She received her education at Douglass High School, Warsaw, N. C., St. Augustine's College, Raleigh, N. C. and North Carolina Central University, Durham, N. C.

Her work of 39 years in Duplin County was done at E. E. Smith High School in Kenansville and East Duplin High School, Beulaville.

Early in life she affiliated with St. Stephens A. M. E. Zion Church where she served as organist, Leader of Class No. 4 and filled other positions. Her church life was one of action.

Mildred was a member of the NCAE, a life member of the NEA, and the ACT. She was financial secretary of Golden Jewel Chapter No. 71 Order of Eastern Star, Salem Lodge 147, and a former member of the board of directors of the Duplin County Teachers Federal Credit Union.

Her sudden passing has brought great sorrow to many.
