

With our current efforts at the **Food Bank**, we've been able to reach at least 50 families per week, while anticipating the demand to increase as furloughed residents increase in the community. We've also been ordering food from **Second Harvest** to reduce the normal contact chain from receiving donations from local grocery stores and community partners. By employing curbside pickup and homebound services, making referrals and administering food assistance would be more accessible to our vulnerable demographics within the current climate. We've been able to collaborated with **Christian Social Ministries**, **Fostering Bulloch**, **Shari Barr**, and **United Way** to service the community.

We've been extremely grateful of the support and donations we've received, such as the assorted supply of fresh produce coordinated by the **Society of St. Andrew Gleaning Network** and the **Southeast Produce Council in Cobbtown**.
