Armstrong has had 22 All-Americans and 21 Hon. Mention All-Americans in 24 years? Armstrong is one of **4 Peach Belt** schools to have won **4** conference championships since 1992? Armstrong has had **150** of its players graduate in **26** years? Armstrong baseball players carried a cumulative 3.03 GPA for the past 14 years? Armstrong has posted 40 win seasons 13 times since 1981 and 33-win years 26 times? Armstrong was No. 1 in NCAA DII total attendance in 2002 with 14,516? ## 2012 Season Preview

The Armstrong Atlantic State baseball squad expects to compete once again for a Peach Belt Conference title and a berth in the NCAA DII Baseball Championships. The Pirates once again will play one of the nation's toughest schedules, as the Pirates will open the season playing four straight weekend series against teams that advanced to the NCAA Championships in 2011 - CIAA tournament champion Winston-Salem State, WVIAC tournament champion Concord, Southern Indiana and Columbus State. In all, the Pirates will play 19 games against teams that participated in the NCAA tournament a year ago and Armstrong will face seven teams ranked in Collegiate Baseball's preseason poll in 2012 - No. 2 FMU, No. 15 CSU, No. 19 UNCP, No. 21 Southern Indiana, No. 23 Georgia College, No. 35 North Georgia and No. 39 California (Pa.).

Armstrong returns six starters from 2011, including All-PBC and All-Region catcher **John Roberts**, who hit a team-best .355 in 2011. The Pirates also return their entire starting infield with junior first baseman Chris Zittrouer, senior second baseman Mike Barnhill, senior shortstop Alex Frederick and senior third baseman Drew Walker all slated to start again in 2012. Sophomore Will Thomas returns to back up in the middle infield as well and sophomore Clayton Miller will back up Roberts and see time at DH.

The outfield will be brand new for the Pirates after graduating four-year starting center fielder Michael Price and PBC Scholar Athlete of the Year Josh Heath. Junior lefty Zach Taylor and junior Richie Anderson, as well as returning sophomore Cody Powell will have first shot at the corner outfield positions while junior Arizona native Casey Maloney will

attempt to step in and fill the void left by Price in center field. Sophomore Tanner Jones returns as well.

The pitching staff returns All-PBC and All-Southeast Region starter **Scott Strickland** and eight-game winning lefthander Chandler Hall, but will be without the services of seven-game winner Chris Base for 2012 due to surgery. Senior Travis Morris returns in the closer's role while the bullpen is bolstered by the return of righthanders Eric Fowler and Jesse Osborne.

The other conference rotation slots will be filled by 6-7 sophomore transfer Ethan Bader with sophomore Coastal Carolina transfer Jimmy Coughlin also getting a starting slot. The pen is as deep as it has ever been from the left side with both Coughlin and Hall available, as well as junior transfer Ross Beach and freshmen Chess Malone and Joey Lupus..

Armstrong has been picked to finish fifth in the PBC in a preseason poll of the league's coaches, behind

Francis Marion, Columbus State and Georgia College. Roberts and Walker were named preseason All-PBC honorees, while Strickland and Roberts were preseason Collegiate Baseball All-American picks. Walker was named a Preseason Player to Watch and Bader a Newcomer to Watch by the publication as well.

## JOE ROBERTS HEAD BASEBALL COACH

Joe Roberts begins his 33rd year at the helm of Armstrong Atlantic State baseball. While at Armstrong, Roberts has posted an overall 1,250-607 (.673) record while averaging around 40 wins per year and posting 32 consecutive winning seasons. He currently ranks as the leading active Division II coach and second all-time in wins.

During his career, the Pirates have become a perennial contender in NCAA DII baseball. Armstrong is second only to Florida Southern in NCAA DII baseball victories since his arrival at then-Armstrong State in 1980, and at one point the Pirates were ranked in 110 straight polls over seven seasons.

The Pirates advanced to the NCAA DII World Series in 1988, 1989 and 1994, with their 1990 squad ranked No. 1 nationally in every week of the season.

Coach Roberts has been selected for a coach of the year award eight times, including Region coach of the year awards in all three seasons that the Pirates advanced to the NCAA DII World Series. The Pirates have had players sign professionally in 28 straight years and Armstrong has also graduated 150 of its players in the last 26 years, despite its small rosters.

