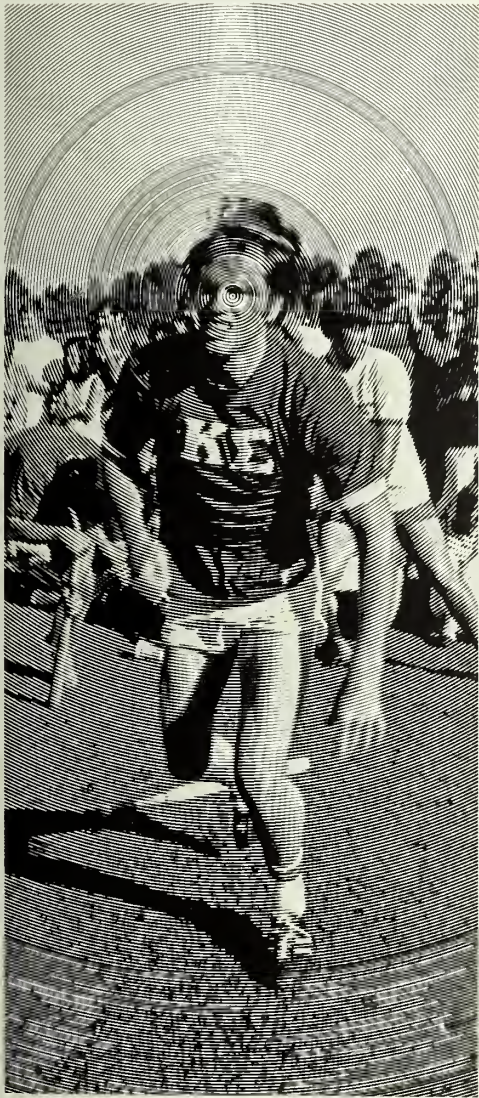

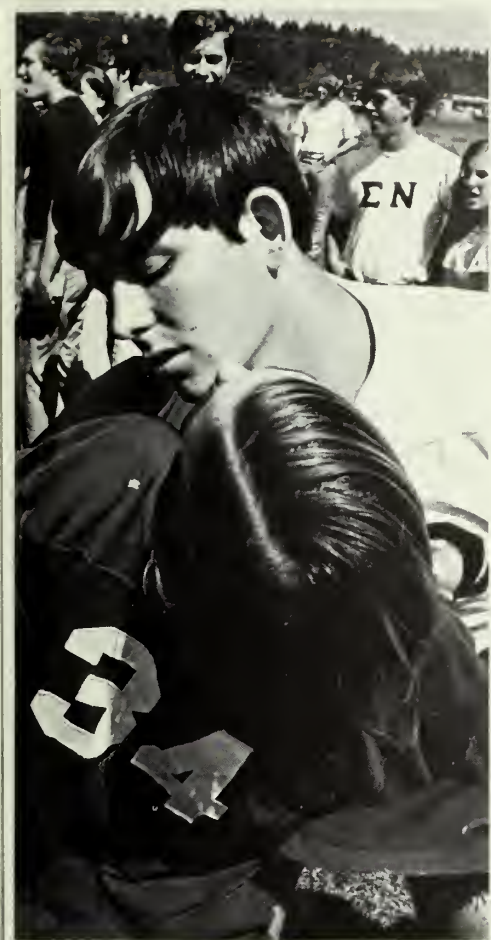












The voting age in Georgia is 18, many political theorists maintain this does not affect the election outcomes. Candidates Carter and Suit made stops on the Georgia Southern Campus anyway. The programs of each were similar, with the Candidate explaining his views on the political issues of the 1970 campaign, followed by a question and answer session with the students.

Although a majority of the students here, as elsewhere, were not directly involved in campaigning, the campus buzzed with talk of political preferences and the intonations were filled with persuasion.

The November General Election found Carter the victor by a 2 to 1 margin over Suit. Had Suit won, he would have been the first Republican Governor of Georgia since reconstruction.



