#### THE TOWN AND LIQUOR

In 1807 the charter of Statesboro was amended so as to "authorize and empower the Mayor and Council to fix the license to sell liquor at not less than \$5000 a year." They can fix it at \$20,000, or a million; but can't fix it below \$5000. The object being, that if the majority of the town desired the sale of liquor, they could elect a mayor and council "in favor of the sale," and fix the license at \$5000. If the town is opposed to the sale, to elect a council who would fix the license above \$5000.

Under this law, the liquor question was placed in the hands of the people of the town. If they see fit to elect a council favorable to the liquor, they have no one to blame but themselves. If they want to keep the town dry, all they have to do, is to elect a council, who will put the license above \$5000. If the present council issue license to sell liquor, it will be because, they fix the license at \$5000. The people of the town elected the present council by a vote of two to one, with their eyes wide open, and it is not likely that the council will take it upon themselves to issue the license, unless they are satisfied a majority of the people want liquor sold. If, as some say, the present council was not elected as wet men, then they should not issue the license. If they were, then they should.

The will of the majority is supreme, and should rule, and if a man does not want to live under the rule of the majority, all he has to do is to move out.

#### Don't Do That, Boys.

Mr. Editor:

From what I see in the papers and hear talked on the streets of Statesboro, and upon the highways and in the homes of the county, I am led to believe that there is really a plan on foot to establish a barroom in Statesboro. Now if this thing is done, every thoughtful person can easily and correctly predict the consequences. It would be detrimental to every other interest, not only of Statesboro, but of the whole county.

Well do I remember when whiskey was sold in Statesboro, and as a consequence, no one, or very few persons, visited the little place except those who were obliged to attend court and a few roughs who went to drink whiskey and have a frolic, and sometimes a fight. There was no church in the place. Only occasionally a preacher would venture to preach in the court house to a few persons. I have heard a preacher say that sometimes he would have to pay his board or ride home some distance for his dinner. It was so demoralized that a school ran there more than a few weeks. Religious and educational interests were at low tide. This was so, not only in Statesboro but in many places in the county.

When a man desired to educate his boys and girls he was forced, by existing conditions, to send them to other counties not so cursed with whiskey. These are facts known by every old resident of the county. This writer was in position to know the educational standing of each county in the state and Bulloch was reckoned in with the most illiterate. But a change has taken place.

In the year 1878, God, in his providence, sent a young man from upper Georgia down to the wiregrass section to lecture on temperance, and what was then called United Friends of Temperance. He organized several lodges in Bulloch county. Soon after that a good lady of this county, who had received her education in another county, wrote an article on temperance, and had it published in a small paper then called the Excelsior by Rev. W. L. Geiger, a Baptist minister of that place. This paper bore the name "Excelsior News," the first paper ever published in the county. Soon after that this writer wrote a series of articles, entitled, "Whiskey and Its Evils," which were published in that paper.

From that time a sentiment in favor of temperance began to take hold upon the people, and, in a few years a strong petition was signed and sent to the legislature asking that an act be passed making the county license \$5,000, which would be out of the reach of a common whiskey seller. The act was passed and as a consequence barrooms ceased to exist, and what is Bulloch today compared to her condition in the days of grog shops? Let us see.

When it was known that Bulloch was rid of the whiskey traffic curse she began to take on new life. Many good and useful citizens came in from other counties and contributed largely to her material and moral growth, and today she ranks as one of the best counties in Georgia. Statesboro has four churches now in a flourishing condition, while the country churches have greatly multiplied and are doing well. The farming interests of the county are far superior to what it was and is rapidly improving while the commercial interests of the county have multiplied five hundred fold.

As to education, she has risen from her stupor, and today, instead of a grog-shop, there is a school house at almost every crossroad, and by the recent establishment of the Institute at Statesboro, she is enabled to educate not only her own youth but many of other counties. Now when we go to our county site, instead of seeing a few lying down drunk, or seeing him, with his coat of soot, sitting upon a blooming rose. Much of it being said and written against angrily, and it is right to do so in severe terms, but an anarchist in our midst would be but a small matter compared to a barroom, which would be the curse in the hands of the devil in sending many souls to hell—the bar tenders and proprietors included. A man who fears not God nor regards man is what I understand to be an anarchist of the deepest type.