Roberts was a four-sport letterman at Lebanon (Ind.) HS before attending Lake Sumter CC in Leesburg, Fla. He finished his career at St. Andrew's Presbyterian College in Laurinburg, N.C., where he was again a four sport letterman and a basketball standout, setting several school, league and NCAA records during a two year career that saw him named All-Conference twice. He was selected Dixie MVP in his junior year of 1974 and was inducted into the St. Andrews Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

The 2010 year was significant for Coach Roberts in two respects as he was only the fifth college baseball coach ever inducted into the Georgia Dugout Hall of Fame, while he served as the ABCA President. He is married to the former Lynn Tucker and they have two sons, Brian and Eric.

## CALVAIN CULBERSON ASSISTANT BASEBALL COACH

Calvain Culberson will be in his 17th season as a full-time assistant coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University, after completing an eight-year professional baseball career. Calvain is no stranger to Armstrong, having played for the Pirates from 1985-1988, and having assisted coach Roberts in a part-time role during his professional career.

Calvain's coaching role at Armstrong includes working with the outfielders and pitchers, and assisting with baserunning and hitting instruction. While working with Armstrong's pitchers, Culberson has instructed several players who have, like him, enjoyed professional success. Righthander Adam

Bernero, who Culberson coached during the 1999 season, reached the major leagues in just 15 months, becoming Armstrong's first major league player. Another Culberson pupil, Doug Sessions, was a AAA All-Star for the New Orleans Zephyrs in 2003 while pitching in the Houston organization while Jeremy Horst ascended to the Major Leagues during the summer of 2011 with the Cincinnati Reds.

Culberson finished his pro career in 1995 at Pawtucket, a triple-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. He had joined the Red Sox organization as a free agent after having pitched at Double-A Chattanooga and Triple A Indianapolis in the Cincinnati Reds farm chain. Calvain began his pro career in 1989 in the Atlanta Braves farm system, hitting .313 in his first season, then continuing as a pitcher.

During Culberson's Armstrong career, the Pirates posted an overall 181-66 (.733) record, with Calvain hitting in the leadoff spot his final three years. The Rome, Georgia native holds seven school records with the most notable being his 32-game hitting streak (1988) and his 128 career stolen bases.

Calvain was an all-Big South Conference selection in 1986 and 1987 when Armstrong was playing NCAA I baseball. In his last season with the Pirates he was an Armstrong co-captain and was chosen as a member of the all-South Atlantic Region team and an honorable mention DII All-American. Culberson was inducted into the Armstrong Athletics Hall of Fame in 2011.

Calvain is married to the former Pamela Johnson of Port Wentworth, an Armstrong graduate, who works as a System Analyst II for Armstrong. The couple have an 14-year old son, Matthew, and a nine-year old son, Brandon.



## 2011 REVIEW

The The Armstrong Atlantic State baseball squad notched its 32nd-straight winning season in 2011, advancing to the Peach Belt Conference tournament semifinals and finishing the year ranked No. 23 in the final *Collegiate Baseball* Division II Top 30 coaches' poll.

The Pirates earned a reputation for come-frombehind wins early in the season, beginning with senior Michael Price's walk-off RBI double in the bottom of the ninth for a 3-2 win over defending NCAA Division II champion Southern Indiana, giving Armstrong the series win over the Screaming Eagles.

Armstrong trailed Missouri-St. Louis, 7-1, on Feb. 26 but rallied for a 10-8 win over the Tritons, and the Pirates overcame a 7-3 deficit in the bottom of the ninth with five runs to knock off Lander, 8-7, on March 18. The Pirates also recorded come-from-behind road PBC wins over Montevallo and USC Aiken.

The Pirates went into the PBC Tournament as the second seed out of the East Division and after dropping the opening game to North Georgia, used strong pitching performances from seniors Scott Strickland and Trent Landa to advance to the semifinals. Strickland beat Columbus State, 8-4, in an elimination game on Friday then Landa hurled a masterful fourhit complete game 3-1 win over Lander in Saturday's second elimination game. Pitching ran out for the Pirates late Saturday as Armstrong fell to eventual tournament champion UNC Pembroke, 20-17.

