New Exhibitions on Display at the Center for Art & Theatre

The Betty Foy Sanders Department of Art is proud to present two new exhibitions on display at the Center for Art & Theatre. Michael Velliquette's *Power Seeker* and Karen Myers' *Intimate Patterns* are open until February 24.



Power Seeker can be seen in the Center's University Gallery. The exhibition showcases a survey of cut-paper sculptures by Velliquette, who works exclusively with hand-cut heavyweight paper card stock to construct visually and structurally complex forms that reference masks and other forms of ritually driven object making.



Intimate Patterns is currently on display in the Center for Art & Theatre's Contemporary Gallery. In this exhibition, Myers examines the psychological



complexity of women through intimate observations of the bedroom. The paintings, screen prints, and collages are inspired by the cult of beauty popularized in contemporary mass media.

On **Thursday, January 17 at 5 p.m.,** Artist Michael Velliquette, whose exhibition *Power Seeker* is now on display in the University Gallery of the Center for Art & Theatre, will present a lecture in Room 2016 of the Visual Arts Building.

Velliquette is an internationally renowned artist whose work has been displayed at institutions such as Yale University; Chazen Museum of Art in Madison, Wis.; Witherspoon



Museum of Art in Greensboro, N.C.; San Antonio Museum of Art in Texas; EURCA+2012 in Kassel, Germany; and the Museum of Arts and Design in New York City. His work has also been shown at numerous commercial galleries, including the DCKT Contemporary in New York City, David Shelton Gallery in Houston, La Montagne Gallery in Boston, Morgan Lehman Gallery in New York City, Parson Gallery in Paris and Deitch Projects in New York City. Immediately following the artist talk, a reception will be held at the Center for Art & Theatre. The event is free,

"The exhibition examines how a seemingly familiar and fragile material can be transformed into powerful spectacles of the handmade. Kids will love the bright colors and wild imagery, while adults will be fascinated by the intricate details and craftsmanship that is evident in each sculpture.