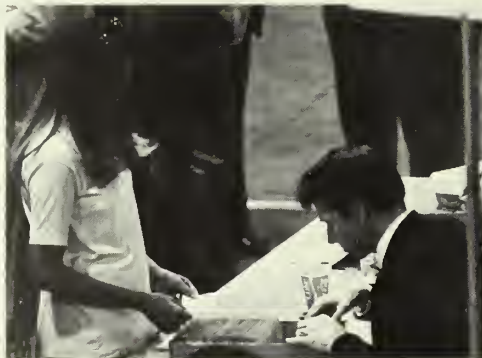

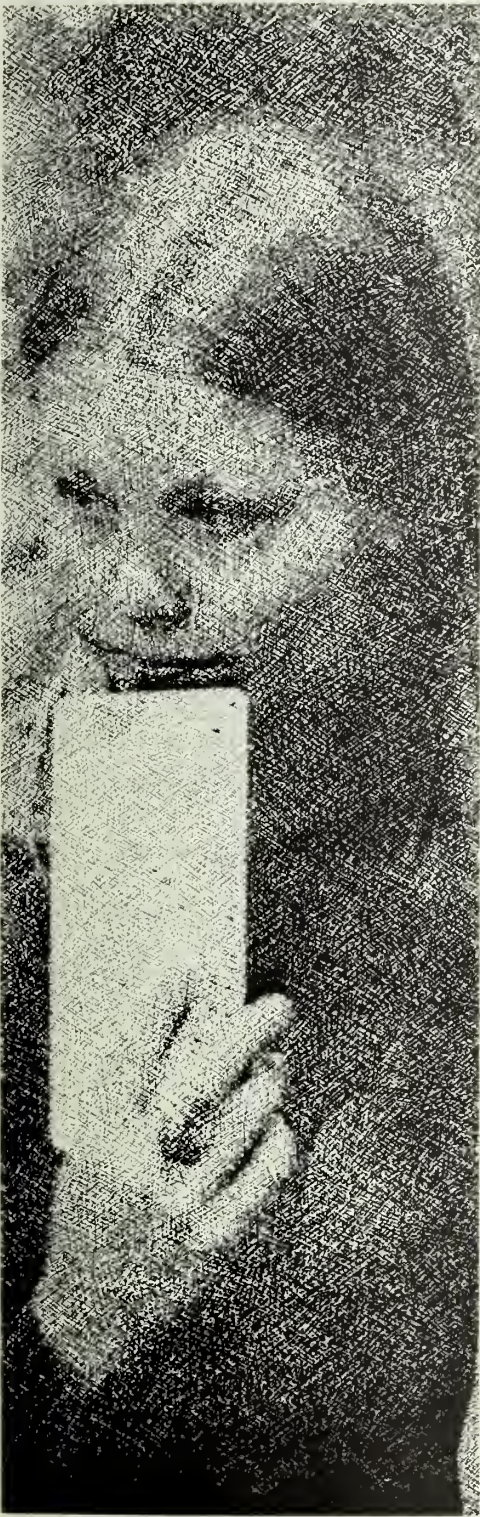

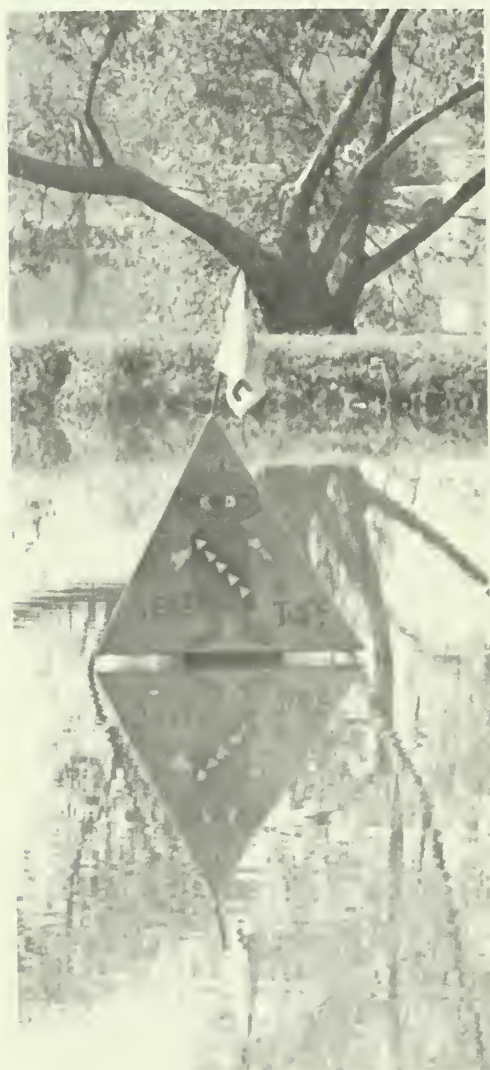

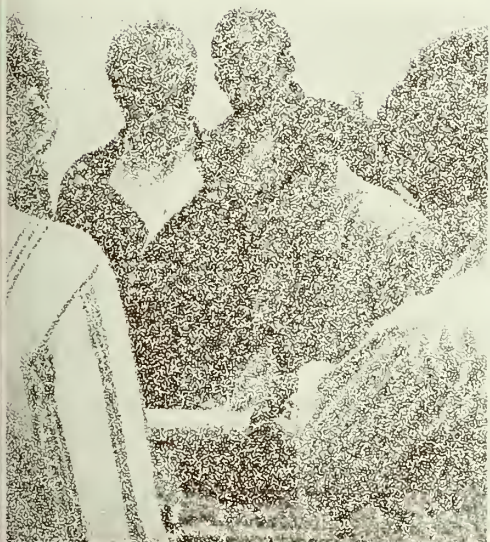


School Of Education

The School of Education was established in December 1968, started in January 1969, and organized according to a plan in July 1969. Summarized, its purpose cause it to be the school to prepare personnel to engage in the improvement of people through education and recreation. The administrative activities are handled by a Division of Health, Physical Education, & Recreation; the Departments of Instruction, Secondary Education, Professional Laboratory Experiences, Elementary Education, Educational Psychology & Guidance, School Service Personnel, and the Marvin Pittman Laboratory School. The planning activities for the School of Education are condensed in Program Development Units which include faculty members from units of the college outside the School of Education.

The School, with its purposes and its structure, is making preparation for entry into a new building effective August 1. It stands ready to render distinguished service and it stretches its energies beyond any of the present boundaries.

The Business Division attempts to give the student not only a technical base of business knowledge but also to equip him to live and function in a rapidly changing world of broader business and social objectives. The businessman of today must concern himself not only with his immediate job but increasingly be involved in the social and political aspects of society as a whole.

Georgia Southern's Business Division is the largest in the University System outside of the Atlanta-Athens area. The degrees offered are Master of Business Administration, Bachelor of Business Administration with majors in Management, Marketing, Marketing with a fashion merchandising option, Finance, Economics, Accounting, and General Business or the Bachelor of Science in Office Administration.

Division Of Languages

The Division of Languages, first organized in 1935, included the disciplines of English, French, Journalism, and Spanish. German was first offered in 1937 and Speech in 1939. In recent years there have been added Italian, Latin, Philosophy, and Russian.

In 1969 the Division, with a staff of 49 members, was divided into the Department of English, Journalism, and Philosophy, the Department of Foreign Languages, and the Department of Speech. Within these departments are offered both the A.B. and B.S. in Education degrees with majors in English, French, German, Spanish, and Speech, and with A.B. degree minors in these subjects and in journalism and philosophy.

On the graduate level are offered the Master of Arts in English, the Master of Science for Teachers of English, the Six-year certificate, and the Education Specialist degree. Future plans anticipate the establishment of graduate programs in speech and foreign languages.

