ACUE Grant

The Faculty Center is excited to lead GS's participation in a major research study funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF) in partnership with ACUE - Association of College and University Educators. This longitudinal study, focused on "gateway" courses, will examine the effects of high-quality PD on the relationship between evidence-based and equity-promoting teaching practices and positive mindsets, stronger student outcomes, and narrowing equity gaps.



Over 75 faculty are currently participating in ACUE's Effective Teaching Practices 25 module course which will give them the opportunity to earn ACUE's Certificate in Effective College Instruction, the only nationally recognized collegiate teaching credential endorsed by the American Council on Education (ACE).




