>>>Georgia Southern Now Home to Three Free COVID-19 PCR Testing Kiosks

The Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) has placed three COVID-19 testing kiosks on Georgia Southern University's campuses in Statesboro, Hinesville and Savannah, allowing access to free COVID-19 testing 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The testing kiosks are located in central locations, including outside the Student Union on the Armstrong Campus, in the alcove that faces Memorial Drive on the Liberty Campus, and outside the University Bookstore on the Statesboro Campus.

Pre-registration for testing at the kiosks is not required, but available at https://register.testandgo.com/. The specimens are picked up daily and sent to an accredited lab for PCR testing.