Science And Mathematics

All members of the Chemistry Dept. hold the Ph. D. degree in their area of specialization, and the department provides a comprehensive program of chemical education at the undergraduate level. The department is striving to develop the facilities necessary for formal accreditation by the American Chemical Society. Once this is achieved, it hopes to institute a graduate program, initially at the master's level.

The Physics Dept. offers both the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees. Its staff numbers six, four with Ph. D. degrees. A new \$2,300,000 Physics and Mathematics building will be available by Sept. 1971 with excellent facilities for teaching and research.

The Dept. of Mathematics offers a wide range of courses at both undergraduate and graduate levels. The department offers an M.S. in Mathematics and courses for graduate students in the M. Ed., M.S.T., and Ed. S. Degree programs in Education.

The Dept. of Geology offers the B.A. and B.S. degrees to its majors. All faculty members are engaged in research, as well as a number of senior students.

The Division of Social Science is made up of the Departments of History, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology. It is also the home of the program of Criminal Justice and the academic areas of anthropology, pre-law, and geography. Approximately 900 students are working toward undergraduate degrees — Bachelor of Arts, the Bachelor of Science, and the Bachelor of Science in Education — in this division. The Master of Arts degree is offered in History and Psychology. The graduate major in social science as a teaching field leads to the advanced degrees of Master of Science for Teachers and Master of Education.

Fine Arts

The Department of Music, an Associate Member of the National Association of Schools of Music, is currently developing a self-study for presentation for full membership in that Association to become effective Fall 1971. During the past year various faculty members and committees have been working on restructuring courses within the Department for the various degree programs in music and music education. Some major areas which will demand attention in the immediate future include: (1) scholarships for promising music students (2) a new organ for the Foy Fine Arts Recital Hall (3) the establishment of an electronic music studio, and (4) a graduate degree in music.

The Dept. of Art offers the B.S. and A.B. degrees to its majors. Courses are available in art history, textile design, interior design, ceramics, drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, and advertising design. A fine new building houses spacious art classrooms and studios.

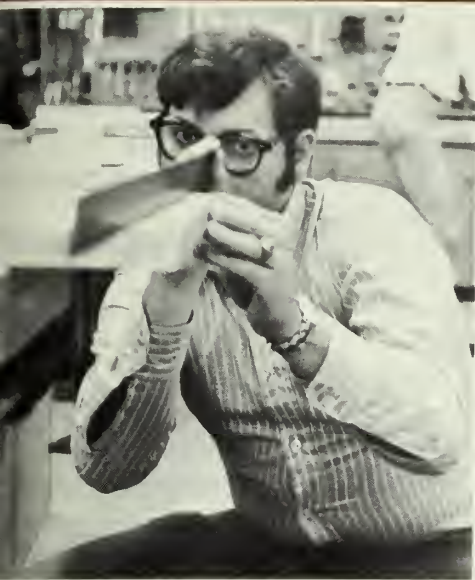

The Division of Home Economics at Georgia Southern is one of ten units of the University System offering studies in the field. The Division's general purpose is to transmit and synthesize scientific research in physical, behavioral and life sciences into the realities of living for families of the nation. Current national trends reflect increasing enrollments in Home Economics in institutions of higher learning. Predictions for the 70's in Home Economics a G.S.C. is for a parallel increase in enrollment. With the expansion of facilities at Georgia Southern College, this prediction should be fulfilled.

Industrial Technology

The Industrial Technology Division was established in 1936 to prepare industrial arts teachers for the schools of Georgia. The B.S. in Industry degree with majors in Industrial Technology, Industrial Management, and Printing Management were introduced during the decade of the 1960's. Plans are to introduce programs in Industrial Design and Industrial Engineering in the future.

The Division produced 100 graduates in 1970; 75 were industrial technology and industrial management graduates and 25 were industrial arts education graduates.

Purposes of the Industrial Technology Division include developing in students an understanding and awareness of technology in our culture, exposing them to a liberal scientific-technological background that permits entry to management and engineering positions, and providing a basic background of competence to teach about industry and its technology.

Rosenwald Library

The Library of Georgia Southern is a major resource of the College. With a collection now totalling over 300,000 items it is well on its way toward becoming the major research library in South Georgia. This year has been a season of reorganization under a new Director of Libraries, but reorganization has not slowed a constantly increasing rate of growth for the Library.

More than two-thirds of the items in the Library have been added to it within the last ten years, and the present rate of growth is over twenty thousand volumes annually. A high-spot in the Library's history in 1970/71 was its receipt in January of a gift from the Sea Island Bank of a valuable collection of books totalling almost seven thousand volumes. The Library includes extensive collections in various types of microform as well as books. It receives over 1500 periodicals and fifteen daily newspapers on current subscriptions and is the depository for Federal Government documents for the First Congressional District of Georgia.

A new library building for the College has been authorized and is expected to be ready for use by the fall of 1973. It will provide space for a book collection of over 600,000 volumes, study areas for approximately 1750 readers, work areas and offices for a staff of sixty, and room for widely expanded library services.

