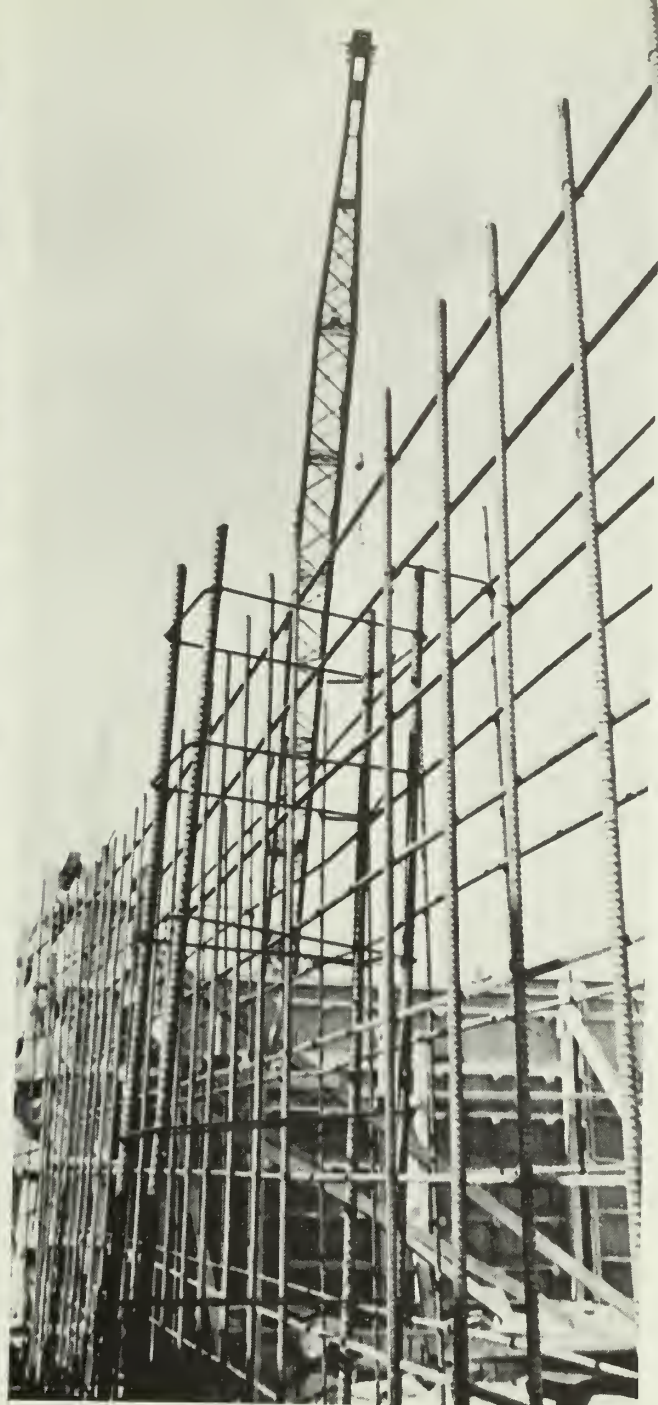
Winter '68 —

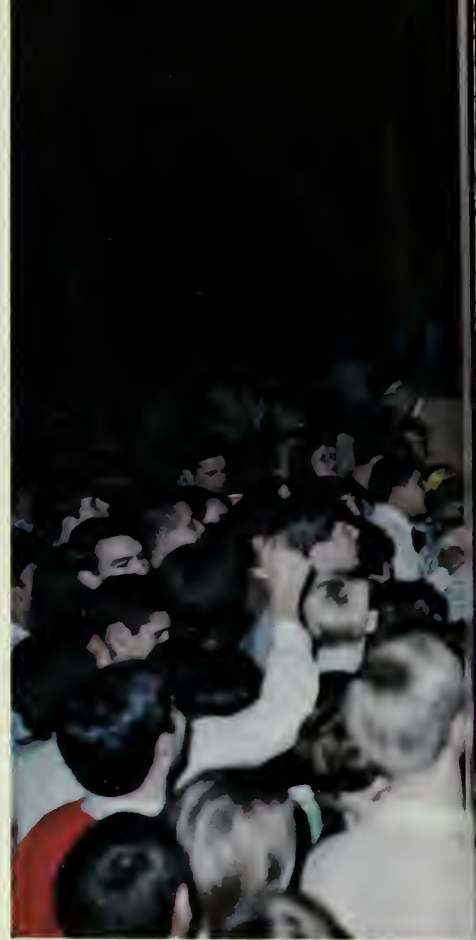

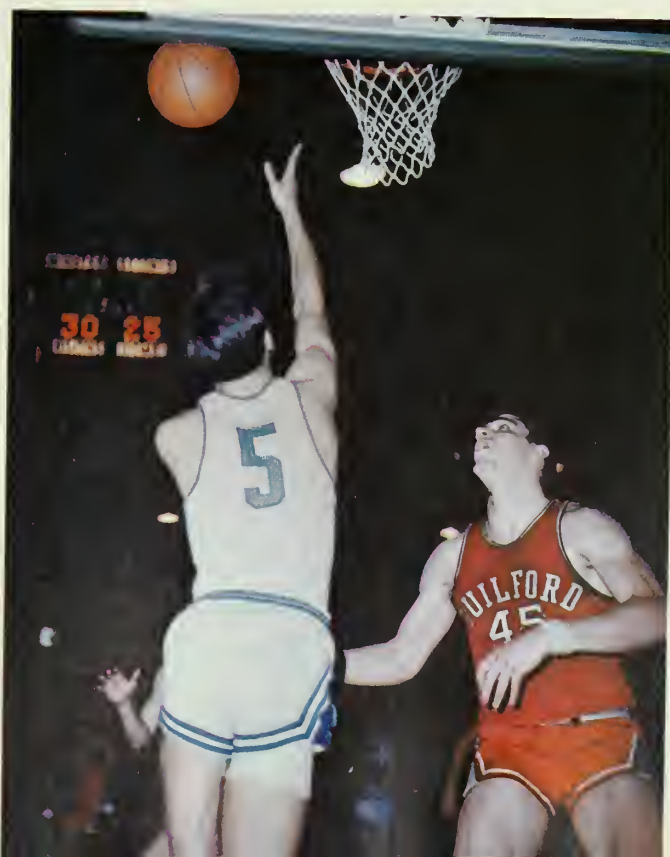




... and Culmination.

