1. New ceremony developed to honor Eagles who passed this year

Faculty, staff and students are invited to the inaugural "Eagles Call" ceremonies at 6 p.m. today (Monday, April 18) in Statesboro and tomorrow (Tuesday, April 19) on the Armstrong Campus to honor Georgia Southern students, faculty, staff and alumni who have passed away this academic year.

The memorial ceremony was developed by the Student Government Association, the Dean of Students office and others as a way to annually memorialize "fallen Eagles."

4. Volunteers also needed for Operation Move In

Volunteers assist in getting our students back into the residence halls by meeting and greeting families, answering questions, monitoring elevator traffic, unloading cars, and many other activities that go into moving about 4,000 students into the residence halls in just a few hours! 5. Vaccine shots and boosters remain available on campus

COVID-19 shots continue to be available on campus, and walk-ups can be accommodated. First booster doses are available to anyone 12 years of age or older. Individuals can receive a first booster dose if it has been at least 2 months after the

Johnson & Johnson vaccine or at least 5 months after the second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine. Shots are currently available from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. on the Statesboro Campus, Monday through Friday, at Health Services and on the Armstrong Campus, Wednesday, at the Health Professions Academic Building. Appointments can be scheduled via the MyGS portal by clicking on the "COVID-19 Vaccine Scheduling Form" under the "COVID-19 Information and Resources" tab.

Recently the CDC recommended additional boosters for certain individuals:

- A second booster dose of Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine for individuals 50 years of age or older may be administered at least 4 months after the receipt of their first booster dose of any previously authorized/approved COVID-19 vaccine.
- A second booster dose of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine may be administered to individuals 12 years of age and older with certain immunocompromising conditions at least 4 months after the receipt of their first booster dose of Pfizer.
- A second booster dose of Moderna COVID-19 vaccine may be administered to individuals 18 years of age and older with certain immunocompromising conditions at least 4 months after the receipt of their first booster dose of any previously authorized/approved COVID-19 vaccine.
- Adults who received a primary vaccine and booster dose of Johnson & Johnson at least 4 months ago may now receive a second booster dose of mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna).

6. COVID-19 testing also still available on campus

Georgia Southern continues to partner with Mako Medical to offer both the COVID-19 PCR and rapid antigen tests on the Statesboro and Armstrong campuses for GS faculty, staff and students.

Testing is provided Monday through Friday (9 a.m.-noon; 12:30-4 p.m.) at no cost. On the Armstrong Campus in Savannah, the testing site is located at the Armstrong Center. On the Statesboro Campus, the testing site is located at the Forest Drive Classroom Building.

Appointments will not be scheduled. While walk-ups will be accepted, pre-registration is strongly encouraged. You can pre-register via the COVID-19 testing link on your MyGeorgiaSouthern portal. Once you have pre-registered, you can go to the COVID-19 testing site at your convenience; the system will not generate an appointment for you or send you a reminder email.

Testing in the health centers on both the Armstrong and Statesboro campuses remains available for students who have been evaluated by a campus health services medical provider. Students who desire an evaluation by a campus medical provider can schedule an appointment via their online health portal.
