AASU is the **2nd** winningest **NCAA Division II** baseball team since 1983? AASU was the 3rd winningest NCAA Division II team in the 1990's? AASU is one of 8 teams nationally to be in the NCAA II Regionals at least 12 of the past 21 seasons? AASU has been ranked nationally in 15 of the last 21 final NCAA II polls, including the Top 15 ten times? AASU has had 37 players go to professional baseball in the past 11 years? AASU has had **26** consecutive years with players signing to play **professional baseball**? AASU has had 22 All-Americans and 19 Hon. Mention All-Americans in 20 years? AASU is one of 4 Peach Belt schools to have won 4 conference championships since 1992? AASU has had 130 of its players graduate in 23 years? AASU baseball players carried a cumulative **3.06 GPA** for the past **11** years? AASU has posted 40 win seasons 13 times since 1981 and 33-win years 24 times? AASU was No. 1 in NCAA DII total attendance in 2002 with 14,516? AASU vs. Georgia drew 3,115 in 2002, then an NCAA II regular season record? AASU has drawn 4 of the top 9 regular season crowds in NCAA II history? AASU is one of 7 teams that have had been No. 1 seeds 5 times since 1988? AASU has a 1049-462 (.694) record during the past 26 years, for a 40-17 average? AASU is in Savannah, Georgia, a coastal beach town only 90 minutes north of Florida? AASU's Joe Roberts is the winningest active coach in NCAA DII baseball? AASU has achieved a 46-20 (.697) mark in the Memorial Health Diamond Classic (formerly the Great Savannah Shootout) featuring DI schools?

AASU has compiled a 167-101 record (.623) vs. NCAA I teams since 1983 with wins over quality teams such as Georgia, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Michigan, North Carolina, Kentucky, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, The Citadel, Jacksonville, Georgia Southern, Indiana, Duke, Maryland, West Virginia, Northwestern, Coastal Carolina, Connecticut, Louisville, Central Florida, Army, Mercer, Davidson, VMI, Winthrop, William and Mary, Charleston Southern, Illinois-Chicago, Georgia State, Bethune-Cookman, tied N.C. State and has played others such as Miami, Florida State and Wake Forest?

2009 SEASON PREVIEW



The Armstrong Atlantic State baseball squad expects to compete once again for a Peach Belt Conference title and a berth in the NCAA DII Baseball Championships. The Pirates once again will play one of the nation's toughest schedules, opening up at home against No. 1 ranked and defending DII national champion Mount Olive on Sunday, February 1, with a threegame series. AASU will also see ranked clubs Columbus State (No. 5), USC Aiken (No. 10), North Georgia (No. 17), Wayne State (No. 20), Valdosta State (No. 21) and Francis Marion (No. 33) throughout the season.

AASU returns a good core of its offense for 2008 with NCBWA Honorable Mention All-America outfielder **Josh Wilson** returning to play left field and sophomore Michael Price set to play center field. Former SIAC Freshman of the Year Alex Wyche will take over in left field. Freshman Cory Thacker and sophomore Josh Heath will also be available in the outfield.

The infield is relatively intact as well with the return of double-play combination Juan Dorado at shortstop and Carlos Cardoza-Oquendo at second base. Kenny Cail makes the move

across the diamond to first base from third, paving the way for junior college transfer Bryan Roby to take over at the hot corner. Freshman Drew Walker is available to back up at several infield spots.

Freshman John Roberts, the *Savannah Morning News*' Coastal Empire Player of the Year will take over behind the plate. Utility player Blake Sills, Heath and freshmen Auston

Thomas and Drew Carnes will also see time at DH and backup in the field.

The pitching staff also returns a bulk of its innings from last season with lefthander Cody Walden and righthander Jeff Chase returning as starters. They'll be joined in the rotation by sophomore Blake Culberson and junior transfer Thomas Gray.

The bullpen will be anchored junior closer Brandon McCreery, who saved seven games and limited opponents to a .186 batting average last season. Lefty Ryan Smith and Roby will take over set-up roles, while Sills and freshmen Jesse Osborne, Chris Base and Ben Jackson will see plenty of opportunity for innings.

AASU has been picked to finish sixth in the PBC in a preseason poll of the league's coaches, behind Columbus State, North Georgia, USC Aiken, GCSU and, Francis Marion. UNC Pembroke was picked seventh, followed by Augusta State, Lander and Georgia

Southwestern. The Pirates' schedule opens up against Mount Olive and also features non-conference games against Southern Indiana, Shepherd, Erskine, future PBC member Flagler as well as the 2009 Sayannah Invitational.

