The Betty Foy Sanders Department of Art (BFSDoArt) is proud to present two exciting exhibitions: **STUDIO-** *f: Monoprints from the University of Tampa*, an exhibition of lithographic and serigraphic monoprints by 18 internationally renowned artists; and *Medium Anxiety*, an exhibition highlighting video, sound sculpture, and artwork that challenges traditional artistic media. Both exhibitions will open on **September 9**, **2011 and run through Tuesday**, **October 25**, **2011** at the Center for Art & Theatre, Georgia Southern University. The department will also host a reception on **Thursday**, **September 15**, **from 5-7pm**.

STUDIO-f: Monoprints from the University of Tampa features 21 monoprints by 18 celebrated artists who have participated in STUDIO-f, which is the University of Tampa's visiting artist program.