The keys to the Pirates' success in 2011 came down to pitching, defense and small ball. Armstrong's team ERA in 2011 was 3.33, a full two runs better than 2010, while Armstrong

defensively led the nation in double plays and ranked 12th in fielding percentage. The Pirates also led the nation in sacrifice hits for the second time in the last three seasons.

Price finished his four-year career for Armstrong earning an ABCA All-Southeast Region gold glove honor while leading DII in sacrifice hits with 28. Senior Josh Heath ranked among the league's leaders in sacrifice hits and walks while earning 2010-11 PBC Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors. Senior Trent Landa earned PBC All-Tournament honors while fellow seniors Jonathan Fulghum, Blake Culberson and Drew Carnes also finished up their careers.

Junior catcher John Roberts and junior pitcher Scott Strickland each fashioned All-PBC and All-Southeast Region honors in 2011 and lead a core group of 15 players who return to play for the Pirates in 2012.





# ARMSTRONG ATHLETIC HALL OF FAMERS



**CHAD ARMSTRONG** (2000) Two-time All-America in 1989 and 1990, Chad led the Pirates to two No. 1 rankings. The epitome of a leadoff hitter, Armstrong reached base in all 56 games the Pirates played in 1990.

# TOMMY BUMGARDNER (1999)

Armstrong's all-time leader in innings pitched, Tommy's 11 career shutouts are still the second most in NCAA Division II history. Armstrong's second baseball All-America honoree, Tommy pitched from 1973-76.





CHUCK CHRISTOPHER (2002) Armstrong's all-time strikeout leader, Christopher pitched from 1985-1987, facing primarily Division I competition, and compiled a 27-9 career record. He still holds eight current Armstrong pitching records.

BILL GEARHART (1997) The only Armstrong player to be drafted twice, Bill pitched for the Pirates in 1987 and 1988, going 22-3. He was the Big South Conference's Pitcher of the year in 1987 when he went 10-0.





MARK MAMALAKIS (2001) A 16-year-old freshman in 1970, Mark played four years for the Pirates and was the team MVP in 1971 and an NAIA All-District player in 1973. He still holds the record for steals in one game (7).

### MIKE MITCHENER (1996)

The highest draft pick ever in Armstrong history, Mitchener left the Pirates as a junior in 1988 after being taken in the third round by the Chicago White Sox. First-team DII All-America honoree in 1988 and his #25 was retired in 2004.





**BRAD SQUIBB (2004)** Two-time All-America first baseman for the Pirates in 1989-90, Squibb helped the Pirates to two World Series appearances and still holds the NCAA record for total bases in a postseason game (15).

### CHARLIE BROAD (1995)

The first player to have his number retired (#13), Charlie concluded a four-year career in 1987 with 25 school records and still is the Pirates' all-time leader in career hits, runs scored and runs batted in.

TOMMY E BOBBY CANNON (2000)



Two-sport stars (basketball) for the Pirates in 1966 and 1967, Tommy and Bobby were each All-Conference honorees in 1967.



CALVAIN CULBERSON (2011) Culberson was a two-time All-Big South Conference player and a DII All-American as a senior. The current assistant coach at Armstrong, Culberson holds seven school records, including stolen bases (128).

DANA HARDING (2001) The Pirates' most decorated power hitter, Dana played in 1987 and 1988 and still holds the AASU record for most home runs in a career (39) and season (28). DII All-America honoree in 1988.





**STEVE MCNEILL (1998)** Armstrong's first All-America baseball player, Steve earned honorable mention All-America honors in 1973 and still holds the school record for best batting average in a single season (.451, 1972).

# DANNY SIMS (1995)

Two-sport star and President's Cup winner as a senior in 1968, leading the Pirates in hitting (.322). Danny played basketball and baseball for the Pirates.



DR ROY SIMS (1996) Long-time coach and administrator for Armstrong, Dr. Sims coached the baseball team from the late 50s to 1967, then served as the Athletic Director twice, from 1955-67 and 1977-86.

**TONY YEOMANS (2003)** A four-year standout for the Pirates from 1981-84, Yeomans was a career .325 hitter who still holds six hitting records at Armstrong, including most games played and at-bats.