JOE ROBERTS HEAD BASEBALL COACH

Joe Roberts begins his 30th year at the helm of Armstrong Atlantic State baseball. While at AASU, Roberts has posted an overall 1,150-547 (.678) record while averaging 40 wins per year and posting 29 consecutive winning seasons. He currently ranks as the leading active Division II coach and second all-time in wins.

During his career, the Pirates have become a perennial contender in NCAA DII baseball. Armstrong Atlantic State is second only to Florida Southern in NCAA DII baseball victories since his arrival at then-Armstrong State in 1980, and at one point the Pirates were ranked in 110 straight polls over seven seasons. The Pirates advanced to the NCAA DII

World Series in 1988, 1989 and 1994, with their 1990 squad ranked No. 1 nationally in every week of the season.

Coach Roberts has been selected for a coach of the year award eight times, including Region coach of the year awards in all three seasons at the Pirates advanced to the NCAA DII World Series. The Pirates have had players sign professionally in 26 straight years and AASU has also graduated 130 of its players in the last 23 years, despite its small rosters.

Roberts was a four-sport letterman at Lebanon (Ind.) HS before attending Lake Sumter CC in Leesburg, Fla. He finished his career at St. Andrew's Presbyterian College in Laurinburg, N.C., where he was again a four sport letterman and a basketball standout, setting several school, league and NCAA records during a two year career that saw him named All-Conference twice. He was

selected Dixie MVP in his junior year of 1974 and was inducted into the St. Andrews Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995. He is married to the former Lynn Tucker and they have two teenage sons, Brian and Eric.

CALVAIN CULBERSON ASSISTANT BASEBALL COACH

Calvain Culberson will be in his 14th season as a full-time assistant coach at AASU, after completing an eight-year professional baseball career. Calvain is no stranger to Armstrong Atlantic, having played for the Pirates from 1985-1988, and having assisted coach Roberts in a part-time role during his professional career.

Calvain's coaching role at AASU includes working with the outfielders and pitchers, and assisting with baserunning and hitting instruction. While working with AASU's pitchers, Culberson has instructed several players who have, like him, enjoyed professional success. Righthander Adam Bernero,

who Culberson coached during the 1999 season, reached the major leagues in just 15 months, becoming AASU's first major league player. Another Culberson pupil, Doug Sessions, was a AAA All-Star for the New Orleans Zephyrs in 2003 while pitching in the Houston organization.

Culberson finished his pro career in 1995 at Pawtucket, a triple-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. He had joined the Red Sox organization as a free agent after having pitched at Double-A Chattanooga and Triple A Indianapolis in the Cincinnati Reds farm chain. Calvain began his pro career in 1989 in the Atlanta Braves farm system, hitting .313 in his first season, then continuing as a pitcher.

During Culberson's AASU career, the Pirates posted an overall 181-66 (.733) record, with Calvain hitting in the leadoff spot his final three years. The Rome, Georgia native holds seven school records with the most notable being his 32-game hitting streak (1988) and his 128 career stolen bases.

Calvain was an all-Big South Conference selection in 1986 and 1987 when AASU was playing NCAA I baseball. In his last season with the Pirates he was an AASU co-captain and was chosen as a member of the all-South Atlantic Region team and an honorable mention DII All-American.

Calvain is married to the former Pamela Johnson of Port Wentworth, an AASU graduate, who works as a System Analyst II for AASU. The couple have a 10-year old son, Matthew, and a six-year old son, Brandon.

2008 REVIEW



The Armstrong Atlantic State baseball squad notched a 29th straight winning season by going 27-23 overall, while going 14-13 in the Peach Belt and advancing to the PBC Tournament. The Pirates have been a part of the league's six-team field each year since the league brought back the tournament in 2006.

Playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation, the Pirates started off the season by hosting weekend series against three consecutive opponents ranked in the top 10 in the nation. AASU began by sweeping No. 3-ranked Florida Southern in three games, including a thrilling 7-6 win in 11 innings on Feb. 2. The Pirates then took three from



No. 6 Southern Indiana, and won two of three from No. 8 GCSU. Along the way, AASU would also defeat ranked squads Francis Marion, California (Pa.), Erskine and USC Aiken. In all, 29 of the Pirates' 50 games played in 2008 were against teams ranked in the Collegiate Baseball Top 30 poll at the time the games were played. After the Pirates' impressive start, AASU peaked in the national poll at No. 8.

Sophomore Josh Wilson improved on his stellar debut season by earning NCBWA and ABCA All-South Atlantic Region honors and honorable mention NCBWA All-American honors, hitting .408 with seven home runs and 32 RBI. Wilson's .408 average is the seventh highest in a single season in AASU baseball history.

