

The Performing Arts Center is excited to be partnering with Theatre & Performance to present Broadway favorite "Godspell" as part of their 2019-2020 Main Stage Series. The show opens Thursday, Feb. 27 at 7:30 p.m., and will run through March 1.

In the first major musical theatre offering from Grammy and Academy Award winner, Stephen Schwartz (Wicked, Pippin, Children of Eden), a small group of people help Jesus Christ tell parables from the Gospel of St. Matthew. An eclectic blend of songs, ranging in style from pop to vaudeville, is employed as Jesus' messages of kindness, tolerance, and love come vibrantly to life.