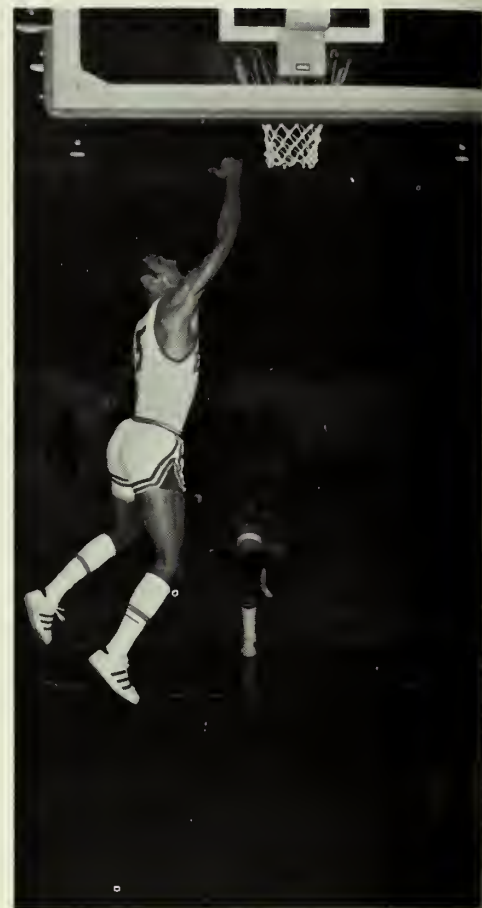
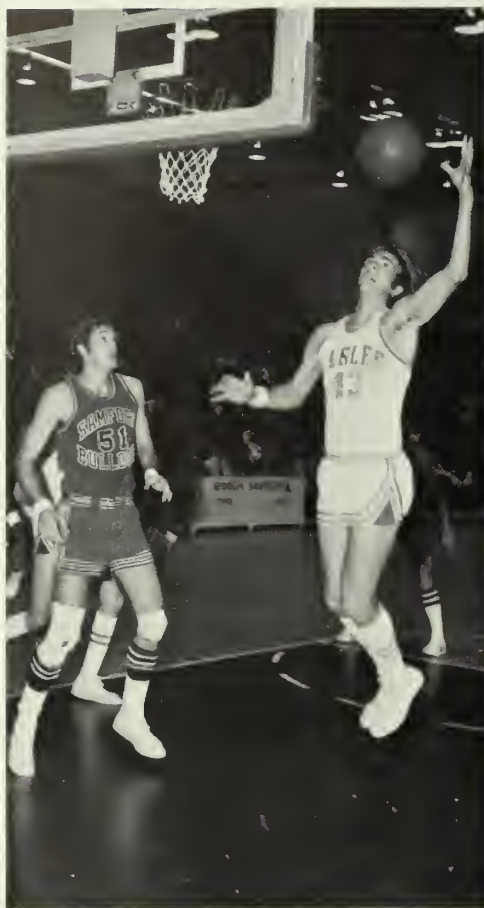

