Stricken at Wrong Time.
Montrie, Ga., has suffered the
loss of one of its best and most use-
ful citizens in the death of A. B.
Turner. After an illness of three
weeks he succumbed to typhoid fe-
ver of a malignant type. He was
the son of John Turner, and he
was born in Bulloch county in 1870.
He grew up on a farm, but he was
a natural mechanical genius. He
was married when he was 21. With
his own hands he built a small
house for his wife, and purchasing
the necessary tools he swung on
his sign as a blacksmith and wheel-
wright. He followed his chosen
business there in Bulloch for about
two years when he unfortunately
lost his entire property by fire. He
determined to change his location.
Finally he drifted to Montrie, in
Colquitt county, and built a small
manufacturing plant. In a short
time his business grew and he set
about enlarging his establishment,
which became the best equipped
factory in South Georgia. He made
a specialty of timber cars and tar-
pentine wagons, sending them over
a wide territory in Georgia and
Florida. Mr. Turner had, but a
few weeks before his death, pur-
chased a large lot of the finest ma-
chinery for the manufacture of
sash, doors, blinds, etc., and had
hardly gotten his shops in good run-
ning order when he was taken ill.
He was ambitious as a mechanic,
and ardently desired to be at the
head of the finest manufacturing
plant of its kind in this section of
the country, and had not the grim
destroyer interfered, his wishes
would have been fully realized.
The Press did not know A. B.
Turner, but it is interesting to read
of the struggles of a young man
who succeeded in spite of all on-
stacles, and who, from the small
beginning of a blacksmith shop
branched out into a prosperous
manufacturer. This is the kind of
kind that builds up a town and a
state. There is something pathet-
ic in the fact that just as young
Turner had begun to realize the
dream of his life, to be at the head
of a large manufacturing enter-
prise, he was cut down, called a-
way in the very prime of his youth.

Court House Fight in Bryan.

tract for a building without the
funds in hand, decided that he
had an illegal contract and threw
up his job.