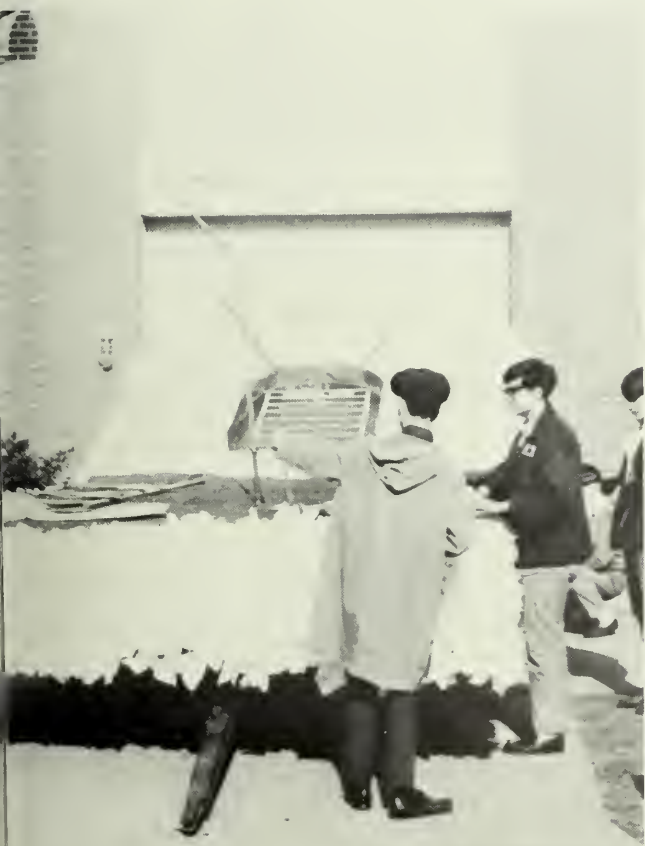




Founded in May, 1964, Iota Alpha Tau is composed of students who are majoring in Industrial Arts, Industrial Management or Industrial Technology.