# ADAM BERNERO: ARMSTRONG'S FIRST MAJOR LEAGUER

(Excerpts from L.A. Times story "From Freckles to Faastballs: Making It To 'The Show'" by Robin Abcarian; August 6, 2000)

Adam Bernero was once a little boy with red hair and freckles, watching baseball games, fantasizing in the stands about being out there on the mound, under the stadium lights, striking out the sluggers, one-twothree, boom.

On Tuesday night in Anaheim, Bernero, a long-limbed and graceful 23-year-old, stood on the mound in the glare of the lights, wearing the subtle gray road uniform of a Detroit Tiger. Called up from the Toledo Mud Hens so fast his name wasn't even PLAYER FROM THE 1999 SIGNING in the printed program, he struck out his first major league hitter, the Angels' Darin Erstad, one, two . . . well, actually, it took nine of Adam's versatile pitches.

In a middling seat somewhere between the Tigers' dugout and the con-

cession stand, sat a little boy with red hair and freckles happily watching Bernero's abrupt major league debut. Scattered around the boy-who was looking forward to meeting the pitcher later, because after all, someone like Adam sure makes it easier to have red hair and freckles when you're a kid-were those who love Adam Bernero most, his mother, his father, his first stepmother and her second husband, his second and current stepmother, his aunts, step-aunts, uncles, step-uncles, grandparents, step-grandparents, his agent, his college pitching coach, his old girlfriend and his new girlfriend, all of them watching some version of their own dreams come true before their very eyes.

Yes, you do almost need a scorecard to figure out this 21st century American family. And if life seemed complicated before for Adam Bernero, what with so many households containing people who consider him a son, think of how it will be now that he is pitching in the bigs, with an annual salary that, fast as one of his 95 mph pitches, has zoomed from \$8,000 to \$200,000. The speed of his ascent from farm leagues to majors-14 months-is rare, even at a time when the ranks of respectable pitchers are painfully thin.

Always big for his age, Adam, at 6 feet 4, is a broad-shouldered, narrow-hipped, 204-pound hunk. As if his life weren't dramatic enough right now, a subplot was churning as the two girlfriends, tall and gorgeous young women, one blond, one brunette, not only hung

on every one of the 77 pitches he hurled through five-plus innings, but found themselves in uncomfortable proximity, repelling each other like two identical magnetic poles. They hardly looked at each other as they waited for the young man to return to the DoubleTree hotel for a postgame family bash.

Waited and waited, actually.

Although the game ended around 10:30 p.m., Adam, who grew up in Sacramento, was delayed. The team shuttle, it seems, had driven off from Edison Field, leaving the starting pitcher behind. Long after everyone expected Adam, his old girlfriend's cell phone rang.

"Can someone give me a ride?" he pleaded. Everything else he imparted during the call, 21-year-old April Crow of Savannah, Ga., said saucily as she drove off with Adam's agent and college coach to fetch him, "is between me and Adam.'

"The story he'll be stuck with," said Susan, "is that he signed his first

contract on a napkin."

It's a rather romantic story, really, and one that, as it turns out, is true. As Adam's college pitching coach tells it, he, Adam and a Tigers scout named Gary York were having dinner after a college tournament in Florida last year. York was anxious to get a commitment from Adam, a fifth-year senior, since other teams, notably the Braves, were sniffing around.

York didn't have a contract with him, said Calvain Culberson, assistant baseball coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University in Savannah, Ga. "So he took a napkin and said, 'This isn't real legal like, but it'll do for now.' "York, he said, wrote "something like, 'I, Adam Bernero, agree to sign with the Detroit Tigers ... here at this Denny's in Jacksonville, Fla., and we agree to set a fee of \$8,000.' "York had offered \$6,000; Culberson suggested the higher amount.

"Mr. York slid him the napkin and Adam signed it and he said, 'Congratulations, you're a Detroit Tiger.'

