Throughout the evening Hope received four standing ovations.

Bob Hope began performing during World War II before American Troops. During the Korean War and the Vietnam War he continued to travel and entertain troops. Besides performing as a comedian in motion pictures, radio, and television Hope has published his autobiography, Have Tux, Will Travel and I Owe Russia \$1200! Hope has also starred on Broadway in Roberta, and has worked with such greats as Bing Crosby and Savannah's own Johnny Mercer.

He received his Bachelor's Degree in Musicology at the University of Pennsylvania, and his Master of Music Degree from Temple University, where he studied with the world renowned pianist, Natalie Hinderas.

Miller won the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia's competition sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts in 1976. Miller was also the winner of the Charleston Symphony Competition. Miller has performed throughout the United States. He has also performed with the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia, the Charleston Symphony Orchestra and at the Philadelphia Academy of Music.


















Women's Tennis