The Southern Colony of Tau Kappa Epsilon

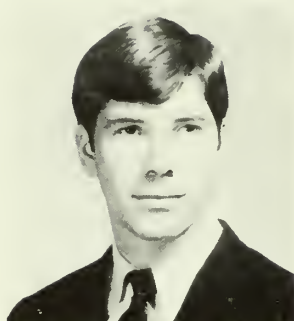

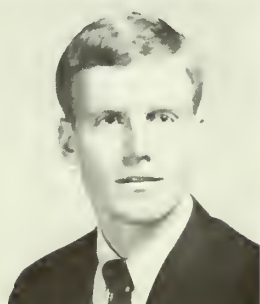

Among Chi Sigma's projects this year were its annual Christmas project for a needy Statesboro family and aiding a local sorority on their Homecoming float.

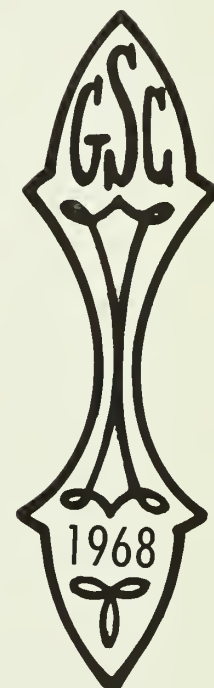

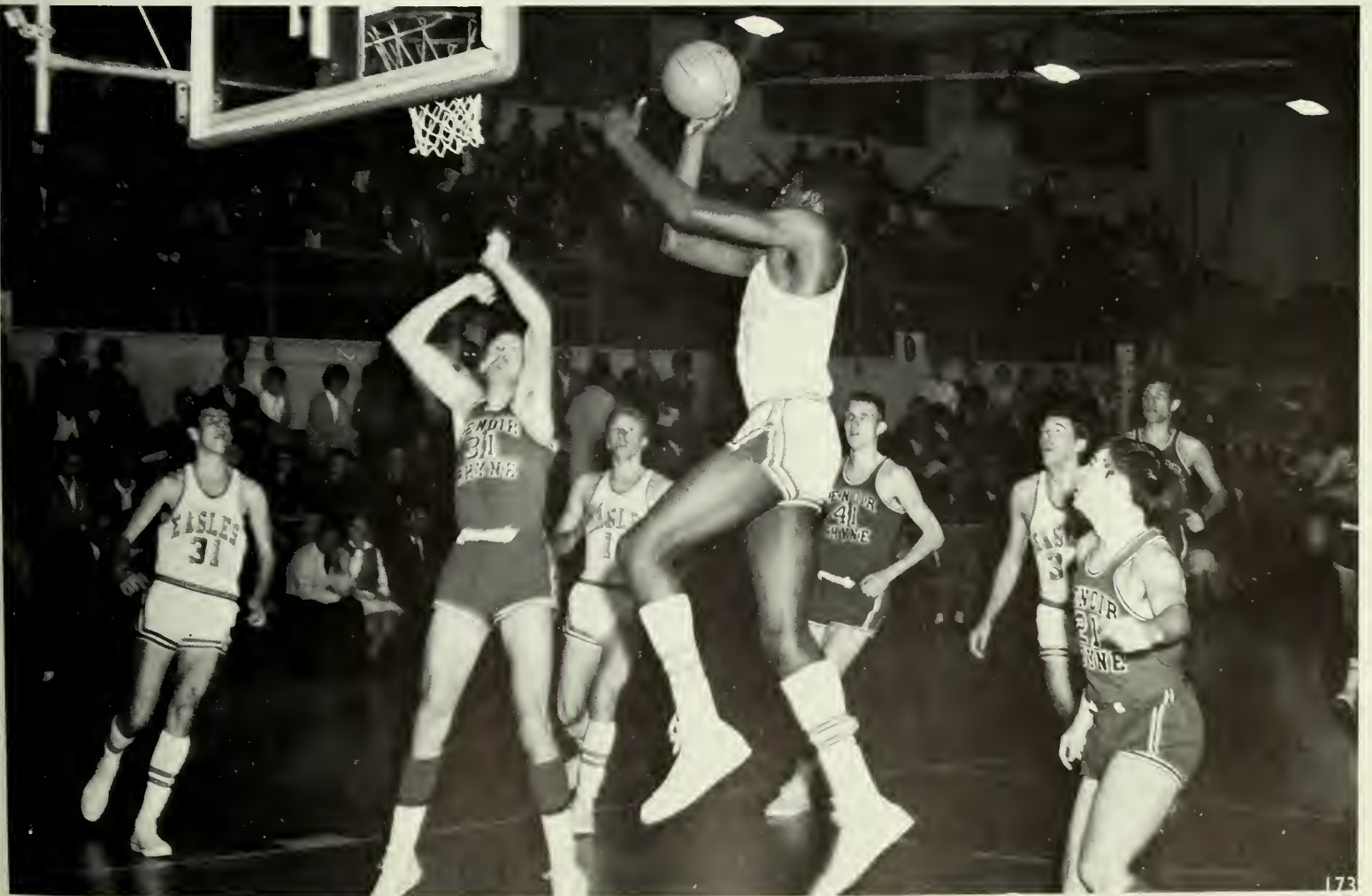
Inexperienced But . . .