Culberson, who kept his promise to Adam that he'd be there for his major league debut, said his biggest challenge with Adam was convincing him that the major

leagues were within his grasp. "I told him this last night," Culberson said Wednesday, "the only thing you gotta realize now is that you belong here.3

# JEREMY HORST MAKES MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT IN MAY, 2011

Just mere hours after officially joining the Cincinnati Reds active roster, former Armstrong Atlantic State University pitcher Jeremy Horst made his major league debut against the Atlanta Braves on Saturday evening at Turner Field - and it was quite a memorable one.

Entering the game with the score tied 5-5 in the fourth inning, Horst immediately struck out Jordan Schafer, then one out later, struck out Chipper Jones to work a 1-2-3 first inning of major league work.

It was the top half of the fifth that made things more memorable for the former Pirate, however, as Horst came to the plate and stroked an RBI single through the right side for a hit in his first major league at-bat, giving the Reds a 6-5 lead.

In the bottom half of the fifth inning, Horst fell victim to All-Star catcher Brian McCann, who hit a solo

home run off of him to tie the game back up at 6-all. Horst was relieved in the sixth inning with a runner

on third and two out, giving him the impressive line of 2 2/3 innings pitched and two hits given up, striking out four.

Horst was selected in the 2007 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Reds in the 21st round. In his two years with the Pirates in 2006 and 2007, the 6-3, 220-pound lefthander went 8-2 with 102 strikeouts in 96.2 innings pitched after joining Armstrong from Iowa Western CC.

The Burlington, N.D., native excelled at every level of the minors for the Reds organization since being drafted, culminating in his outstanding 2011 season trhough the callup. Pitching for the AAA Louisville Bats, Horst went 0-1 with a 1.73 ERA in 12 games, giving up just 16 hits in 26 innings pitched, walking nine and striking out 23 before joining the Reds.

Horst joins former Armstrong hurler and eight-year major leaguer Adam Bernero as the only Pirates to earn a ticket to the big leagues. Bernero made his major league debut in 2000 - just 15 months after being signed

as a free agent by the Detroit Tigers. The Pirates have had six players in all play at least the AAA level in the last decade - along with Horst and Bernero, pitchers Doug Sessions, Jeremy Wedel and Jason Olson, as well as catcher Andrew Graham have all reached the penultimate level of pro baseball. A seventh, Armstrong signee Dustin McGowan, has spent time over the last six years with the Toronto Blue Jays.

Success for former Pirates also extends internationally as former Armstrong pitcher Leon Boyd reprepresented the Netherlands in both the 2008 Beijing Olympics, the 2009 World Baseball Classic and the 2011 Baseball World Cup, won by the Dutch. Graham also represented his native Australia in the World Baseball Classic.

Horst was sent back down to Louisville but received a late-season

callup and finished the 2011 season with the Reds, pitching in 12 games and posting a 2.93 ERA, giving up 18 hits in 15 1/3 innings pitched, walking six while striking out nine.

2012 will bring a change in uniforms for Horst as he was traded to the Philadelphia Phillies for utility infielder Wilson Valdez on January 25th. Horst will be in big league camp with the Phillies in February.







# DIAMOND CLASSIC/GREAT

From 1989 through 2004, the Diamond Classic / Great Savannah Shootout brought some of the nation's best collegiate baseball players to the Coastal Empire area.

The 2004 version of the classic was a matchup of three top NCAA Division II programs in the last 15 years as Florida Southern and Missouri-St. Louis joined Armstrong Altantic State at Pirate Field for five games - three of which were decided by just one run.

AASU and Florida Southern began the Classic with a 7-6 thriller that saw the Mocs plate four runs in the top of the ninth inning before Pirate reliever Brett Hart struck out Mocs center fielder Gilbert Martinez with the tying run on third base to end the game.

Florida Southern defeated Missouri-St. Louis, 12-3, and the Pirates knocked off the Rivermen, 17-5, in the second day of action, but that just served to set up a fantastic final day of action.

Missouri-St. Louis scored five runs in the fifth inning to take a 6-0 lead over the Mocs, then held on for a 6-5 win over Florida Southern for its first win in the Classic.

Florida Southern fell behind again in the Classic finale, entering the ninth inning down 6-4, but after two singles and an error brought home one run, Matt Joyce laced a two-out, two-run double that gave the Mocs a 7-6 win over the Pirates.