Senior catcher Chris Smith earned All-South Atlantic Region honors as a designated hitter, hitting .365 with two home runs and 24 RBI. Senior Derrek Miller was named the PBC's Player of the Week on February 12, while senior **Joey Davis** was named the league's Player of the Week on May 5. Junior lefthander Cody Walden earned PBC Pitcher of the Week honors on May 5.

Davis turned in an outstanding senior season, hitting .332 with team-high 13 home runs and 55 RBI, while also setting a PBC record by blasting three grand slams in one year - including two in consecutive at-bats in the Pirates' series against North Georgia.

Senior **Ross Partee** led the starting staff with a 7-4 record and a 4.06 ERA, while senior Nate Herder went 1-1 with a save in his final year as a Pirate. Sophomore Brandon McCreery stabilized the Pirates' bullpen in his first year with AASU, going 3-2 with seven saves and a 1.45 ERA.

Junior shortstop Juan Dorado led NCAA Division II in sacrifice hits at .40 per game, AASU's first individual statistical champion since 1994. As a team, the Pirates also led the Peach Belt in sacrifice hits with 51.



Two-time All-America in 1989 and 1990. Chad led the Pirates to two No. 1 rankings. The epitome of a leadoff hitter, Armstrong reached base in all 56 games the Pirates played in 1990.



CHARLIE BROAD (1995)

The first player to have his number retired (#13), Charlie concluded a four-year career in 1987 with 25 school records and still is the Pirates' all-time leader in career hits, runs scored and runs batted in.

TOMMY BUMGARDNER (1999)

AASU's all-time leader in innings pitched, Tommy's 11 career shutouts are still the second most in NCAA Division II history. AASU's second baseball All-America honoree, Tommy pitched from 1973-76.



TOMMY & BOBBY CANNON (2000)

Two-sport stars (basketball) for the Pirates in 1966 and 1967, Tommy and Bobby were each All-Conference honorees in 1967.



CHUCK CHRISTOPHER (2002)

AASU's all-time strikeout leader, Christopher pitched from 1985-1987, facing primarily Division I competition, and compiled a 27-9 career record. He still holds eight current AASU pitching records.



BILL GEARHART (1997)

The only AASU player to be drafted twice, Bill pitched for the Pirates in 1987 and 1988, compiling a 22-3 career record. He was the Big South Conference's Pitcher of the year in 1987 when he went 10-0.



The Pirates' most decorated power hitter, Dana played in 1987 and 1988 and still holds the AASU record for most home runs in a career (39) and season (28). DII All-America honoree in 1988.



MARK MAMALAKIS (2001)

A 16-year-old freshman in 1970, Mark played four years for the Pirates and was the team MVP in 1971 and an NAIA All-District player in 1973. He still holds the record for steals in one game (7).





STEVE McNeill (1998)

AASU's first All-America baseball player, Steve earned honorable mention All-America honors in 1973 and still holds the school record for best batting average in a single season (.451, 1972).



MIKE MITCHENER (1996)

The highest draft pick ever in AASU history, Mitchener left the Pirates as a junior in 1988 after being taken in the third round by the Chicago White Sox. First-team DII All-America honoree in 1988 and his #25 was retired in 2004.



DANNY SIMS (1995)

Two-sport star and President's Cup winner as a senior in 1968. leading the Pirates in hitting (.322). Danny played basketball and baseball while AASU made the transition from junior college to four-year school.



DR. ROY SIMS (1996)

Long-time coach and administrator for Armstrong, Dr. Sims coached the baseball team from the late 50s to 1967, then served as the Athletic Director twice, from 1955-67 and 1977-86.





BRAD SQUIBB (2004)

Two-time All-America first baseman for the Pirates in 1989-90, Squibb helped the Pirates to two World Series appearances and still holds the NCAA record for total bases in a postseason game (15).



Tony Yeomans (2003)

A four-year standout for the Pirates from 1981-84, Yeomans was a career .325 hitter who still holds six hitting records at AASU, including most games played and at-bats.

ADAM BERNERO: AASU'S FIRST MAJOR LEAGUER



(Excerpts from L.A. Times story "From Freckles to Faastballs: Making It To 'The Show'" by Robin Abcarian; August 6, 2000)

Adam Bernero was once a little boy with red hair and freckles, watching baseball games, fantasizing in the stands about being out there on the mound, under the stadium lights, striking out the sluggers, one-twothree, boom.

On Tuesday night in Anaheim, Bernero, a long-limbed and graceful 23-year-old, stood on the mound in the glare of the lights, wearing the subtle gray road uniform of a Detroit Tiger. Called up from the Toledo Mud Hens so fast his name wasn't even PLAYER FROM THE 1999 SIGNING in the printed program, he struck out his first major league hitter, the Angels' Darin Erstad, one, two . . . well, actually, it took nine of Adam's versatile pitches.