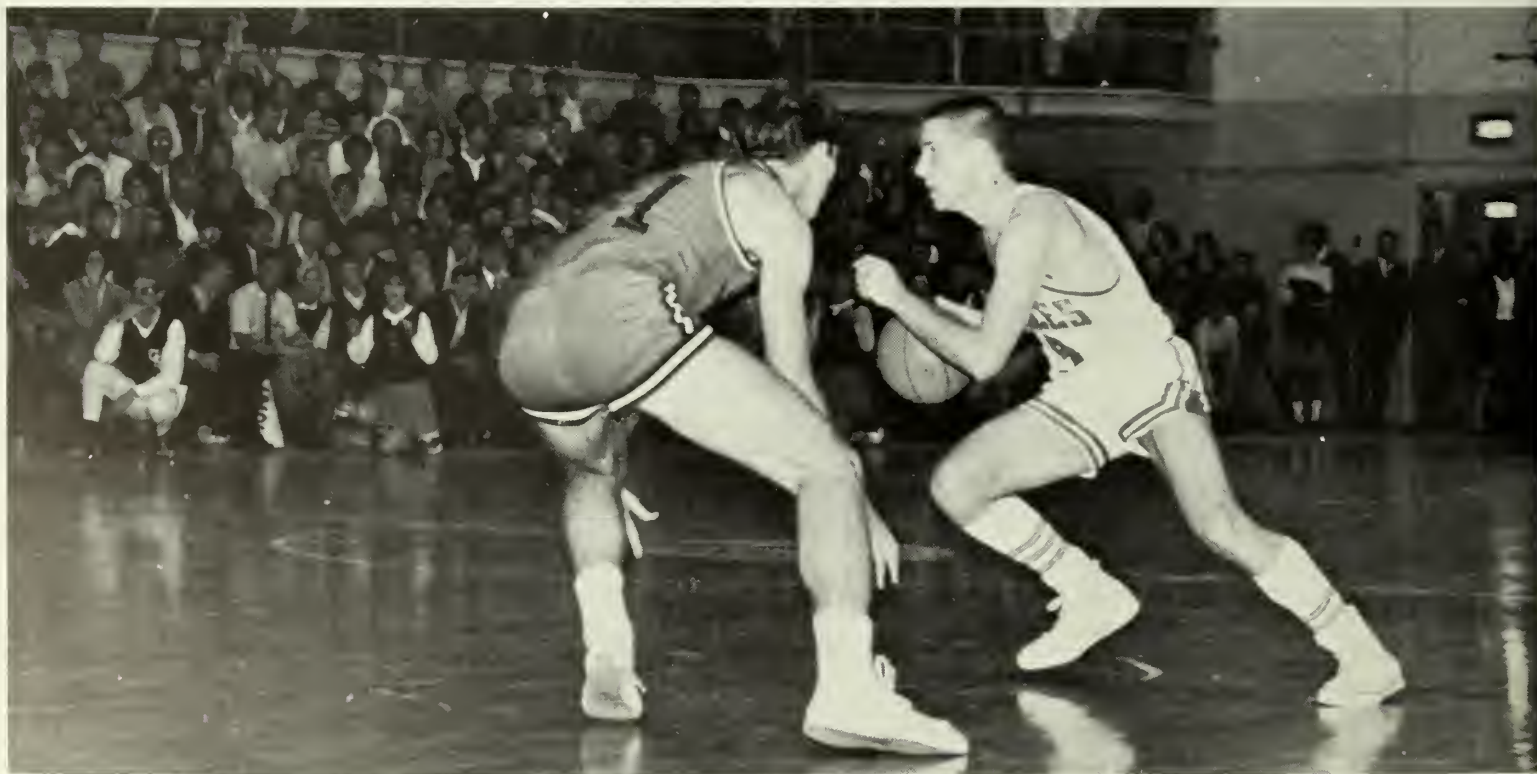

