ABOUT THE COLLECTION

Biographical History: Charles Parrish Blitch was born April 28, 1925, the son of the late W.H. and Lottie Parrish Blitch, Jr. He was a 1942 graduate of Statesboro High School. In 1943 he joined the Army 5th Air Force, serving as a navigator in the South Pacific Theater until 1946.

After his discharge Blitch enrolled at Georgia Teachers College (now Georgia Southern University) where he earned the BS Ed. Degree in 1948. He taught in Atlanta at Fulton High School and College Park High School, as well as Statesboro High School. While teaching in Atlanta he attended Emory University part-time and received the MS Ed. Degree in 1954. After teaching at Georgia Teachers College he entered the graduate school at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and was awarded the Ph.D in economics in 1966. Dr. Blitch joined the faculty of Old Dominion University, Norfolk, Va., the same year. In the academic year 1974-75, he was appointed Visiting Professor of Economics at the University of Wales, Swansea. During his career Blitch published several articles in professional journals and a book (*The True Story of the Bulloch County Courthouse*). He retired from Old Dominion University in 1990 and returned to his childhood home on South Zetterower Avenue in Statesboro, Georgia. In 1995 he acquired and restored his grandfather's (W. H. Blitch, Sr.) plantation house ca. 1880, where he resided until his death.

Blitch was a member of the Southern Economics Association, the Virginia Association of Economists, the American Economic Association, the History of Economics Society and the First Presbyterian Church of Statesboro.

Scope and Content: This collection features materials assembled by Charles Parrish Blitch, which document personal and professional aspects of his family and life in Bulloch County. Materials span 1870-2004 and include newspaper clippings, photographs, booklets, correspondence, diplomas, and school annuals that highlight Blitch's interests in local history and genealogy.

System of Arrangement: Materials are arranged by subject by the creator. General subject areas include local and family histories, legal documents and records, student publications and programs, additional local and family histories, academic achievements and awards, and additional legal documents. Series are not organized exclusively by box, as some boxes contain a mixture of the aforementioned areas.