The 2004 Classic followed on the heels of the previous version which saw preseason No. 1 Georgia Tech, Michigan and Rider join AASU in the 2003 Diamond Classic. Georgia Tech defeated Rider in the opening game of the Classic on Friday afternoon, 8-1. The host Pirates then made a second successful opening by knocking off Michigan, 11-4, thanks to a seven-run eighth inning that snapped a 4-4 tie.

After weather forced the cancellation of one game on Saturday, fans were treated to a tripleheader on the Classic's final day. Michigan blasted Rider, 15-1, then engaged top-ranked Georgia Tech in a thriller that went down to the wire - literally - as Georgia Tech won in the bottom of the ninth inning after the Wolverines had tied up the game, 6-6, in the top of the ninth. GT shortstop Tyler Greene rapped a one-out single to give the Yellowjackets the victory. The final game of the Classic pitted two undefeated teams in AASU and Georgia Tech, but the Yellowjackets proved to be too much for the host Pirates, using a five-run fifth inning to break open a close contest and close out the Classic with a 12-4 win.


All in all, Georgia Tech, Michigan and Rider added their names to the impressive list of teams that have now taken part in the Classic in its 16-year odyssey. Georgia Southern, Wake Forest, Georgia, Liberty and others made up the first field back in 1989 and since then, the Citadel, Kentucky, North Carolina State, North Carolina, Vanderbilt and other top Division I schools have taken the

#### field.

Through the years, several future Major League ballplayers have graced the Classic's history and more will be coming as the 2003 Classic field generated 10 picks in the 2003 MLB First-Year Player Draft, highlighted by first-round pick Matt Murton of Georgia Tech, selected by the Boston Red Sox with the 32<sup>nd</sup> overall selection. Several former major league players have also came through Savannah in the Classic's previous history, including Georgia's Dave Fleming, Kentucky's Rod Bolton, Larry Luebbers, William VanLandingham and Mark Thompson, Georgia Southern's Joey Hamilton and Todd Greene, The J.D. # Dr. Linda Bleicken University President

Dr. Linda M. Bleicken joined Armstrong in 2009 after serving at Georgia Southern for 19 years. She is the seventh Armstrong president and the first woman to lead the institution since the establishment of Armstrong Junior College in 1935.

A woman with deep roots in Iowa farm country, Bleicken began her career at Georgia Southern as an assistant professor of management in 1990. Over the following years she would serve as acting chair of the department of management, associate dean of the College of Business Administration, vice president for student affairs, acting provost and vice president for academic affairs and lastly provost, a position she held since 2005.

A marketing major from Georgia State University who graduated magna cum laude, Bleicken's experiences in the business arena include a foray into real estate in Atlanta as owner and manager of residential properties and serving as a sales representative for Innerface International. She also spent two years in marketing research for BellSouth and Brittain Associates, both in Atlanta.

It was her experiences in marketing research that led her back to higher education. In 1987, she chose to continue her education in a university campus, this time as a teaching instructor at her alma mater, Georgia State University. Three years later she earned her academic credentials, a master's and Ph.D. in management, once again from Georgia State.

A long-time resident of Savannah—she commuted to Georgia Southern all those years—Bleicken knows and cares deeply about Savannah and the Coastal Georgia region. She has served on the Ossabaw Island Foundation Board since 2007 and been involved with the Savannah Downtown Neighborhood Association.



# LISA SWEANY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Lisa M. Sweany begins her first season as Director of Athletics at Armstrong Atlantic State University for the 2011-12 academic year.

Sweany brings to Armstrong extensive experience in NČAA Division II athletics, including more than 10 years with the premiere Division II program at GVSU. Since being named senior associate athletics director in 2007, she has been responsible for budget, personnel and facilities management. Her duties have included direct supervision of seven coaches, overseeing game and event operations, as well as management of all athletics personnel. In addition, she coordinated all aspects of compliance and eligibility for more than 500 student athletes.

She actively researched and implemented a plan to offer women's lacrosse as GVSU's 20th varsity sport. She has served on the GLIAC Executive Council, the Irwin Club Advisory Board and the Intercollegiate Athletics Advisory Board.