In a middling seat somewhere between the Tigers' dugout and the con-

cession stand, sat a little boy with red hair and freckles happily watching Bernero's abrupt major league debut. Scattered around the boy-who was looking forward to meeting the pitcher later, because after all, someone like Adam sure makes it easier to have red hair and freckles when you're a kid-were those who love Adam Bernero most, his mother, his father, his first stepmother and her second husband, his second and current stepmother, his aunts, step-aunts, uncles, step-uncles, grandparents, step-grandparents, his agent, his college pitching coach, his old girlfriend and his new girlfriend, all of them watching some version of their own dreams come true before their very eyes.

Yes, you do almost need a scorecard to figure out this 21st century American family. And if life seemed complicated before for Adam Bernero, what with so many households containing people who consider him a son, think of how it will be now that he is pitching in the bigs, with an annual salary that, fast as one of his 95 mph pitches, has zoomed from \$8,000 to \$200,000. The speed of his ascent from farm leagues to majors-14 months-is rare, even at a time when the ranks of respectable pitchers are painfully thin.

Always big for his age, Adam, at 6 feet 4, is a broad-shouldered, narrow-hipped, 204-pound hunk. As if his life weren't dramatic enough right now, a subplot was churning as the two girlfriends, tall and gorgeous young women, one blond, one brunette, not only hung

on every one of the 77 pitches he hurled through five-plus innings, but found themselves in uncomfortable proximity, repelling each other like two identical magnetic poles. They hardly looked at each other as they waited for the young man to return to the DoubleTree hotel for a postgame family bash.

Waited and waited, actually. Although the game ended around 10:30 p.m., Adam, who grew up in Sacramento, was delayed. The team shuttle, it seems, had driven off from Edison Field, leaving the starting pitcher behind. Long after everyone expected Adam, his old girlfriend's cell phone rang.

"Can someone give me a ride?" he pleaded. Everything else he imparted during the call, 21-year-old April Crow of Savannah, Ga., said saucily as she drove off with Adam's agent and college coach to fetch him, "is between me and Adam.'

"The story he'll be stuck with," said Susan, "is that he signed his first

contract on a napkin.' It's a rather romantic story, really, and one that, as it turns out, is true. As Adam's college pitching coach tells it, he, Adam and a Tigers scout named Gary York were having dinner after a college tournament in Florida last year. York was anxious to get a commitment from Adam, a fifth-year senior, since other teams, notably the Braves, were sniffing around.

York didn't have a contract with him, said Calvain Culberson, assistant baseball coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University in Savannah, Ga. "So he took a napkin and said, 'This isn't real legal like, but it'll do for now.'" York, he said, wrote "something like, 'I, Adam Bernero, agree to sign with the Detroit Tigers ... here at this Denny's in Jacksonville, Fla., and we agree to set a fee of \$8,000." York had offered \$6,000; Culberson suggested the higher amount.

"Mr. York slid him the napkin and Adam signed it and he said, 'Congratulations, you're a Detroit Tiger.'

Culberson, who kept his promise to Adam that he'd be there for his major league debut, said his biggest challenge with Adam was convincing him that the major

leagues were within his grasp.
"I told him this last night," Culberson said Wednesday, "the only thing you gotta realize now is that you belong here.

DIAMOND CLASSIC/GREAT



From 1989 through 2004, the Diamond Classic / Great Savannah Shootout brought some of the nation's best collegiate baseball players to the Coastal Empire area.

The 2004 version of the classic was a matchup of three top NCAA Division II programs in the last 15 years as Florida Southern and Missouri-St. Louis joined Armstrong Altantic State at Pirate Field for five games - three of which were decided by just one run.

AASU and Florida Southern began the Classic with a 7-6 thriller that saw the Mocs plate four runs in the top of the ninth inning before Pirate reliever Brett Hart struck out Mocs center fielder Gilbert Martinez with the tying run on third base to end the game.

Florida Southern defeated Missouri-St. Louis, 12-3, and the Pirates knocked off the Rivermen, 17-5, in the second day of action, but that just served to set up a fantastic final day of action.

Missouri-St. Louis scored five runs in the fifth inning to take a 6-0 lead over the Mocs, then held on for a 6-5 win over Florida Southern for its first win in the Classic.

Florida Southern fell behind again in the Classic finale, entering the ninth inning down 6-4, but after two singles and an error brought home one run, Matt Joyce laced a two-out, two-run double that gave the Mocs a 7-6 win over the Pirates.