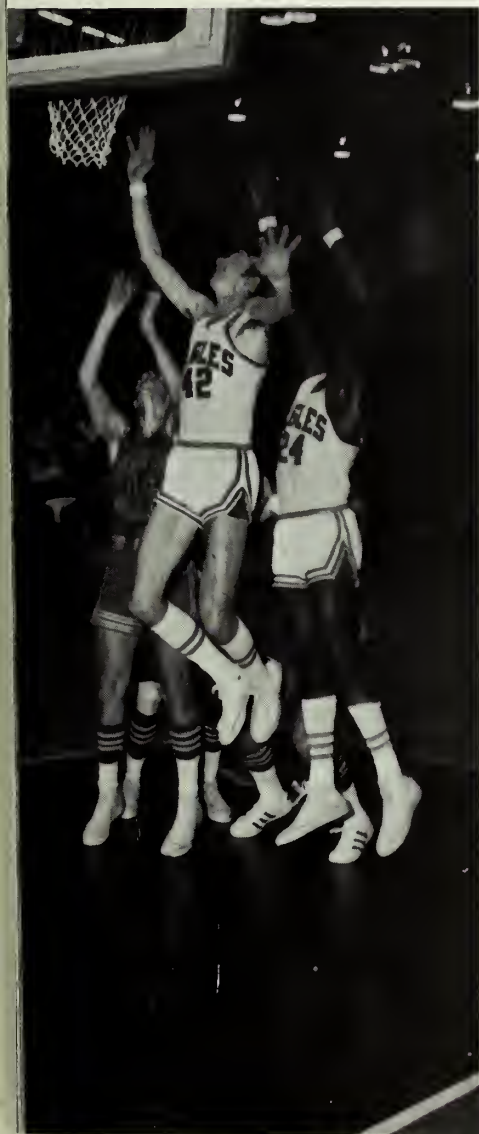

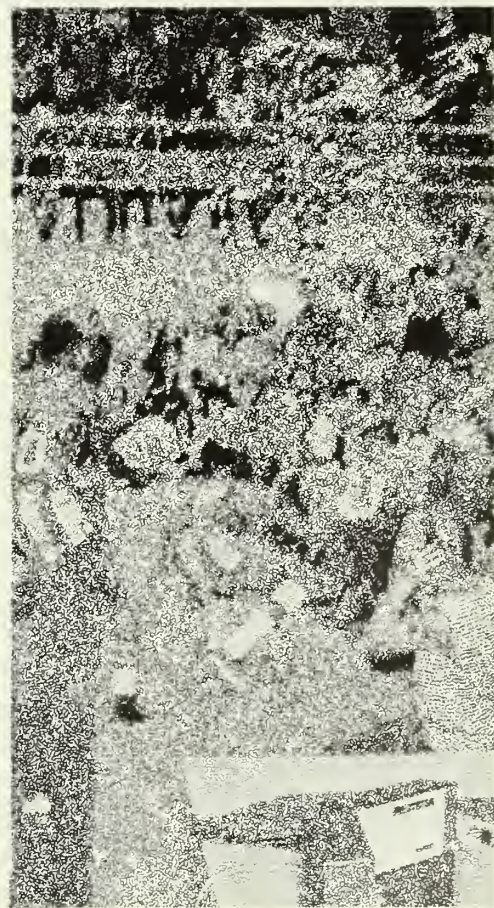

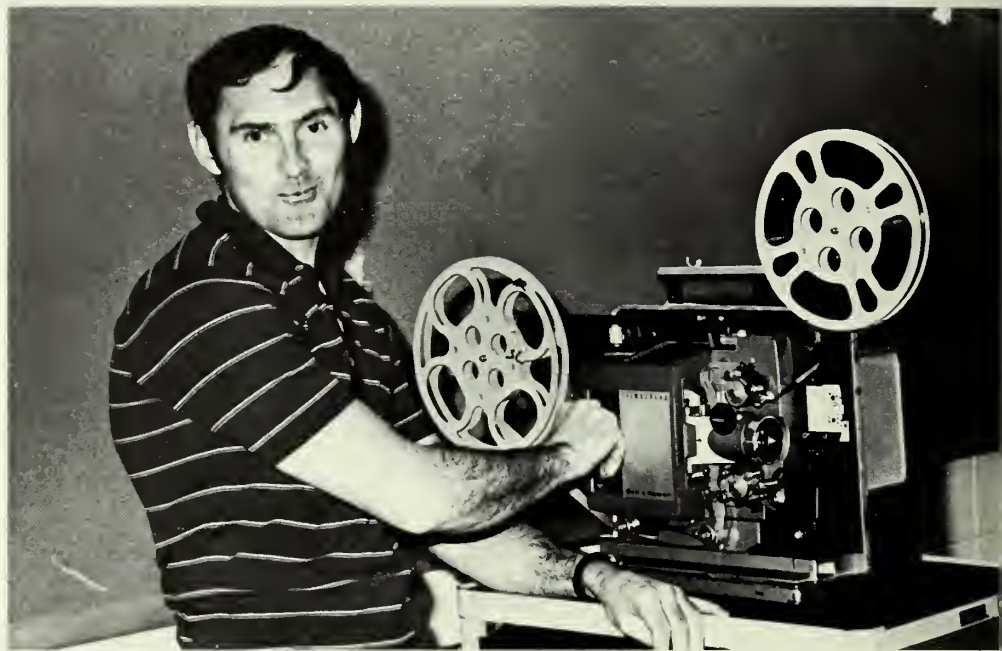

Ron Oertley has initiated an all-year practice plan in order to insure an experienced team for the future.

