**The Iron Horse Will Soon  
Over This Road.**

The grading of the extension of  
the B. & P. railroad has been  
completed from here Register, and  
the laying of iron has begun, and  
before many days have passed,  
the iron horse will be racing from  
Statesboro to Dublin.

It passes through some of the  
best parts of the county, a dis-  
tance of nearly twenty miles, and  
brings the people of the up-  
per section of the county into  
close touch with Statesboro, Sa-  
vannah, and other cities.

The grading has been done in a  
first class manner, and it will be  
one of the best railroad tracks in  
Georgia.

At the completion of this  
road, the people have the railroad  
facilities. The Central strike the  
county along the Northern side,

Statesboro gives a direct route to  
Savannah.

**A GREAT FIRE.**

D. P. Averitt's Planing Mill  
Burned At Mid-day.

Monday, at mid-day, the large  
planing mill, and sawing works  
of D. P. Averitt, located on the  
East-side of town were burned to  
the ground.

A spark fell in a pile of shavings,  
and in a few moments the fire  
was beyond control, and  
spread rapidly, and soon enveloped  
the entire premises.

The planing mill, large  
sawing machine, planing machine,  
moulding machine, shavings, sawdust,  
and burning machinery, and  
door and blind machinery.

Mr. Averitt had erected at large  
cost a dry kiln, and with 75,  
000 feet of good lumber, together  
with a stock of rough lumber, such  
doors etc., was also consumed by  
the devouring flames.

The total loss is nearly \$10,000,  
with not a cent of insurance.

Only about seven years ago,  
Mr. Averitt had the misfortune to  
have been burned out in the same  
way. But his courage and industry  
brought him from the ashes; and  
he has succeeded in building up a  
large and profitable business, and  
furnished most of the lumber and  
builders supplies used in the town.

A large crowd assembled during  
the fire, and kept willing hands,  
until the rapid spread of flames pre-  
vented the saving of but little of  
the material; but nearly houses  
were saved by their heroic work.

Mr. Averitt is undoubtedly as  
his future plans. The blow falls  
so heavy, and the loss is so great  
on him, that he hesitates to again  
enter business which fire on two  
occasions has wiped out.
