## ABOUT THE COLLECTION

**Administrative History:** The St. Philip's Parish chapter of the Daughters of the American Colonists (DAC) was established in Statesboro, Georgia in 1955. It was the sixth chartered chapter in Georgia and named after the geographic parish in which Statesboro was located when the royal parishes were named by the Church of England. The DAC holds programs promoting local and state history, tours of historic sites, while also making contributions and donations to local and state foundations and historical sites.

**Scope and Content:** This collection includes annual scrapbooks documenting the history of the activities of the Daughters of the American Colonists, St. Philip's Parish chapter from 1975-2017. Materials include chapter minutes, papers and photographs for chapter activities and events, fundraisers, memorial services, newspaper clippings, chapter yearbooks, and several copies of the organization's yearly journal, *The Colonial Courier*.

**System of Arrangement:** Each folder is arranged in the exact order the chapter historian created scrapbooks for the chapter. There are year ranges for the content of each folder. Photographs and newspaper clippings, if small enough, have been placed in plastic or paper sleeves.