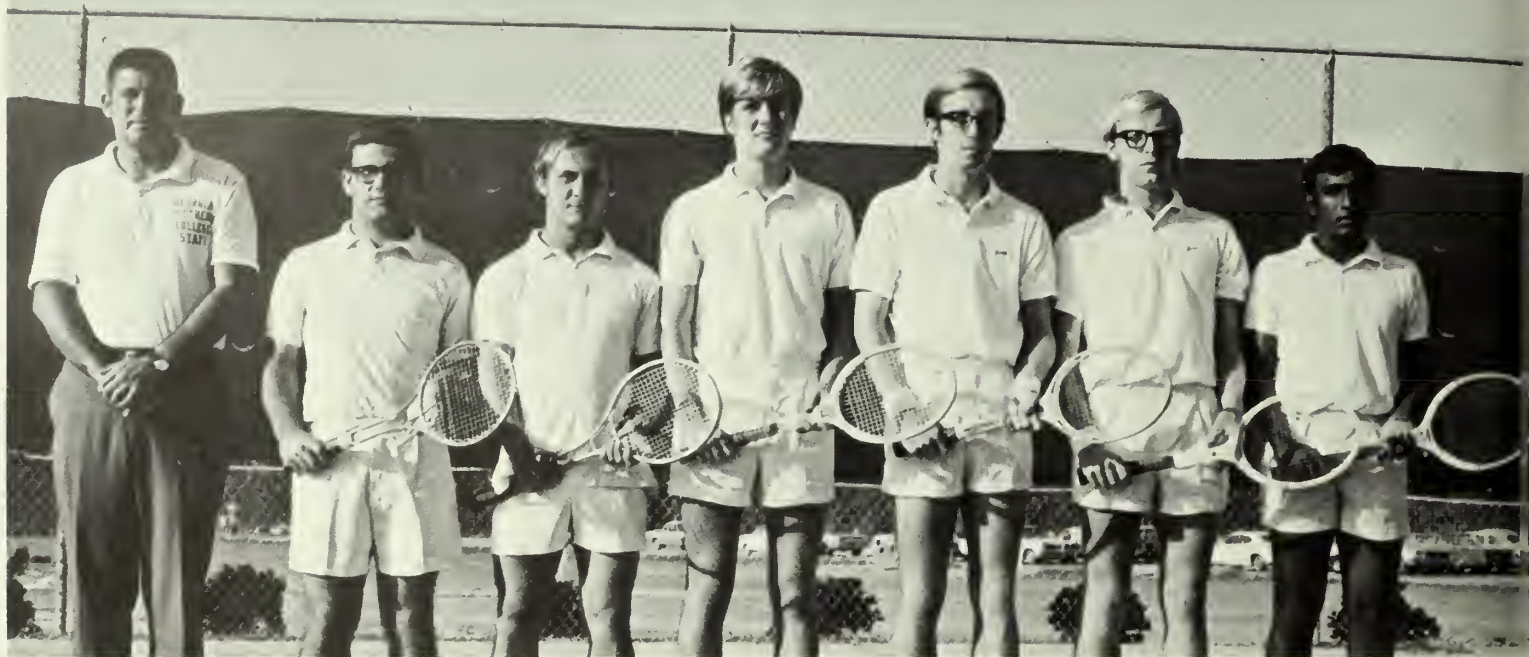

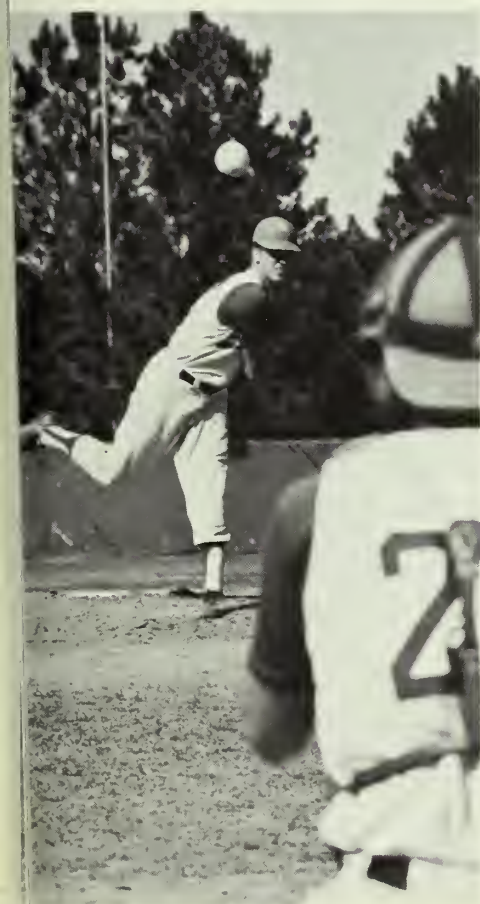

