#### >>> It's time to start working on staff performance evaluations

It's time for electronic performance evaluations for staff employees. Evaluations will be completed through OneUSG Connect's ePerformance module just as they were last year. The period of time being evaluated will be from Jan. 1, 2022 through Dec. 31, 2022.

The evaluation process should conclude by Feb. 28, 2023.

All staff employees who completed their 180 day provisional period by December 31, 2022 should have an annual evaluation completed. Human Resources will be hosting three training sessions and open labs once a week throughout the evaluation period.

#### >>> Green Zone training will be offered next month

#### >>> A new electronic budget amendment form is now available

The University Budget Office has implemented a new <u>Electronic Budget Amendment</u> <u>Form</u> that will replace the paper version and will be routed electronically to budget managers. With the implementation of the electronic form, notifications will come from the Budget Office email (<u>budgetoffice@georgiasouthern.edu</u>) to approve the amendments for any budget you manage. In order to approve the amendment, you will need to follow the link provided in the email you receive. This link will take you directly to the form for you to review the amendment and any back-up documentation attached and approve it.