Prior to joining GVSU, she served at Tri-State University in Angola, Indiana, starting in 1995 as athletics facilities director. During her five-year stint at Tri-State, she served in various capacities of increasing responsibility, including assistant basketball coach, head coach of softball and associate athletics director, a positioned she was named to in March 1995.

Sweany is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators and the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, as well as the first vice president of the CEFMA (Collegiate Event and Facility Management Association) for 2011-12. From 2010, she served as chair of the NCAA Midwest Regional for Softball, helping to oversee rankings in the region. Since 2008, she has served as second vice president and convention planning chair for the Collegiate Event and Facility Management Association, where she was a founding board member.

She holds a master's degree in physical education with a concentration in sports management from Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana and a bachelor's degree with honors in business administration with a concentration in accounting from Tri-State University in Angola, Indiana.

# THIS IS ARMSTRONG ATLANTIC STATE UNIVERSITY

Since iits founding in 1935 - more than 75 years ago - Armstrong Atlantic State University has continued to develop to meet the Savannah community's educational needs. From its first location in Armstrong House in downtown Savannah to its current home on a scenic 268-acre lot off of Abercorn, the university has become one of the finest educational institutions in the Southeastern United States. Last year, Armstrong celebrated its 75th anniversary as a premier institution of higher education in the Coastal Empire.

Armstrong Junior College was established by the Mayor of Savannah and other public officials in 1935. Housed in the beautiful and historic Armstrong House, a gift to the city from the family of George F. Armstrong, Armstrong Junior College grew over the years to occupy eight additional buildings in the Forsyth Park and Monterey Square areas.

In 1959, as Armstrong College of Savannah, it became a two-year unit of the University System. The Board of Regents conferred four-year status on Armstrong in 1964 and the college moved to a 250-acre location, a gift from Donald Livingston and the Mills B. Lane Foundation, in December of 1965. Additional buildings joined the eight original structures as Armstrong added professional and graduate programs and tripled in size.

In July of 1996, the Board of Regents voted to rename the college to Armstrong Atlantic State University to reflect its mission and identity. The university's reputation of excellence is still evident in its dedication to students, with a supportive environment.

Armstrong Atlantic State University was fully accredited as a senior institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in December, 1968, with accreditation retroactive to January 1, 1968, and was last reaccredited in December, 2002.

The university offers more than seventy-five academic programs and majors in the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Health Professions, College of Education and School of Computing. The academic community includes approximately 7,650 students and more than 400 faculty members. Enrollment has more than doubled in the last 20 years,





from 3,700 students in 1990 to its current number.

Across campus, evidence of the university's growth can be found in its facilities. Recently completed projects include the \$31 million Windward Commons, a 567-bed, freshman-dedicated residence hall completed over the summer, which brings the number of students living on campus to more than 1,400, and the new \$16 million, 60,180 square-foot Armstrong Student Union that was built entirely through student fees and opened in fall of 2010.

The athletic department of Armstrong Atlantic State University is housed in the Armstrong Sports Center, completed in 1995. The Sports Center includes offices for the physical education department, training room and weight room areas, basketball courts, indoor track and offices for coaches and athletic department personnel. The building played host to the Peach Belt Conference's basketball tournament in 1998 and 1999 and hosts several in-season tournaments each year. Construction of a women's fieldhouse for soccer and softball was completed in the spring of 2007.

Armstrong sponsors eleven intercollegiate sports and is a charter member of the Peach Belt Conference, formed in 1991. Women's soccer and women's golf debuted in 2005-06 and men's cross country was reinstated in 2009, joining men's and women's basketball, volleyball, baseball, men's and women's tennis, men's golf and softball as sports that Armstrong sponsors. In 2008-09, the Armstrong men's and women's tennis teams each captured

NCAA Division II National Championships for a second straight year, with the women's tennis team earning the "three-peat" of three straight titles in 2010.

Continuing a mission begun in 1935, Armstrong Atlantic State University today serves a rich gamut of traditional and nontraditional students. Forty-three percent of Armstrong's student body are from the Savannah-Chatham area, while others come from around the state, nation and world. All have come to Savannah to experience and thrive on the campus of one of the fastest developing higher learning institutions in the nation - to be a part of Armstrong Atlantic State University.