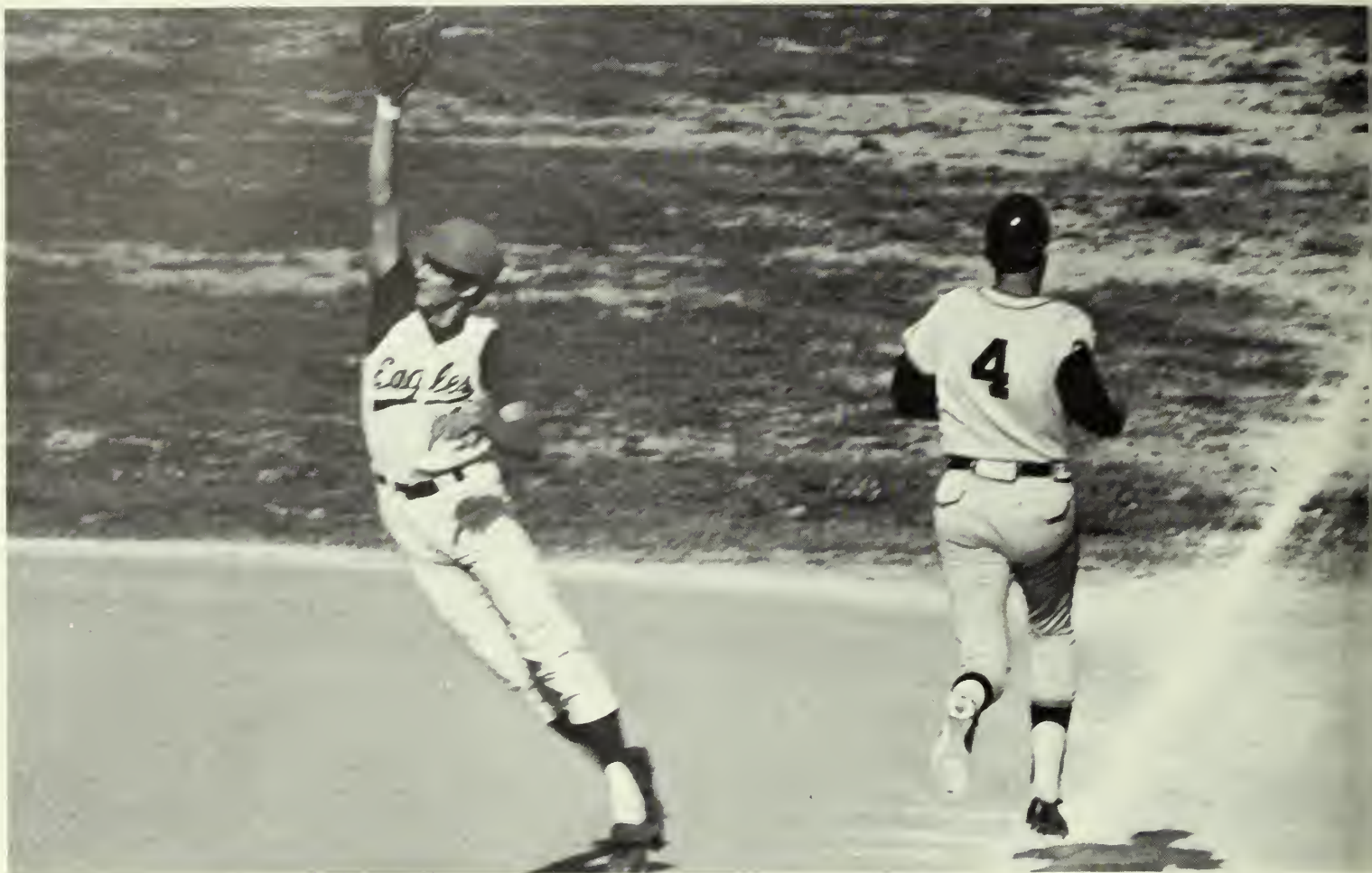

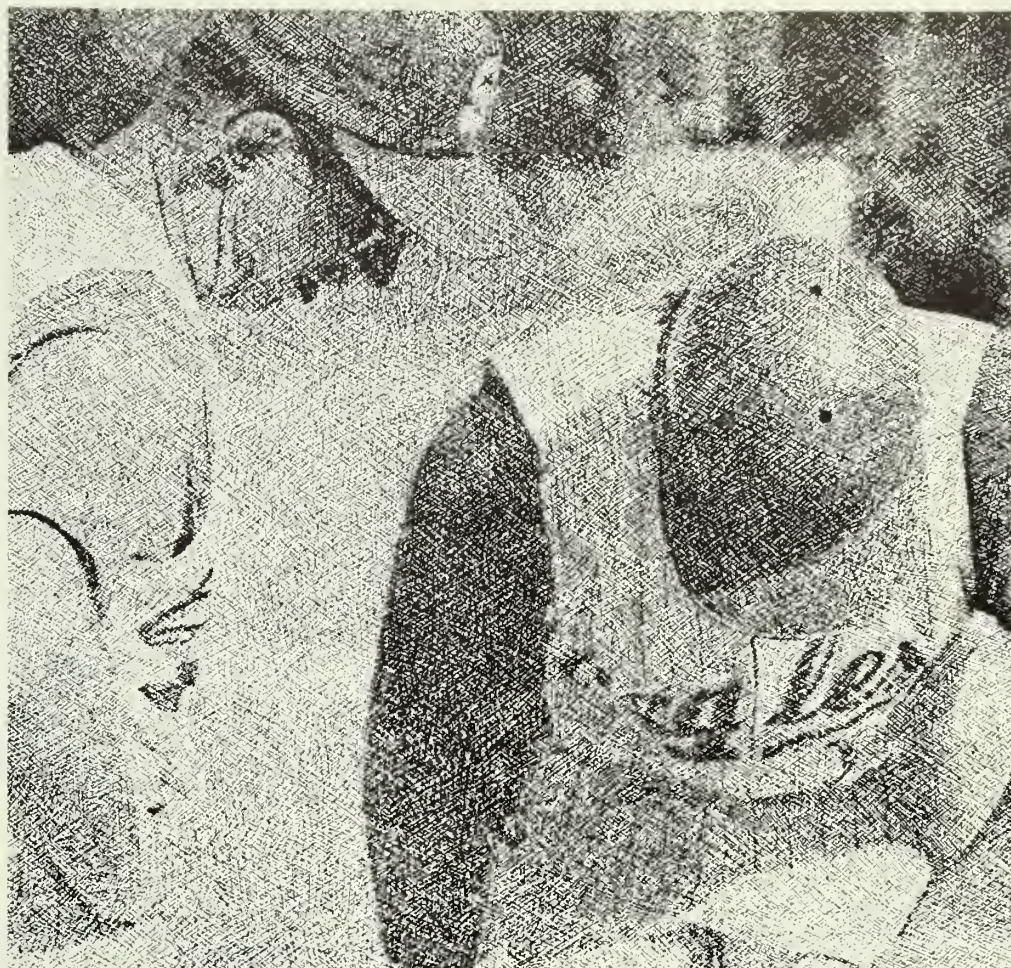
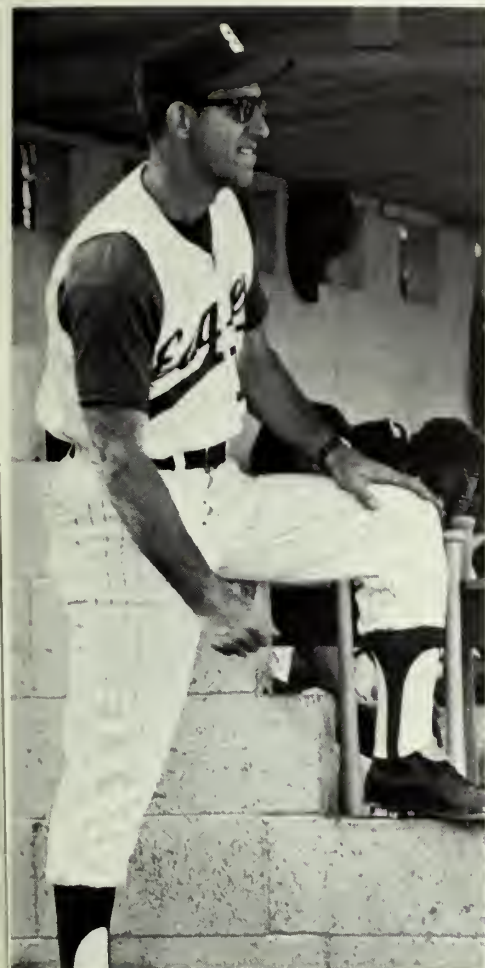

