## 1. COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, free and available on campus.

On the **Statesboro Campus**, COVID-19 vaccines are available at Health Services Monday through Friday. On the **Armstrong Campus in Savannah**, the vaccines are available at the Health Professions Academic Building on Wednesdays. Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccines are now offered at both campuses.

All appointments must be made online in advance through the MyGS portal. To schedule an appointment, go to the MyGS portal and click on the "COVID-19 Vaccine Scheduling Form" under the heading of "COVID-19 Information and Resources."

- 2. Pfizer booster doses are available to those faculty, staff, and students who are eligible
  Based on guidance from the FDA and CDC, the following people who have completed their two-dose Pfizer COVID19 vaccine series at least 6 months ago are currently eligible for booster doses:
  - People 65 years and older and residents in long-term care settings
  - People aged 50 to 64 with <u>certain underlying medical conditions</u>
  - People 18 to 49 who are at high risk for severe COVID-19 due to <u>certain underlying medical</u> <u>conditions</u> may receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine, based on their individual benefits and risks
  - People aged 18-64 years who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of
    occupational or institutional setting may receive a booster shot of Pfizer-BioNTech's COVID-19 vaccine,
    based on their individual benefits and risks

If you feel like this may apply to you, please contact <u>the CARES Center</u> for more information on how to schedule your Pfizer booster dose.

- 3. It's the last week to participate in our COVID-19 vaccine reward and incentive plan!

  Our best shot is your shot in September! You have until Thursday to participate in the vaccine reward and incentive plan:
  - Faculty, staff and students who receive the first COVID-19 vaccine dose at a University-sponsored vaccine clinic receive a **\$50 EagleXpress credit** loaded directly on their Eagle Card.
  - There are **two grand prize drawings** at the end of September (valued at \$2,500 and \$5,000 or the cash equivalent) for any faculty, staff or student who completed the vaccine series, regardless of vaccination location. Enter through the MyGS portal under <u>"COVID-19 Vaccine Drawing."</u>

### 4. Applicants needed for the new Eagle Support Network (ESN)