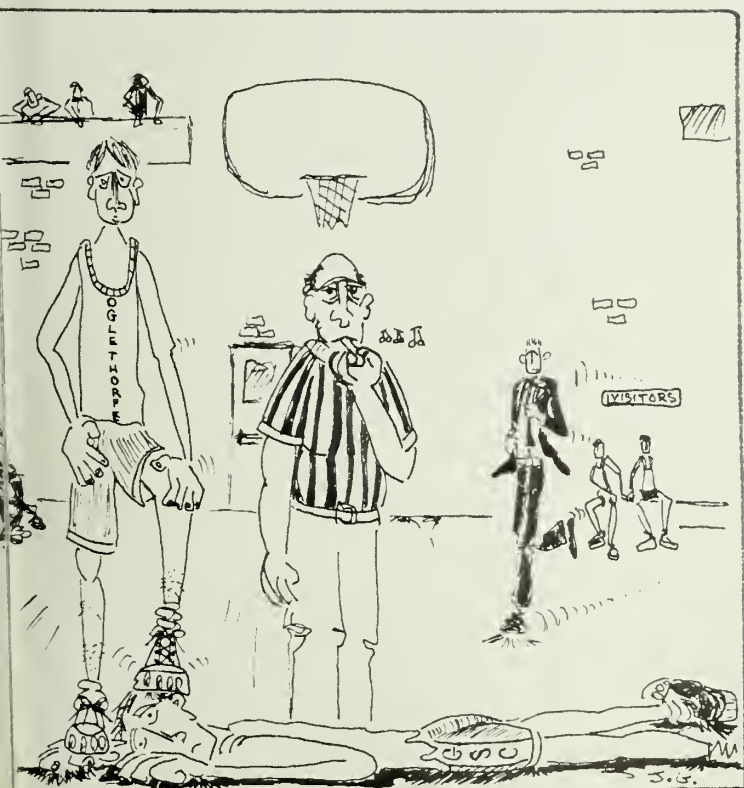

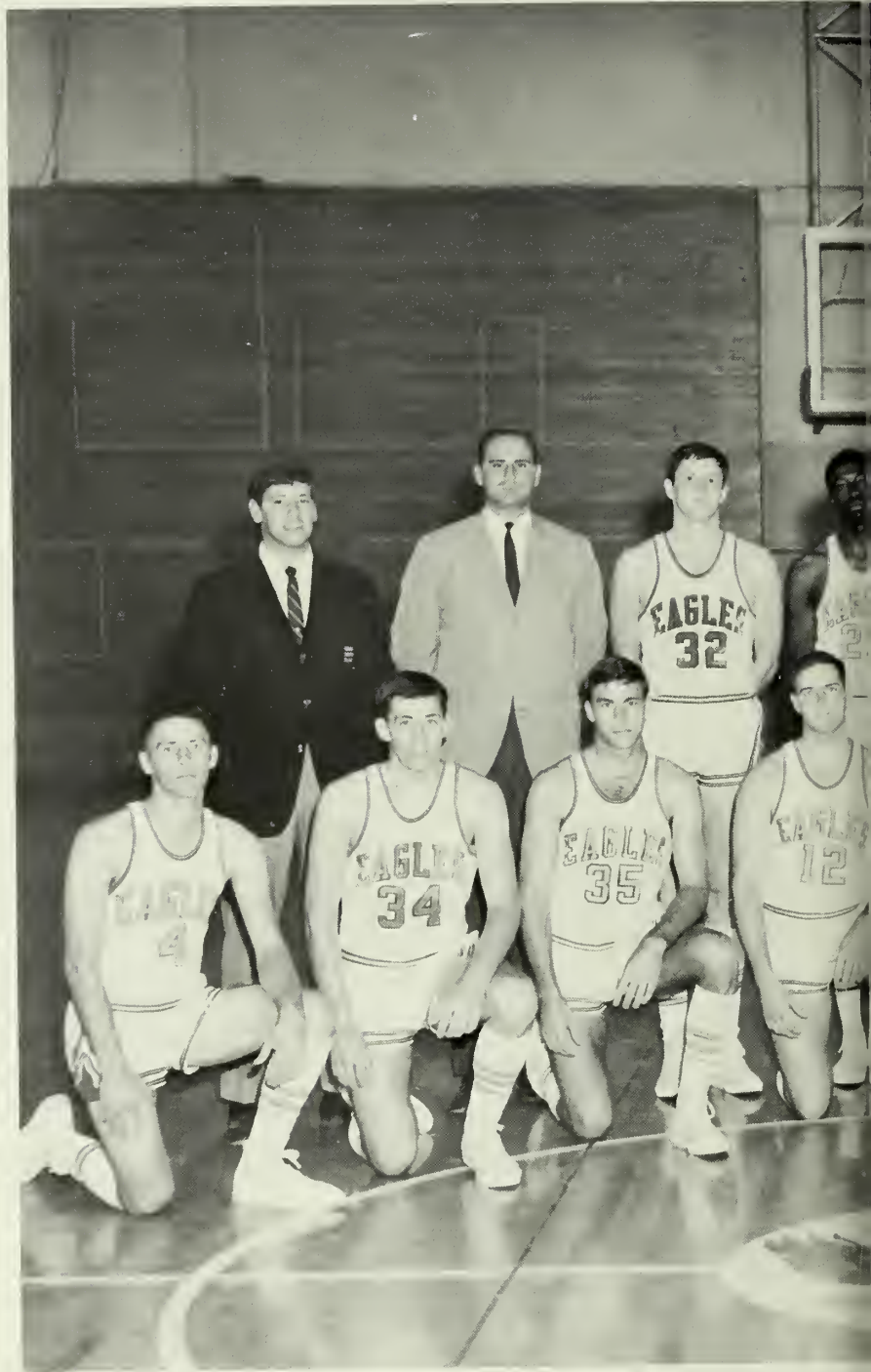

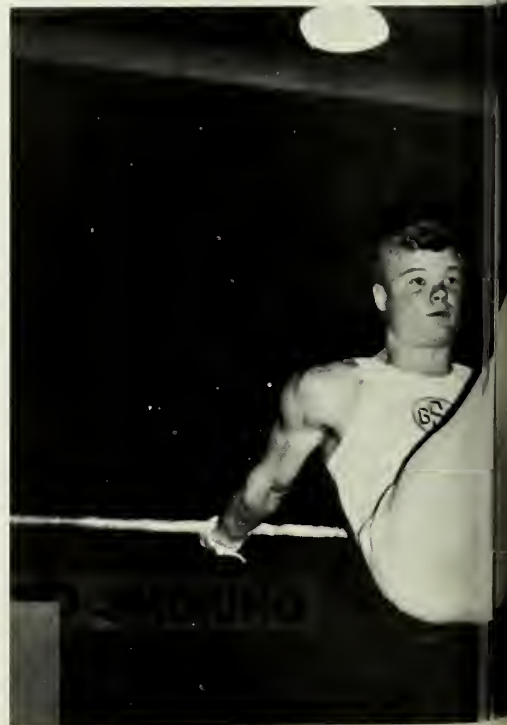