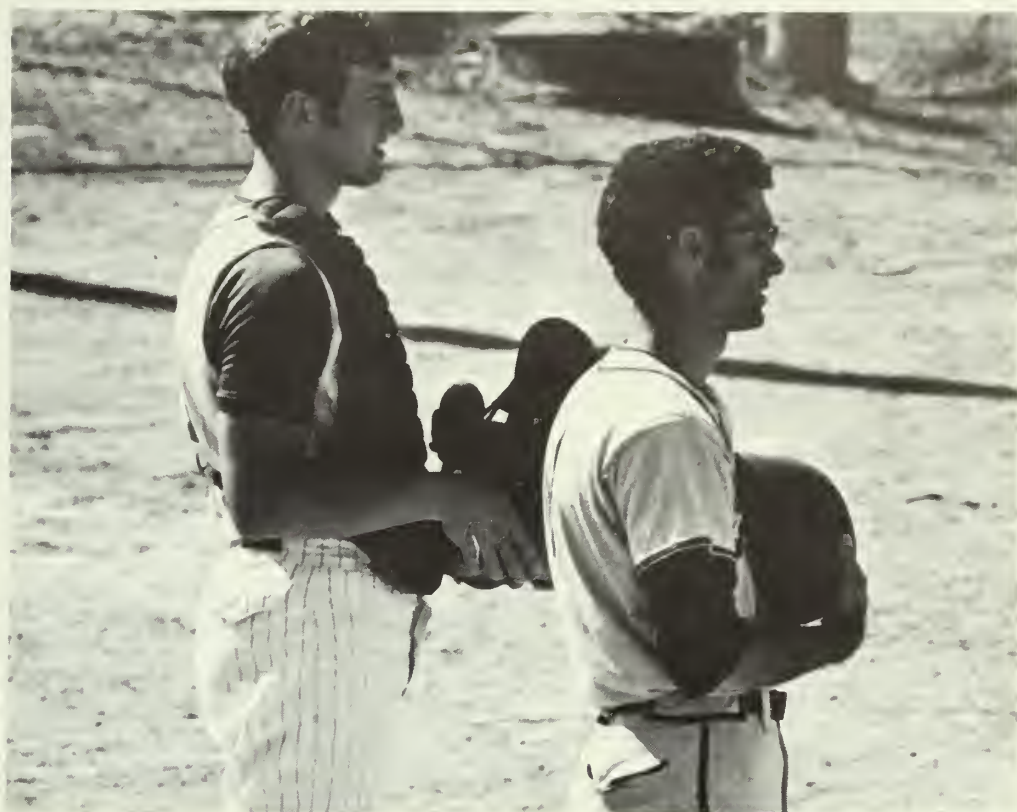

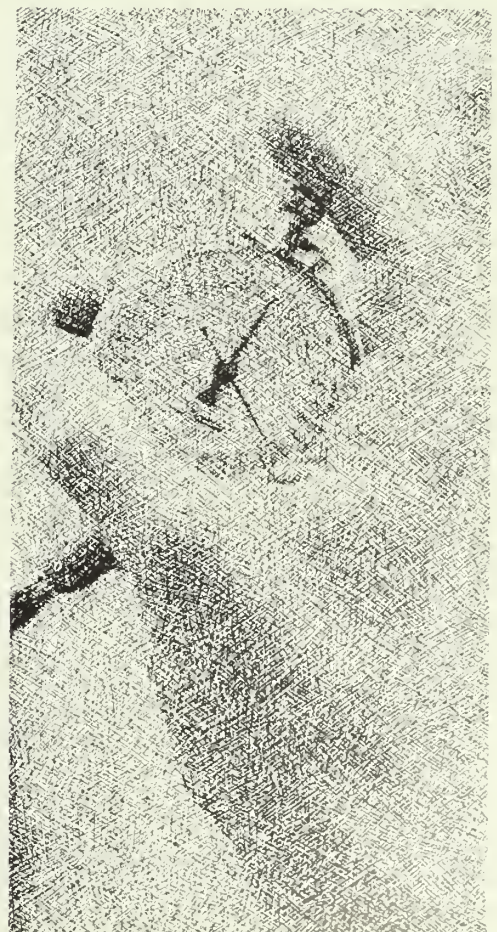
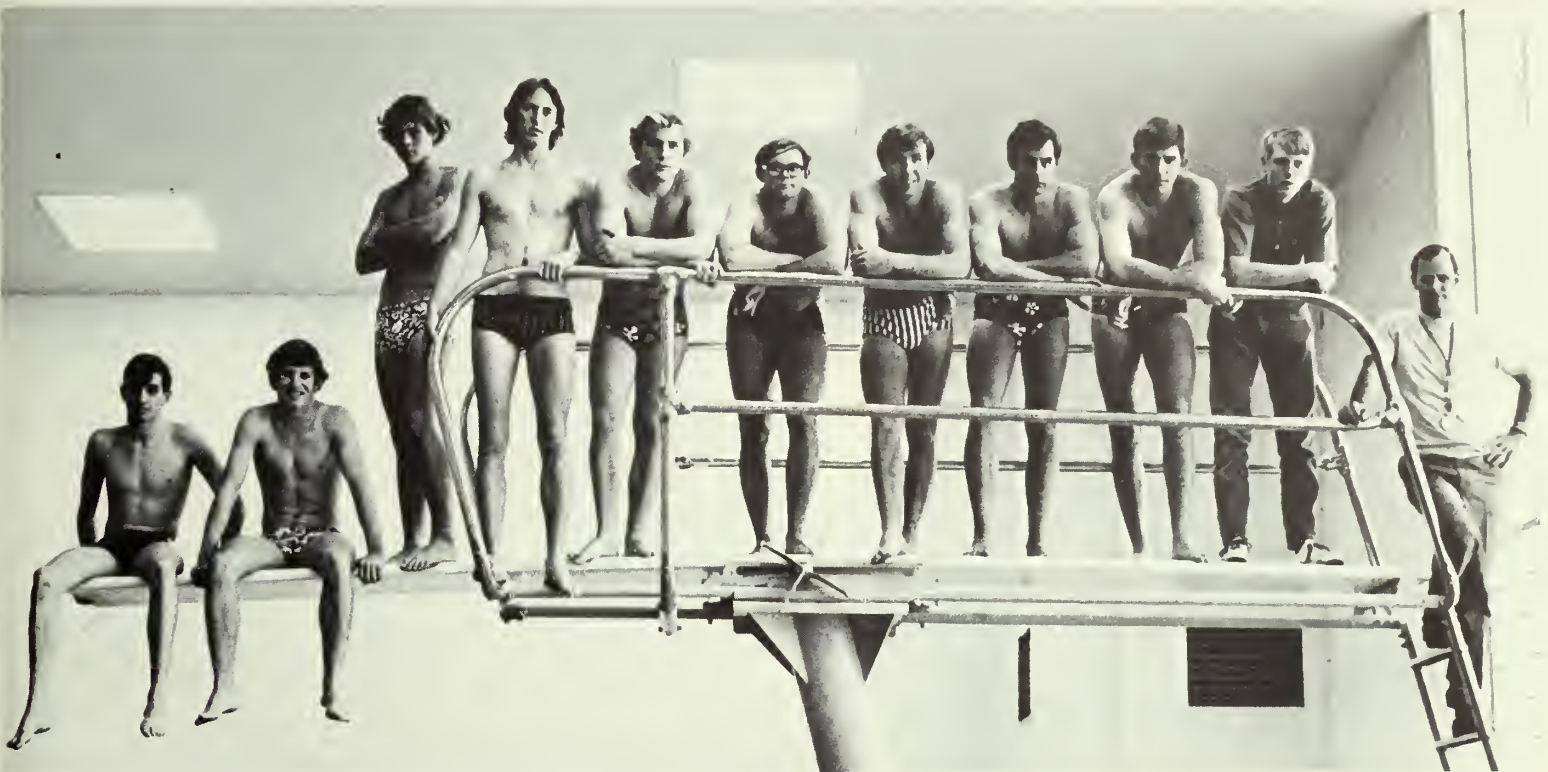