The 2004 Classic followed on the heels of the previous version which saw preseason No. 1 Georgia Tech, Michigan and Rider join AASU in the 2003 Diamond Classic. Georgia Tech defeated Rider in the opening game of the Classic on Friday afternoon, 8-1. The host Pirates then made a second successful opening by knocking off Michigan, 11-4, thanks to a seven-run eighth inning that snapped a 4-4 tie.

After weather forced the cancellation of one game on Saturday, fans were treated to a tripleheader on the Classic's final day. Michigan blasted Rider, 15-1, then engaged top-ranked Georgia Tech in a thriller that went down to the wire - literally - as Georgia Tech won in the bottom of the ninth inning after the Wolverines had tied up the game, 6-6, in the top of the ninth. GT shortstop Tyler Greene rapped a one-out single to give the Yellowjackets the victory.

The final game of the Classic pitted two undefeated teams in AASU and Georgia Tech, but the Yellowjackets proved to be too much for the host Pirates, using a five-run fifth inning to break open a close contest and close out the Classic with a 12-4 win.

All in all, Georgia Tech, Michigan and Rider added their names to the impressive list of teams that have now taken part in the Classic in its 16-year odyssey. Georgia Southern, Wake Forest, Georgia, Liberty and others made up the first field back in 1989 and since then, the Citadel, Kentucky, North Carolina State, North Carolina, Vanderbilt and other top Division I schools have taken the field.

Through the years, several future Major League ballplayers have graced the Classic's history and more will be coming as the 2003 Classic field generated 10 picks in the 2003 MLB First-Year Player Draft, highlighted by first-round pick Matt Murton of Georgia Tech, selected by the Boston Red Sox with the 32nd overall selection. Several former major league players have also came through Savannah in the Classic's previous history, including Georgia's Dave Fleming, Kentucky's Rod Bolton, Larry Luebbers, William VanLandingham and Mark Thompson, Georgia Southern's Joey Hamilton and Todd Greene, The Citadel's Tim Jones, Mercer's Mike and Mark Mimbs, NC State's Corey Lee, Adam Everett and Andy Barkett and Wake Forest's Kevin Jarvis.







Dr. Aenchbacher's responsibilities include overseeing the entire athletic department and promoting Armstrong Atlantic State athletics in the community of Savannah.

Dr. Aenchbacher received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1979, where he was a standout student-athlete for the baseball team as a pitcher. He received his Master's degree and Doctorate of Education from the University of Georgia.

Along with his student-athlete experience at AASU, Dr. Aenchbacher also coached the Pirate cross country teams for five years and started the first AASU men's soccer team, which he coached for seven years.

During Dr. Aenchbacher's tenure as athletic director, AASU's athletic programs have had tremendous success in the classroom and on the playing field. Student-athletes at AASU have excelled in academics with 56 percent earning a 3.0 grade point average or better. The overall grade point average of AASU student-athletes is 2.97, higher than the overall institutional GPA. In 2007-08, the AASU athletic department enjoyed unprecedented athletic and academic achievement as the men's and women's tennis teams each captured the NCAA Division II National Championships, while three AASU student-athletes earned ESPN: The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.

Dr. Aenchbacher has been married for 16 years to Michele and together they are the proud parents of two children, Jesse and Lainey. He announced his retirement, effective April 1, 2009, and a national search for a successor is underway.

This Is Armstrong Atlantic State University

Snce its founding in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 268-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System. The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to a 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 2002.

The university offers more than seventy-five academic programs and majors in the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Health Professions, College of Education and School of Computing. The academic community includes approximately 7,000 students and more than 400 faculty members. Enrollment has nearly doubled in the last 15 years, from 3,700 students in 1990 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's





growth can be found in its facilities. Recently completed projects include the nearly 30,000 square foot Armstrong Center for Continuing Education and Community Engagement, which opened this fall; a \$5 million dollar renovation of the Lane Library; a brand new Student Recreation Facility and a 14,500 square foot Dental Hygiene clinic and Communicative Disorders Center. Campus life is abundant with Compass Point, University Crossings and University Terrace offering on-campus, two- and four-bedroom furnished apartments for 856 students.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. Construction of a women's fieldhouse for soccer and softball was completed in the spring of 2007.

AASU sponsors ten intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991. Women's soccer and women's golf debuted in 2005-06, joining men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, men's and women's tennis, men's golf and softball as sports that AASU sponsors. In 2007-08, the AASU men's and women's tennis teams each captured NCAA Division II

National Championships, becoming just the second school in NCAA history to win both titles in the same year.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and nontraditional students. Forty-three percent of AASU's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.
