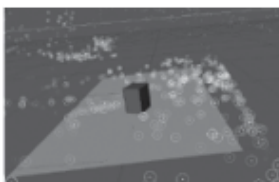
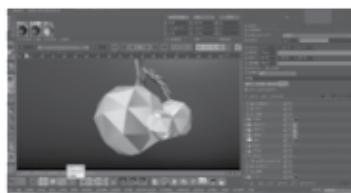

The B.A. Capstone Project represents genuine and sensitive discoveries made about a southern college town by its college student artists.

Through a partnership with the Downtown Statesboro Development Authority, students examined College Street, at the edge of the DSDA map. The students investigated this street with an asset-based community development model in mind and explored the neighborhood's green spaces, businesses, occupants, histories, politics, and architecture.

The Project has manifested itself through narrative animations, 3D architectural models, photography, ceramic sculpture, poetry, and graphic design. It is the first installment in a multi-year collection of socially engaged art projects that will investigate this neighborhood's diverse assets.
