ABOUT THE COLLECTION

Biographical History: Francis Harper was born November 17, 1886, in Southbridge, Massachusetts. He attended Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, earning a Bachelor of Arts in 1914 and a PhD of Philosophy in 1925. From 1917 to 1919, Harper served in the United States Army with the 79th division in France, and then again in New York and Maryland. In 1923, Harper married Jean Sherwood of Cornwall, New York. Jean previously served as a tutor to Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt's children, Anna and Elliot, and was active throughout her life in women's and environmental causes. Francis and Jean had four children: Mary Sherwood, born in 1926, Robert Francis, born in 1928, Lucy Lee, born in 1933, and David Bartram, born in 1937.

Francis Harper was a "naturalist" in the earlier sense of the word, taking all of nature as his province: plants, insects, fish, amphibians, birds, mammals, and people. He worked for various museums, government agencies, committees and commissions, and research agencies. Among these were the Boston Society of Natural History, the American Society of Mammalogists, the Academy of Natural Sciences in Philadelphia, and the Smithsonian Institution. He also participated in numerous scientific expeditions to Canada and the southeast United States. From these expeditions, he produced a series of studies and publications. Chief among these concerned the Okefenokee Swamp: the environment, its people, and their culture. Harper owned land in the Okefenokee and built personal and professional relationships with several families that lived there. He studied the locals' language and arts, making recordings for the Library of Congress. Francis and Jean Harper were also influential in having the Okefenokee declared a National Wildlife Refuge.

Francis Harper died on November 17, 1972. Although he remained active in his profession until the time of his death, he left several major projects unfinished, including a book about the people and lore of the Okefenokee Swamp. Dr. Delma "Del" Eugene Presley, who at the time was the Director of the Georgia Southern Museum, took up the task of finishing the book. Presley was in communication with Jean Harper during the writing process.

Okefinokee Album (sic), by Francis Harper and Delma E. Presley, was published posthumously by the University of Georgia Press in 1981.

Scope and Content: This collection consists of the professional and personal papers of Cornell-trained naturalist Dr. Francis Harper. Materials span 1904-1972 and include field notebooks, correspondence, photographs, and audiovisual materials documenting the plant and animal life as well as human ecology of the Okefenokee Swamp area of South Georgia. The photographs within Series 1 show the flora, fauna, and people of the Okefenokee swamp. The photographs were taken by the Harpers while on their trips to the swamp. Photographs are all in black and white and range in size. The Field Journals chronicle his travels in the okefenokee, Canada, and New England. Materials were used in the writing of *Okefinokee Album* (sic) by Francis Harper and Dr. Delma "Del" Eugene Presley, published posthumously in 1981.

System of Arrangement: The collection is composed of three series according to material type; Series 1: Audio Visual Materials, Series 2: Professional Papers and Journals, and Series 3: Oversized Materials. Materials within the series are arranged by material type and/or subject as follows:

Series 1: Audio Visual Materials includes photographs, film and glass plate negatives, video cassettes, and other media. Boxes 1 and 2 contain photographs arranged with item-level photograph descriptions provided by Francis Harper and include his original numbering system in parentheses where available. The subject categories of photographs are listed in bold and are alphabetical. Box 3 contains film negatives, the film negatives that have prints are in the same organizational order as their prints, the film negatives without prints are unorganized. Box 4 contains 16mm film and derivatives of audiovisual materials on Betamax, VHS, CDs, and zip disks. Box 5 contains glass slide negatives and carousel slides.

Series 2: Professional Papers and Journals includes note cards, field notebooks, and correspondence. Box 6 contains note cards on the local vernacular. Boxes 7 and 8 contain field notebooks and are arranged in chronological order. Box 9 contains personal and professional papers, along with correspondences, and are arranged by subject.

Series 3: Oversized Materials contains the oversized material in the collection. The oversized folder is stored in a map case in the Special Collections processing room.

Acquisitions Info: The collection was gifted by Jean Harper to Dr. Delma "Del" Eugene Presley, Georgia Southern Museum Director, and subsequently transferred to Henderson Library in 1999. Additional materials were donated by Presley, 2006.
